reclaim British soil IT WAS 30 years ago that Britain fought a war in the South Atlantic. Thousands of miles from our shores Argentinean soldiers invaded the British-owned Falkland Islands and Britain's prime minister at the time, Margaret Thatcher, dispatched a task force to win them back. Among the paratroopers fighting to reclaim Goose Green was Steve Tuffen...

STEVE Tuffen is tough by name and 30 years ago was tough by nature as he fought to win back Britain's Falkland Islands from the Argentineans. The paratrooper from Arden Road,

Herne Bay, was almost left for dead after being shot in the head while he was serving with 2 Para. He said: "I have a vague recollection of the battle kicking off but the bullet left a hole in my skull the size of a

clenched fist. "It was four hours before medical teams could get to me. "When they took off my helmet they

said my brain dropped down the back of my neck."

One of the medics wanted to give him an overdose of morphine, believing he had no hope of survival. But the rest decided to give him a chance.

He was flown to Ajax Bay where surgeons fought to save him. But with no neurosurgeon he was then airlifted to the hospital ship Uganda where he could be X-rayed and patched up.

Memories

Although he can't recall being shot, Steve's memories of the battle before that are very clear. He said: "We sailed south on board

the former North Sea ferry Norland. I remember having to jump onto a landing craft at Falkland Sound wearing 150lb of kit and hanging onto my machine gun. The vessels were pitch-ing alarmingly in a 15ft swell.

"When we jumped off the landing craft at Blue Beach in San Carlos Water the water came up to our necks and was bitterly cold. We had been told we wouldn't even get our feet wet!"

He added: "I have never forgotten that night when we had to take up defensive positions on the shore in freezing temperatures without any opportunity to dry off first.

"I had to jam the butt of my gun under my chin to stop my teeth from chattering.

Para moved out, Argentine aircraft swooped low across the hills on their way to bomb British war-

They were then sent to win back Burnt Side House. He said: "The attack was so aggressive that afterwards you couldn't put your hand on the building without touching a bullet hole.

were being thrown and an anti-tank weapon was used."

Shortly after daylight the next day 2 Para began the attack on Darwin Ridge and that was when Steve was shot

From the Uganda he was taken by helicopter to the ambulance ship Hydra which carried casualties to Montevideo in Uraguay. From there they were airlifted home by the RAF. It was aboard the Hydra he first

started to regain consciousness. He said: "I can't speak too highly of the men aboard that ship. There was nothing they wouldn't do for you."

Back in the UK surgeons removed metal fragments from his brain. When he came round, he could see rain drops on the ward's window pane

By this stage Steve was virtually

blind, seeing the world through a blur.

with perfect clarity.

After briefly returning to 2 Para he was forced to leave the regiment because of his injuries.

Today he is registered blind because he has no peripheral vision. But he has a job he enjoys and lives with his wife Lorraine. The couple have two grown up children.

He said: "It is more than I could have hoped for 30 years ago when I lay for four hours on a bleak hillside 8,000 miles from home."
