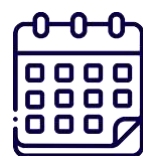


The Digital Youth: Building Bridges Between Youth and Esports (BRIDGE)

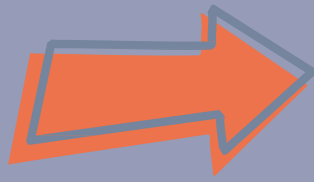

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

BRIDGE – Building Bridges Between Youth and Esports is a 9-month Erasmus+ Youth Exchange (KA152-YOU) coordinated by Integration För Alla (Sweden) with partners from **Türkiye, Denmark, Romania, and Spain**. The project promotes inclusive, safe, and responsible digital communities by using esports as a tool for non-formal learning. Participants will develop skills in digital citizenship, critical thinking, teamwork, leadership, and intercultural communication. The Youth Exchange will take place in Örkelljunga, Sweden, from **29 August to 5 September 2026**, bringing together **34 participants** from five countries. With partners from Türkiye, Sweden, Denmark, Romania, and Spain the activity will be implemented with a budget of **€31,466**. Through workshops, simulations, intercultural activities, and reflection sessions, participants will co-create an Inclusive Esports Activity Blueprint and prepare Local Inclusive LAN Events to implement in their home communities after the Project.

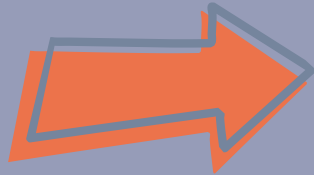

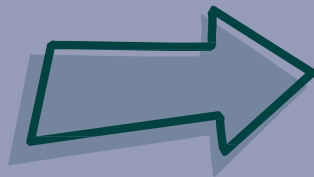

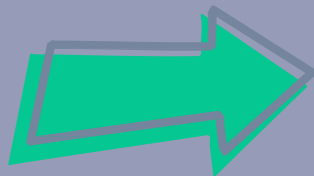

PARTICIPANTS' ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Participants (18–25 years old) are expected to actively contribute to all phases of the Youth Exchange. Before the project, they should attend the online preparation meeting, complete the required travel documents, and become familiar with the project objectives. During the exchange, participants will take part in workshops, group activities, intercultural sessions, esports-based learning, and daily reflections. They are expected to respect diversity, support teamwork, and help create a safe, inclusive, and positive learning environment. The facilitation team will guide the learning process throughout the project. Leyla Meletli (Main Facilitator) will coordinate the programme and facilitate the learning activities, İlayda Elmas (Assistant Facilitator) will support workshops and participant engagement, and Mehmet Meletli will manage logistics and practical arrangements. After the project, participants are encouraged to share their learning in their local communities and will receive a Youthpass Certificate recognising the competences they developed during the exchange.

EXPECTATIONS FROM PARTNERS

- All partners will send a sufficient number of participants to the training.
- Gender balance should be ensured among the participants.
- The list of participants should be completed immediately after the participants are finalised.
- Each partner country should organise energising activities on one day of the programme.
- Each partner should prepare the workshop, provide the materials or inform the host party in advance.
- Partners will organise a cultural evening. They should bring food and cultural items from their countries.

Each country has a different transport budget.

Partners should buy/reimburse tickets for the participants accordingly.

Accommodation and meals for YE will be paid by the host organisation.

The participants' flight tickets will be paid by the sending partners.

ABOUT ÖRKELLJUNGA



In Örkelljunga, you find the charm of a small and beautiful lake, classic Swedish village, side-side with attractions such as services, shopping, restaurants, and a lovely atmosphere.

ACCOMMODATION IN ÖRKELLJUNGA

The YE will take place in Örkelljunga, Sweden. It will take place in Strandhem, Smålandsvägen 48, 286 35 Örkelljunga.

Strandhem has facilities, such as sports hall, sauna, large lake, bbq place, canoeing.

Every room has a shower, toilet and up to 4 single beds. 2 beds on the "floor" and 2 are bunk bed style.

Rooms will be allocated to groups based on availability (twin or triple rooms) and also gender.

In September, Sweden can be chilly and rainy, so make sure you bring rain jackets and warm clothes. You should bring your own towel and shampoos/soaps.

ARRIVING ÖRKELLJUNGA

From Copenhagen airport.

To buy tickets to Örke ljunnga you wi ll need to use a Skånetrafiken ticket machine. You should buy the ticket to Örke ljunnga Bsstn (It is the stop you wi ll get off)

The journey should take you 1 hour and 30 minutes. There is a train every 30 minutes, to check train times use the link below:

TRANSPORTATION COST

For the train and bus from Copenhagen airport

To Örke ljunnga bus-station 198 kr - 218 kr depending on the time. (peak time are slightly more expensive)

The **ticket includes both train and bus.**
The ticket/price includes both.

From Örke ljunnga bus station, **the area is VERY rural.** From the bus station He ll Youth wi ll co llect you in cars and drive you to the accommodation.



Make sure you arrive to Copenhagen not later than 15.00 to be able to arrive to Örke ljunnga (There are limited busses)
