-Identify the evidence for the utility and efficacy of medications in the treatment of substance and behavioral addictions.

-Cite the clinical implications of current trends in societal perspectives on substance use.

-Discuss the underpinnings of a faith-based recovery process.

-Identify evidence-based strategies to facilitate lifelong abstinence and sobriety.

-Educate faith-based institutes on addiction recovery.

-Describe the discrepancies that often divide clinicians providing Addiction Medicine and those in faith-based ministries working in Addiction Ministries.

-Cite academic literature for evidence-based strategies to forge partnerships to synergize medical and community efforts to address the polydrug overdose epidemic.

-Cite thriving faith-based ministries and medical learning collaboratives around the nation with a panel who can share their experiences, lessons and best practices.
