The Executive Council approved Kim Moses to replace Barry Brown as "Membership Chair". Kim has been in PCA since 2019 and is the wife of Dale Moses, our Race Chair. Kim has a lot experience working in various positions in a multitude of organizations and is anxious to begin working with all levels of our region leadership. Please welcome Kim to this new position.

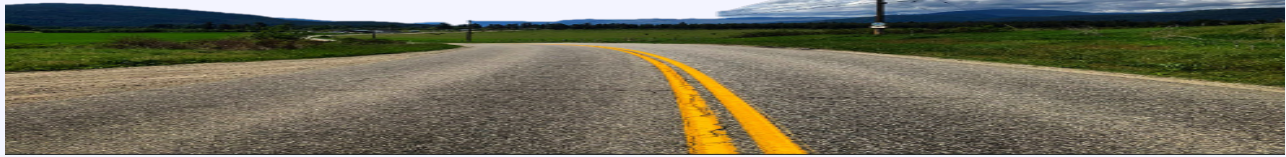

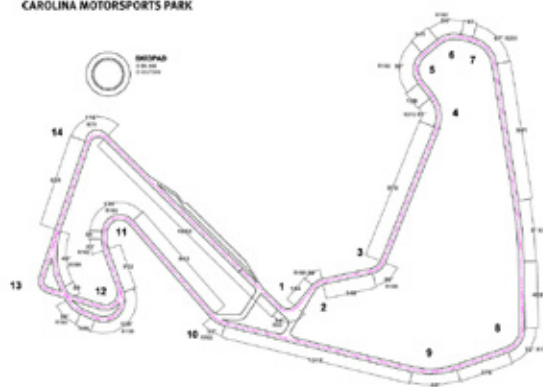

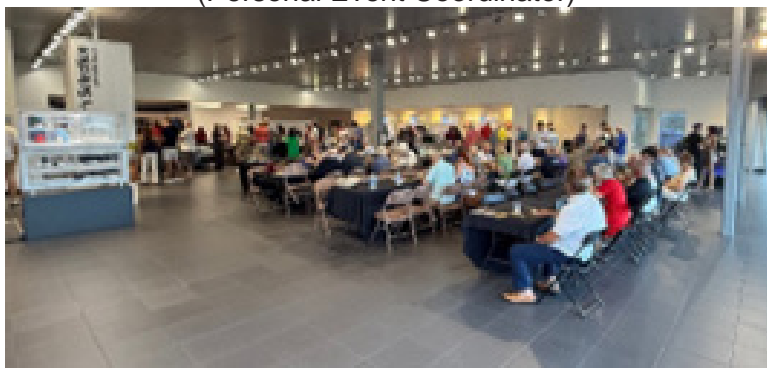

Judy Boles, First Woman PCA National President and Life Member Carolinas Region Sandhills Area

On a beautiful spring Saturday morning in March, Sandhills and Triangle Area members gathered at Little River resort near Pinehurst for a car show and lunch to honor Judy Boles. Jim Proper, Triangle Area director initiated the event, and Jerry and Sadie Kilcrease from Triad Area joined about thirty of us for lunch where Judy spoke to the group. She is the only Carolinas Region Life PCA member, and she was the first woman national president of PCA from 1995-1998! Quite an accomplishment at that time when PCA was largely a "Porsche guys" organizationfrom a leadership standpoint.

Of course, Judy's path to the top of PCA started many years earlier. Judy and John began that journey together in Carolinas Region in 1972. They have over 50 years of membership, owned 50 Porsches (yes fifty) and have been members of five PCA regions. John and Judy resurrected Hudson-Champlain Region, chartered Everglades, Puerto Rico, Hurricane, and were founding members of Alpine Mountain Region. They have been back in Carolinas Region for six years. Barrett's and Boles' were also 356 Registry members for many years.

For those with at least a few years of PCA membership, you may remember two other ladies very instrumental in PCA history who served before and after Judy's tenure. Ruth Hart was long time national membership chair, and Betty Jo Turner was editor of our treasured PCA Panorama for many years. So, for a time back in the mid-1990s, PCA was managed and led by three incredible women dedicated to PCA's success.

Barrett's first Porsche Parade was in 1988 at Traverse City, Michigan. Of course, Judy and John were there. And, we were both showing our cars in the Parade concours event. BJ and I were novice first time concours participants having joined PCA in 1985. Judy and John had refined those skills, and Judy was Hudson- Champlain region president. Also in those days, John, Judy and I were driving in region DE events in our '85 Carreras. The three of us eventually became DE instructors.

The next time we crossed paths was in 1990 at Porsche Parade in Monterey, California. The concours was on the Old Del Monte golf course...an incredible spectacle! At the concours awards banquet, Judy, as a national PCA officer, sat on the stage with all the men. The Barrett's sat at a table in the back of the room....and had a great time with new Porsche friends! We have attended six Parades, Boles' attended twenty-one Parades!

A little more "Judy" nostalgia from Jim Proper as he was talking with her at our recent Little River resort event....Jim learned that Judy was a member of the first graduating class from Niskayuna High School, Schenectady, N.Y. in 1950's where Jim's wife taught for 21 years, and where their two children graduated in 1990's....small world!

Among Judy's many accomplishments as PCA president, and one very special to Porsche track junkies....Judy and Allan Friedman developed and championed the national Porsche Club Racing program. Alan was PCA Safety Chair on Judy's staff. At the time, it took great initiative and very strong leadership to overcome the many obstacles to introduce wheel-to-wheel racing to PCA as the progression from DE participation. And, of course the tremendous success of PCA Club Racing needs no elaboration. Alan was the first PCA Club Racing chairman. He did the initial technical inspection on my '85 Carrera at Road America in 1994 where I got my Club Racing license.

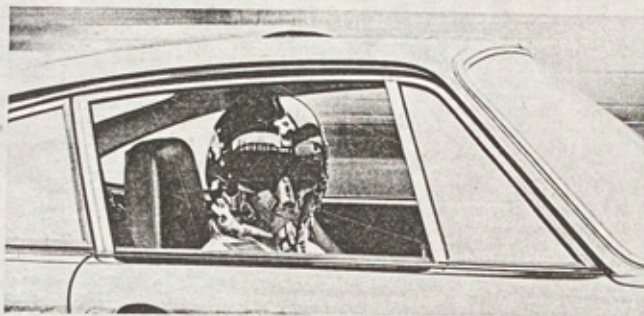
Another highlight in Judy's tenure as president came in 1996 when she and John were invited to Stuttgart with PCA presidents from around the world, and then attended the Le Mans 24 Hour race as guests of Peter Porsche. Judy was the only woman PCA president in the world. That year Porsches finished 1-2-3 at La Sarthe. Remember the Porsche GT1?

Today we are all retired and living the dream in Pinehurst with a great group of friends, an active PCA communityAND multiple Porsches to enjoy!

And in part, we owe some of this to Judy and all the other countless volunteers who have helped make the Porsche Brand and Experience what it is today. We admit to being slightly biased, but Judy is among the best!

Moving Cross Country in a Porsche

Having moved twelve times, ten of which involved a Porsche, I feel that I can speak with some expertise on this subject. Our moves were never without mystery. We knew our destination but living quarters were always in the TBA (to be announced) category. That meant that I had to be prepared to live "out of the car" for at least a month. There are two more facts which need to be listed at the outset. We always had one cat and one airplane helmet equipped with an oxygen mask. My spouse was a fighter pilot. His helmet was in the same category of prized possessions as the Porsche.

The packing was critical. We must have the following equipment — 1 tool box, 1 set of new plugs, 1 cam chain tensioner, 1 CD unit, 1 fire extinguisher, and 1 set of valve cover gaskets. We also had to have 2 flight suits, 1 flight jacket, 1 "G" suit, 1 pair of flying gloves, 1 pair of flying boots, and *The Helmet*. At this point he would announce that the car was just about maxed out and that I had better be planning to travel light.

Hm-m-m, I had to have a few clothes — maybe one change of underwear — one need not be extravagant — linens, something to cook in for a month, silverware, etc., and of course the cat with her necessary box. After several days of culling, I was able to pack one suitcase for my spouse and me, all meal equipment in an electric frypan (my girl scout mess kit was a bit too small), and the linens with the spare parts sandwiched in between.

After several discussions on the correct placement of each item for the proper weight balance, the car would finally be ready. I would crawl into the passenger seat which was pushed up as far as it would go — even my knees were jammed into the dash! *The Helmet* was placed on the floor in front of my seat. I straddled it. The maps of 23 states sat in my lap along with a pad of paper for such computations as gas mileage, speedometer calibrations, and as many time-rate-distance problems as were possible.

On the door sill between my seat and the door was a jar of peanut butter and jelly, a loaf of bread, and some fruit. We were always trying not only for the land speed record but also an endurance record. Rally techniques such as map reading in milliseconds were added to keep the drive exciting. Along with all of this, sandwiches had to be made, every "on" ramp had to be checked (this was the pre-CB era), and sometimes the cat needed a little attention.

There are many memorable incidents of which you should know a few—perhaps? With more careful or clever planning you can hopefully avoid some of the disasters.

1. It is not wise to travel at 130 mph while the cat is using the box.
2. When one travels light, it is not propitious to have a flat tire in a blizzard. He was changing a tire on the shoulder of the road in seven inches of snow. I was flagging traffic. We had no coats, no gloves, and were wearing summer clothes. Our

destination was Arizona. Who needed such things as coats?

3. Do not move a plant in the summer unless you have air conditioning. Opening the windows at 120 mph tends to defoliate.
4. Traveling with a tuned exhaust system is hazardous to your health. Try to convince him to put the original exhaust on the car and ship the tuned exhaust system; otherwise, ringing in the ears and loss of balance may last for up to an hour after arrival.
5. Try not to travel with a helmet or large item on the floor in front of your seat. You tend to walk as though you've been riding a horse your entire life.

Since I could never dispose of *The Helmet*, it became necessary to devise some kind of relief from the fixed riding position to which I was always relegated. An idea came to me in Nebraska one afternoon as we were attempting to break the land speed record. I took *The Helmet* out of the bag, put it on, snapped the oxygen mask over my mouth (my spouse liked that part), and pulled down the sun visor. As we flew past the other cars on the highway, we began to notice bulging eyeballs, mouths gaping, and cars drifting off the road as their drivers looked aghast. After

serious thought, I removed *The Helmet* for fear that we might cause an accident.

I hope that I have given you some helpful hints on moving in your Porsche. It can be done. Luggage racks are not allowed (aerodynamically very inefficient), and all windows must be clear. That means that the dash and rear window deck are not considered as places where possessions can be stored.

REMEMBER! You can live in your Porsche, but you can't drive your house! ☺

After a very relaxed picnic and lots of Porsche talk, they took the "scenic route" back home. All the enthusiastic drivers put their skills to work. This was a great family outing, which the children enjoyed as much as the adults.

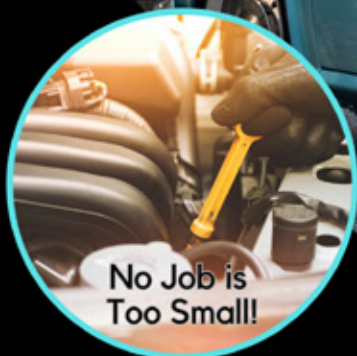

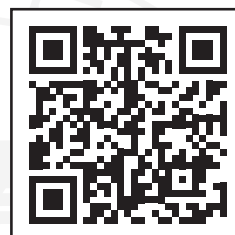
