# INDONESIAN IMMERSION

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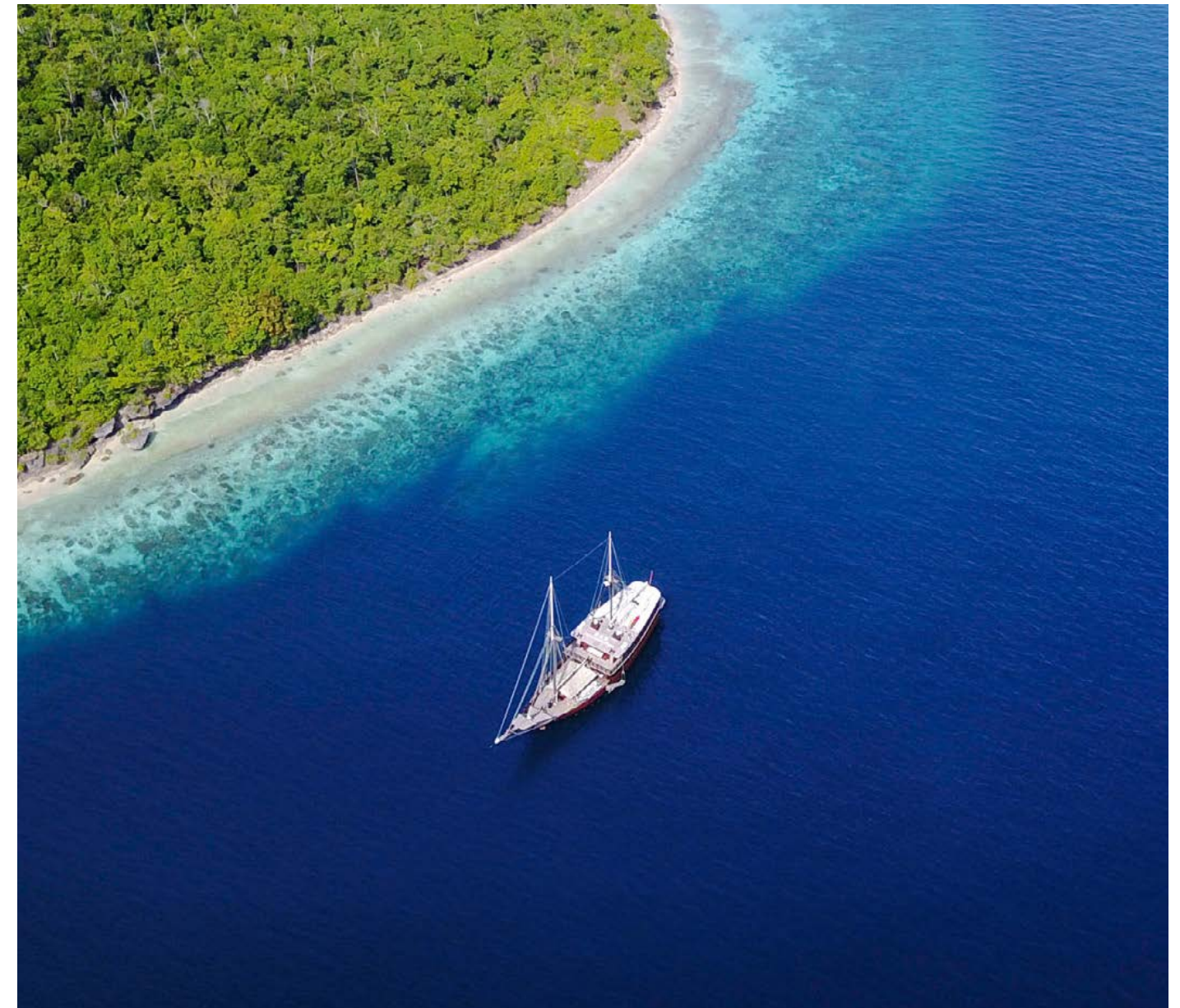

# SPICE ISLANDS

These islands were once the only place nutmeg was found. Nutmeg was highly valued for its perceived medicinal value rather than for culinary purposes. This led to Banda Run, an island that makes up part of the Spice Islands which is only about three kilometres long and one kilometre wide, being traded by the Dutch to the English. On 31 July 1667 the Dutch and the English signed the Treaty of Breda. As part of the agreement, the swampy island of Manhattan in New Amsterdam – which the Dutch had “bought” from the Native Americans – was exchanged for the island of Run.



Now, the Spice Islands are the top producers of nutmeg, mace, clove and pepper in the world and, with more than 1,000 islands in the area, it is most definitely best explored by boat. The dive opportunities here are just as

intoxicating as the scent of the nutmeg growing on land. A voyage around the Spice Islands is an immersive feast for all the senses.

**WHEN TO GO: NOVEMBER TO APRIL**



The land of the dragons. The archipelago of the Komodo National Park, which is largely uninhabited save for Komodo island itself, is impressive and enchanting. The mesmerising landscapes with dramatic topography take your breath away. With incredible dive and snorkel sites, expect to see turtles, manta ray, stingray and a huge selection of beautiful tropical fish.

# KOMODO

Hike up to a stunning viewpoint on the island of Padar and watch the sun set over three beaches, each with a different coloured sand: white, pink and black. Walk among the native Komodo dragons and observe the magnificent creatures in their natural habitat. Dive in the spot known as 'Turtle City' and count how many of these graceful creatures you spot.
