

TACK, ATTIRE, & EQUIPMENT

Hunter/Jumper

Traditional attire and equipment is required during competition. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules for tack and equipment during competition rounds. The intention of this is to prepare competitors for rated level horse show practices and rules.

Dressage

Traditional attire is suggested but not required.

LOST & FOUND

The lost and found is located at the show office during the show. After the show, any lost and found items will be delivered to the main Horse Park at Woodside office, which is located at the entrance to the facility.



WARM UP DAY

"Ticketed rounds" will be offered from 11 AM to 5 PM on Fridays at each show in the Hunter and Jumper rings. Warm Up Day is intended for introduction to the competition space before the show. It is not intended for extensive schooling or lessons in the show rings. The warm up schedule will be posted on the show website.

When participating in Warm Up Day, you must adhere to the following rules:


- All riders must be checked in and wearing a number. Trainer numbers can assigned at the show office.
- Rounds are permitted on a first-come, first-served basis for each height section.
- Each round has a time limit of 3 minutes. Riders exceeding the 3-minute limit will incur an additional schooling round fee.
- Rounds can be used for jumping the posted course, hacking, or jumping portions of the posted course.
- Arenas are not open for hacking before or after the posted warm up schedule.
- Only one trainer is permitted per 3-minute window.
- No changing of jump heights or direction is allowed.
- Absolutely no schooling is permitted 30 minutes after sunset each day. Any end-of-day over fences schooling or schooling outside of arena hours must be confirmed with management through back gate staff.



USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM

We are pleased to offer <u>USHJA Outreach classes</u> to support entry into the USEF and USHJA showing environment. Outreach classes provide the opportunity to earn national recognition in classes from (Intro) walk/trot to 3'0" in Hunter and Equitation sections and .60m to 1.20m in Jumper sections at rated and local shows. Any rider may compete in Outreach Hunter, Jumper, and Equitation classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition must be a USHJA Outreach member or any other USHJA member category.

USHJA membership is not required to compete in any Sand Hill Equestrian Events classes or show.





THOROUGHBRED INCENTIVE PROGRAM



Classes and divisions are offered for the Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP), which also earn you points toward the year-end Thoroughbred Sporthorse Challenge! For more information or help getting a TIP number, contact suzy@norcal-thoroughbred-events.com.

TIP awards will be given at each show by the TIP program. Thoroughbred only classes are run concurrently and given separate placings. More information on these classes is provided under specifications.



Sand Hill Equestrian Events Rules and Policies

SCHOOLING

Schooling is permitted on warm up day following the ticketed round schedule and rules. Non-judged classes are available during the show at each height section on Saturday and Sunday. Riders can choose (at the back gate) to ride any class as a "non-judged" round to provide additional schooling opportunities during the show. Schooling, jumping, hacking, or teaching lessons in the Warm Up rings is allowed from sunrise to sunset during the show.

Schooling or hacking in the show arenas outside of posted warm up or showing hours, or before or after the conclusion of the show each day, is not guaranteed and must be approved by management in advance.

SCRATCHES AND CANCELLATIONS

Refund & Show Scratch Policy

A "show scratch" applies to any horse entered into the show that withdraws from the competition.

- Show scratches must be delivered to show management via email at entries.woodsideschoolingshows@gmail.com.
- Show scratches received before the entry closing date will receive a full refund.
- Show scratches received after the entry closing date will be charged an office processing fee of \$35. Horse or tack stall reservations that are canceled after the closing date will be charged \$50 per stall.
- Show scratches received after the start of the show will be charged all applicable show entry and stabling/haulin fees, in addition to any fees for schooling rounds or classes that the horse participated in.

Hunter/Jumper Class Add/Scratch Policy

- Same day class adds will be allowed based on the show schedule and are subject to management discretion.
- The add/scratch form must be processed in the show office before the start of the class.
- The add/scratch slip must be brought to the back gate after the form is processed at the office.

Dressage Test Add/Scratch Policy

- Requested adds after the closing date will be subject to management approval.
- Competitors might be required to do their test(s) at the end of already scheduled dressage times.
- There is a \$45 fee for dressage test scratches after the start of the show.

PAYMENT

Payment is due in full prior to the close of the show. Competitors must leave a method of payment on file at the show office when checking in. Payment is accepted in the form of a check or credit card.

- Competitors are required to close out at the show office before leaving the show. Management reserves the
 right to charge any remaining balance on file at the end of the show. We recommend that competitors review
 their bill and close out at the horse show office when finished.
- Competitors who do not close out their balance or review their bill in person at the show office forfeit the right to adjust any show charges. Final balances will be charged to the payment method on file.
- Prior outstanding balances must be paid before picking up show numbers.
- Any checks returned by the bank will be charged a \$35 penalty in addition to the returned check charges made by the bank.

STABLING

The Horse Park at Woodside offers 12 by 12 box stalls.

- Stall reservations should be submitted by only one member of a group and include a full stall count and hay and shavings order.
- Stall reservations are due by the closing date of each show.
- Hay and shavings orders needed during the show can be submitted only in the show office.

THE HORSE PARK AT WOODSIDE STALL USE

The Horse Park at Woodside is implementing the following as a Stall Use Policy effective April 1st, 2019. Going forward, stalls will be inventoried before and after each rental to ensure that stalls are returned in the same condition as they were received. Any damages to rental stalls will be the financial responsibility of the owner, exhibitor, and/or trainer. Please review the following guidelines and contact the main office with any questions or concerns:

- 1.Do not damage stalls. No staples, nails, bolts, screws, liquid nail, rubber cement, duct tape, paint, or other products to be used on or in the stalls.
- 2. Decorations must be attached using temporary set-ups (wire or plastic ties) and removed prior to check out.
- 3. Name cards must be removed prior to check-out and leave no residue on stall surfaces.
- 4. Do not remove any part of the stalls.
- 5. Manure only in dumpsters.
- 6. No vehicles in the aisles between stall rows.

EQUINE HEALTH

All competitors must have proof of vaccination for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within six months for each horse attending the show. Certification/proof of vaccinations can be requested at any time by competition management. All horses entering the facility must have maintained a 3-day, twice daily temperature log prior to arriving that is available for review by competition management if requested. All horses at the facility must have their temperature monitored twice daily during their stay at the Horse Park at Woodside. Show management will be monitoring the temperature logs and reserves the right to cancel any entries who do not comply with this health and safety policy.

Call a veterinarian and alert show management immediately if a horse's temperature reads 101.5 Fahrenheit/38.6 Celsius.

CROSS COUNTRY SCHOOLING

Cross Country schooling at The Horse Park at Woodside is run separate from the Woodside Show Series. Cross country schooling must be registered and paid through the main Horse Park at Woodside office.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations will be enforced for the duration of the show and apply to all competitors, riders and visitors on the property.

Entries All riders must complete and return an entry. Entries will be accepted until the closing date. An additional administrative late fees of \$35 per entry will be applied for entries received after the show closing date.

ASTM rated hard hats must be worn by all riders when mounted.

Waivers must be signed by all riders prior to undertaking any riding. This includes riding in the warm up arenas. For riders under 18, the Waiver must be signed by a parent, guardian or trainer.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being ridden, exercised or walked.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times and are not permitted in the arenas or on courses.

Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, cancel entries, awards or prizes and/or adjust the time schedule, combine, scratch or move classes as necessary without claims or damage. All judge's decisions are final.

Stall Use is by reservation only and availability is subject to change. By renting a stall at The Horse Park, you agree to abide by the **stall use policies**.

Early Move-In before Friday must be approved by show management.

Haul In Fee Haul in fees are applicable to anyone not stabling and hauling a horse onto the property for the show. Haul in fee is waived only for annual full use members of HPW.

HPW Facility Fee All Competitors will be charged a \$35 HPW facility fee, regardless of HPW membership or boarding status.

Office Fee All Competitors will be charged a \$38 Office Fee, regardless of HPW membership or boarding status. This fee goes directly to supporting the quality of our shows.

CDFA Fee All Competitors will be charged a \$14 CDFA Fee. CDFA is the California Department of Food & Agriculture. The schooling show is required to collect a CDFA fee of \$14 per entry. All CDFA fees are remitted to the CDFA and fund their Equine Medication Monitoring Program (EMMP). More information at CDFA website.

Non-Competing horses that are stabled or hauled in for the show will be required to pay for applicable entry fees: haul in or stabling fee, office fee, CDFA fee, HPW facility fee.

Schooling No juniors or amateurs are allowed to school over fences without having a person in charge on the ground. Please refer to our schooling policy above for more information.

Arenas Competitors are restricted to show arenas and warm up arenas. Competitors who are not also members of The Horse Park are not permitted to use "member only" arenas. Members who are not competing are restricted to "members only" arenas and may not use show designated arenas.

Lunging is permitted in designated lunging areas only. Do not lunge in warm up or show arenas.

Photo and Video Consent By competing or attending competitions or events with Sand Hill Equestrian Events, exhibitors and spectators grant permission to the unrestricted rights to use photographs and/or video footage from the schooling show for the purpose of promotion in various mediums.

Photography No unauthorized photography is allowed during the Woodside Show Series. Any unauthorized photographers will be asked to leave the property.

No trainers allowed on foot in the show ring during competition. Trainers are allowed in the ring on warm-up days. **Management** reserves the right to not allow same day adds based on schedule availability.

Management and Judges reserve the right to dismiss riders displaying extreme aggression or force, or riders who seem unsafe.

Divisions, Definitions, & Specifications

DRESSAGE

USDF and USEA tests will be offered at the April, September, and October shows:

- USDF Introductory, Training, First, and Second Level
- USEA Starter, Beginner Novice, Novice, Training, Modified, and Preliminary

Ride times will be posted on <u>RingRadar.com</u> in PDF format. The live RingRadar schedule will not accurately reflect ride times. For accurate ride times, see the PDF schedule.



JUMPER DIVISIONS

The following enterable sections are open to all riders and will be offered at all shows. Year end division champion and reserve champion will be awarded after the Fall Finale show based on cumulative points earned throughout the year.

.60m to .80m classes will run USEF Jumper Table Table IV.1 (Optimum time) and Table 2.C (Power & Speed) .90m to 1.30m classes will run USEF Jumper Table 2.C (Power & Speed) and Table 2.1 (Speed)

All Jumper classes will count towards the USHJA Outreach Program except those noted with an asterisk.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

The following enterable sections will be offered at all shows. Division champion and reserve awarded at each show. Year end division champion and reserve champion will be awarded after the Fall Finale show based on cumulative points earned throughout the year.

All Hunter classes will count toward the USHJA Outreach Program. The Sand Hill Equestrian Events Hunter Derby (2′, 2′3″, 2′6″, 2′9″) is USHJA Outreach eligible.

Short/Long Stirrup division may be split by child/adult if entries permit.

EQUITATION CLASSES

All equitation and medal classes are open to junior and adult amateur riders only. Classes will not be included in hunter division placings for 2' and above. Equitation class placings for the Intro Poles and Crossrail divisions will count towards champion and reserve awards.

All Equitation classes will count towards the USHJA Outreach Program.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

Open Jumper Divisions

Divisions are open to JR, AM, and Professional riders. No cross entry restrictions. No combinations for .80m and below. USEF jumper tables and rules apply.

.60m to .80m classes will run USEF Jumper Table Table IV.1 (Optimum time) and Table 2.C (Power & Speed). .90m to 1.30m classes will run USEF Jumper Table 2.C (Power & Speed) and Table 2.1 (Speed).

Hunter Divisions

Traditional hunter attire and equipment is required. Judges will follow USEF/USHJA rules for tack and equipment during competition. No martingales permitted in hack or flat classes. No boots or polo wraps in hunter classes. Under saddle classes with significant entries can be split into A and B groups upon judge's discretion.

Intro Poles 13 & Under Open to JR riders ages 13 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required.

Intro Poles 14 & Over Open to JR and AM riders ages 14 and over based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required.

Crossrails 13 & Under Open to JR riders ages 13 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. Jumps not to exceed crossrail size with no jump fill. No lead changes are required.

Crossrails 14 & Over Open to JR and AM riders ages 14 and under based on riders age at the beginning of the competition year. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. Jumps not to exceed crossrail size with no jump fill. No lead changes are required.

Short/Long Stirrup Hunters 2' Open to JR and AM riders. Changes of lead at the trot are optional in this division. No oxers.

Pre-Green Hunters 2'3" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed.

Modified Hunters 2'6" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed.

Low Hunters 2'9" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed.

Equitation Classes

Intro Walk Trot Equitation Class to be judged at the walk and trot only. Open to JR and AM riders. Age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Points will count towards Intro division placings. Classes with excessive entries may be split into A and B groups at judge's discretion.

Crossrails Walk Trot Canter Equitation Class to be judged at the walk, trot, and canter only. Open to JR and AM riders. Age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Points will count towards Crossrail division placings. Classes with excessive entries may be split into A and B groups at judge's discretion.

Equitation over Poles Open to JR and AM riders, age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Poles classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required.

Equitation Crossrails Open to JR and AM riders, age group classes will be offered at the 13 & Under and 14 & Over groups. Jumps not to exceed crossrail height with no jump fill. Classes can be ridden at the trot or canter. No lead changes are required.

Equitation 2', Equitation 2'3", Equitiation 2'6", Equitation 2'9" Open to JR and AM riders. To be judged in accordance with USEF/USHJA rules. Professional riders may enter as a non-judged/non-compete round if needed. Classes will not count toward hunter division placings.

Dressage Classes

Open to all riders. Short versus long dressage arena format will be determined by management based on schedule and availability. Traditional attire and equipment is suggested but not required. Please see dressage class no-show and scratch policy as this is strictly enforced.

TIP/Thoroughbred Only Classes

Classes are open to juniors, amateurs, and professionals riding Thoroughbreds only. All Thoroughbreds with or without Jockey Club Registration are eligible to compete. Horses do not need to be registered with TIP to enter. Additional TIP awards will be given for registered horses. Classes will be run together with regular classes and placed separately. Thoroughbred class placings do not count towards division placings in the hunter or jumper divisions. CWD Sand Hill Medal Program (2'3")

The CWD Sand Hill Medal is a qualifying finals program hosted by Sand Hill Equestrian Events at the Woodside Show Series. This program aims to provide a fun and educational finals experience for junior and amateur riders. The final winner will receive a grand prize from CWD, and all top finalists will receive prizes. Awards presentation and judge's discussion will be held for all finalists at the conclusion of the finals class. Following the awards presentation, riders have the opportunity to participate in a brief judge's Q&A and commentary session to ask for feedback and learn about the course. Time will be limited to the horse show schedule, up to 20 minutes. Riders are encouraged to ride for ribbons but are not required to participate in the judge's discussion.

Qualifying classes: Qualifying classes are offered at every WSS show, including the Fall Finale. All classes will run in a hunter/equitation style competition arena with fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-16. Classes are open to Junior & Adult Amateur riders only that are not showing in any class that is 2'9" or above. Any rider who has won a ribbon in a qualifying class is invited to participate in the the CWD Sand Hill Medal Final. Points from shows hosting the medal during the current show year at any date before the WSS Fall Finale are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Any rider that has previously won the CWD Sand Hill Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

Year End Finals: The CWD Medal Finals will be held at the WSS Fall Finale show in Woodside, CA. The top 10 riders from Saturday are invited to participate in the CWD Sand Hill Medal Final class, held at the WSS Fall Finale on Sunday. The top 4 to 6 riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Judge may choose how many riders to work off, with a minimum of 4 riders and maximum of 6. Finals class and work off will follow all specifications and test options of the qualifying classes. Awards presentation and judge's discussion will be held for all finalists at the conclusion of the class. Riders are encouraged to ride for ribbons but are not required to participate in the judge's discussion.

Sand Hill Equestrian Hunter Derby

Open to all riders. Placings do not count towards hunter sections for champion & reserve awards. Crossrails, 2', 2'3", 2'6", 2'9" heights included. Class will be run on an open card with all heights combined for final placings at the end of the day. To be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality/substance, and movement. After the judge's score is given, one point will be added for each option fence jumped. Classes are open to juniors, amateurs, and professionals. No schooling rounds allowed. Prize money, if offered, will be split accordingly: 30%, 20%, 15%, 13%, 10%. The Sand Hill Equestrian Hunter Derby is USHJA Outreach Program eligible.

Woodside Jumper Medal

Classes are offered at every WSS show with one class per height section at the .60m, .70m, and .80m level. Class is open to Junior & Adult Amatuer riders. Riders may not cross enter into multiple jumper medal classes at the same show. To be shown over a course of at least 10 fences at the specified jumper height (.60m, .70m, .80m). This class will be run in a jumper style competition arena. No timers or time allowed will be used. The judge will start the round with a signal to the rider to start the course. To be judged on a rider's equitation style, technical ability, seat guidance, & control of the horse for a jumper style ride. Riders are penalized for refusals, falls, going off course, or knocking down a rail. Limit 2 refusals. Jumper bits and equipment are allowed. Jumping penalties follow USEF Equitation rules.

The Madden Crossrail Medal

Established in 2023 for the Jr/Am riders, in the name of William Bill Madden, the owner of Brookside Equestrian Park for over 30 years. The Madden Crossrail Medal was established to recognize and reward the performance of a junior or amateur rider who is starting or returning to competition, and not competing over 1'9" from October final to October Final. Two riders must enter for the class to count as a qualifier. Qualifying classes for the Medal Finals are offered throughout the show year at many shows, and any rider earning a ribbon (1st to 10th or 1st to 8th) at any show is qualified. There is no membership in any association required. Riders that have qualified and then show in 2' height will be disqualified from competing for the Crossrail Finals. The Finals class will be held at the Brookside Fall Finale in October. The Finals will allow trotting and cantering on course and will be judged on a riders equitation over a course of cross rail fences of not less than 8 fences, at a height of 1'9", with at least two additional equitation tests included in the course. An additional test will be required of the top 10 scoring riders after the first two rounds. The Finals will be tallied and scored and the presentation of champion, reserve champion, and 3rd through 10th. Riders are required to ride for the awards ceremony. Champion receives a golf cart and reserve champion receives a \$1,000 shopping certificate. A rider who wins the Madden Medal Finals is no longer eligible to participate in any future Finals. A perpetual plaque will be on display at Brookside Equestrian Park.

Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider 2' Medal

Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Green Rider Medal features fences not to exceed 2' in height. Class is to be held over a hunter-style equitation style. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-6 and 10-13. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders who have not competed at heights above 3'. Riders may not cross enter in the Paso Park Medal. Finals of the Green Rider Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1 of the previous year through October 31 of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st – 7pts, 2nd – 5pts, 3rd – 4pts, 4th – 3pts, 5th – 2pts, 6th – 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Green Rider Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Green Rider Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

Almaden Farms Jr/Am

To be shown over a minimum of 8 fences 2'9" in height, with two changes of lead after the first fence, and might include one combination which must include an oxer. Two or more tests will be incorporated in the original course. No work-off is required. Two contestants must complete the course. Points awarded 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2. 1st & 2nd place winners qualify for the Finals.

Paso Park 2'6" Medal

Hosted at the Paso Park Schooling Show Series, the Paso Park B Series, and other regional shows, the Paso Park Medal features fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. A minimum of two riders must complete the course in order for the round to qualify for points. The top four riders (if available) in the class may be asked to work off at the judge's discretion. Alternatively, the course designer may choose to integrate the test(s) into the posted course. Tests may include USEF equitation tests 1-17. This class may be run in either a jumper or hunter competition arena; jumper-style tack is permitted, no time allowed is to be considered. This class is open to all junior and amateur riders. Riders may not cross enter in the Lindsay Ashburn Memorial Green Rider 2' Medal. Finals of the Paso Park Medal will be held at the Turkey Trot & Jump show. Points from shows hosting the medal between December 1 of the previous year through October 31 of the current year or at the Turkey Trot & Jump show are eligible to qualify a rider for the Finals. Points are to be awarded as follows: 1st - 7pts, 2nd - 5pts, 3rd - 4pts, 4th - 3pts, 5th - 2pts, 6th - 1pt. Riders with 7 points or more are invited to participate in the Paso Park Medal Final. Any rider that has previously won the Paso Park 3' Medal Final is no longer eligible to compete.

Cloverleaf Jumper Challenge

Open only to Junior and Amateur riders who are not showing in any jumper classes during this show year over 3'3" (1.0m). To be judged over a jumper course of no less than 9 fences at 2'7" (80cm) in height. The class will be judged under the rules of any/all USEF jumper tables. Any jumper-type bit or equipment is allowed, except draw reins. At least two riders must enter for the class to be a qualifier for the finals. All ribbon winners will qualify for the Finals. The Cloverleaf Challenge Finals will be held at Brookside during the Fall Finale Show. The Finals will consist of two rounds, held over two separate days, with a final jump-off of the top 10 from the first two rounds combined scores and/or all riders with combined clean round scores. The champion of the finals will earn a golf cart, with the reserve champion receiving a \$1,000 shopping certificate. Third through 10th place will all receive awards. Previous winners of the Cloverleaf Equitation Finals are not eligible for the Cloverleaf Jumper Challenge Finals.
