



YOUR PORSCHE

A Familial 912

This 912 has a long history as a single owner car. My father passed away in 1966, 6 months after purchasing a T6 356 coupe. I was 11 and my sister 7. This 912 was purchased new in 1967 from Masterson Motors in Ventura, California when the T6 356 we were driving suffered a catastrophic failure. My mother went into the showroom and decided against a red on black 911 T because she did not like red. Instead, an Irish green 912 with light tan interior became part of the family. It was equipped with Fuchs 4 ½ inch alloy wheels, a wooden steering wheel, four speed transmission and lap belts. The Talbot mirror and a Blaupunkt Frankfurt radio were added later. The car was driven daily and is well traveled having accumulated 320,000 miles.



My mother joined the PCA in 1970. At the meeting she agreed to participate a time-trial event at the Riverside racetrack. Her mentor was Dale Hersh. In a field of 7 other cars (all 911s) she finished second... to last. But I thought she was pretty remarkable.

Later that year, my mother, sister and I piled into the 912 for a trip to Mexico and another trip to the grandparents. Those trips were mostly uneventful. However, there was a speeding ticket in Utah. The officer who stopped the car said the officer who clocked radioed ahead for another car to intercept us. We were clocked at 115 mph! The officer escorted us to the police office to pay the fine or risk being placed in jail. When asked why she was going so fast, my mother responded "well, I had a tail wind".

Most kids interested in cars seem to start by working on American iron. I was very lucky. The 912 was my training ground. My father fixed everything and







with his passing filling that void was my responsibility. Dale Hersh who drove the number 19 speedster in Southern California, was my phone-a-friend. Starting in junior high school, I did general tune-ups... changing spark plugs, oil, points, setting the ignition timing and

valves clearances. In 1973 the family was in Colorado the odometer rolled over 100,000 miles and the engine was making "bad" noises. I was tasked to repair it. The engine was disassembled revealing broken piston rings responsible for the nasty noises. Heads, rods, cam, crank and block were sent away for measuring and machining. Standard Mahle biral cylinders and pistons were purchased. I did an adequate job; it went another 100,000 miles. However, I'd say this is a credit to the engine designers more than anything I did.

The 912 was driven in rain and snow since my mother would drive no other car. I continued to do routine maintenance as she continued to rack up the miles. Trips to Pueblo, Aspen, Colorado Springs, Boulder, Cheyanne were common. When I was unavailable to do maintenance, the car was a guest Rennenhaus on Broadway in Denver run by the late Grady Clay.



During the mid 80's, there were trips to Oklahoma and Kentucky before we moved to Torrance, California in 1987. Before reaching Torrance my mother and the 912 made a trip to Mexico. The return trip was harrowing for Margot. She was stopped by the Federales, guns drawn. They thought she might be smuggling drugs. Inspection found nothing but a frightened middle-aged woman. She was released to continue her journey.



In Torrance we lived down the street from the late Dwayne Spencer. It was also time for another engine rebuild. New standard Mahle biral pistons/cylinders were installed, heads rebuilt, rods machined, and all bearings replaced. The Solex carburetors were misbehaving as they tend to do after so many miles. A pair of brand-new split-shaft Solexes to complete the engine.

It is now 1994. Margot and the 912 are in Pennsylvania. The car continued to be driven by to collect gasoline for the mower, groceries, more plants and even pieces of furniture that would fit. I continued to maintain the car, but rarely drove it. The car continued to run well with the usual maintenance. Now in her late 60s Margot would share how this person or that would stop her and want to purchase the car. "How much do you want for it?" they would ask. "It is not for sale!" she would firmly reply. Occasionally, as she was driving a car would choose her as if wanting to race and she would brag about how she "shut them down". Funny about how I never heard about the losses.

In her late 70s Margot was driving in the sleepy town of Nazareth when a local constable wanted to talk with her. He was driving a Dodge Durango. Margot was used to "cop cars" and thought the car following her

had nefarious intent. At about 70 years old she did her best to get home. I got a call from a concerned constable who needed to be assured that my mother was not trying to out-run the law.

High milage started to take its toll. The generator died. An oil puddle due to a broken tang on the oil cooler was repaired. Front brake calipers started to bind. Rusty longitudinals and driver's floor pan replaced. Thus began the long relationship with Mark Burkit at Specialty Cars in Allentown, PA. Work prevented me from taking on many tasks that needed to be done for a car driven daily. Specialty Cars was able to keep my mother in the driver's seat. She drove the car up until 16 months before she died at age 89.

I thought a mechanical restoration would be fitting. I placed the car in the hands of Mark Burkit at Specialty Cars; a person having the time, tools and talent to give the engine and drivetrain the attention it needed. The engine was completely measured and blue printed. The original Solex carburetors and the distributor rebuilt. The transmission was evaluated and worn parts replaced. CV joints were greased, rear sway bars replaced, gas tank replaced with an original tank. The master cylinder replaced, all four calipers rebuilt by PMO, Bilstein shocks on all four corners and turbo tie-rod ends installed. The original Fuchs wheels were removed and stored in favor of 15x6 Fuchs wheels. The front seats, dash and the driver's arm rest were re-covered to make the car more comfortable to drive. Mechanically the car is new. I am driving the car as often as possible and aspire to try my hand at autocross with it. I love the light handling, engine sounds, and watching the classic analog gauges. If it were possible, I am sure Margot would drive the little Irish green 912 another 300,000 miles.

There's an APP for that by Robert Rainer

So in the midst of the pandemic, I discovered this app by Porsche called Roads. Originally released in 2019. it has gone through several iterations. The app uses Artificial Intelligence to generate routes, and it allows users to share navigation of routes they have driven. It also lets you plan a route based on your current location or if you like, between multiple destinations. The app suffered from a poor interface for many years, and it had a huge lull in development. Recently it managed a bit of a comeback and this article will show you how to use it. The app does cover the world, so it's a good companion when you are traveling. Since it is on your phone, you don't need your Porsche to

use it.



First question is what platform does the app work on. I know it works on the IPhone, It was originally released only on the IPhone, but after some research a release for android phones is available on the Google Play store. However, the really big question is what's in it for me, and in a nut shell, this app will help you find some great

drives in your area. It will allow you to generate some drives, and if you like it, you can share with others. We have some great drives in our area, and luckily, there are a good many drive and dines, road trips and other outings that the Carolinas Region of PCA put on for us to enjoy. My hope is that people in the club will use this app as a means of sharing.

If you love to drive the back roads like I do, this app is for you. First off you will need to log in. There are several ways to do this, the usually suspects like Facebook, Google and Apple, but I chose to create a Porsche ID. So far in the past 5 years or so, no emails from Porsche. Once logged in, you can choose your profile of preferred driving conditions. You can choose: ups and downs, fun with curves, got an




roads you may not have

known about

If you scroll down, you will see More routes to discover. These are rated routs by the community as a whole. It will give you a percentage of people who liked the drive, and the approximate time



and average speed to complete the route. Clicking on one of the routes, will open up a page that gives a description by the submitting author, A details section that shows a map, some route properties, and comments from folks in the community. You can click drive this route now, and a navigation app. It will give you turn by turn from where you are currently, total time to drive the route, and the estimated time of your arrival. There are also icons for scenic stops and colors indicating traffic conditions.



Perhaps the coolest thing about this app, and why I chose to highlight it is the Preflight feature. Clicking on this will open up one of the better 3D mapping packages I have seen, and it will allow you to get a preview of the road you will driving. The elevation changes and ability to zoom into the drive are done well.



You will get a relative view of the mountains and valleys you will be going through. I like this, because I know in our area, elevation changes are a thing of beauty and fun while driving a Porsche, so I look out for them

The app is free, it is supported and released by Porsche. They use algorithms to generate the best route between two waypoints or destinations based on the actual characteristics and environments of the roads. The algorithm is fine-tuned by the ROADS community and professional drivers for Porsche. The app was created by Marco Brinkmann from Porsche AG and his goal is to build the world's best catalogue of epic routs out there.


One thing you can do is plan a tour. I have a drive I call the figure 8 that runs up the mountain, does a small portion of the Blue Ridge parkway, runs down the backside of the mountain and then goes back and does it again, but on different roads. I tried to generate this in the App. It was relatively easy, but I did need to use a mapping program to find the right towns to traverse by setting these as destinations in the Roads App and placing them in the right order. Setting the beginning and end as the starting and end point was a bit cumbersome, but with some patience, I was able to do it. You can move stops around, and fine tune things. Once you hit the generate route button, you will see the app do its thing, Bottom line is it worked, it gave me what I wanted.


The app also generated some text that described the route and what I was going to see. I was able to hit the download button and save the route to my routes. You can also publish your route as I have done. I called this route Figure 8 along the blue ridge. I have not quite discovered how to search in the app yet. So yea there is more work to do.

Is this App perfect? NO! It is somewhat cumbersome, but it does have some nice features, and if you are visiting a new area and it looks like there are some good drives, then check this App out. If you want an afternoon or morning dive or as Roads says "Got a spare hour?" Check out the App. I did create a discussion group called Carolinas-PCA and linked a few Western NC Routes, pop in if you sign up for the app and say hello. Lets get some cool drives on this App.

Our next meeting will be on September 10th at The Waterman restaurant, at 6 pm. See you then!




