

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IN ISLAMABAD 2025

JANUARY - JUNE 2025

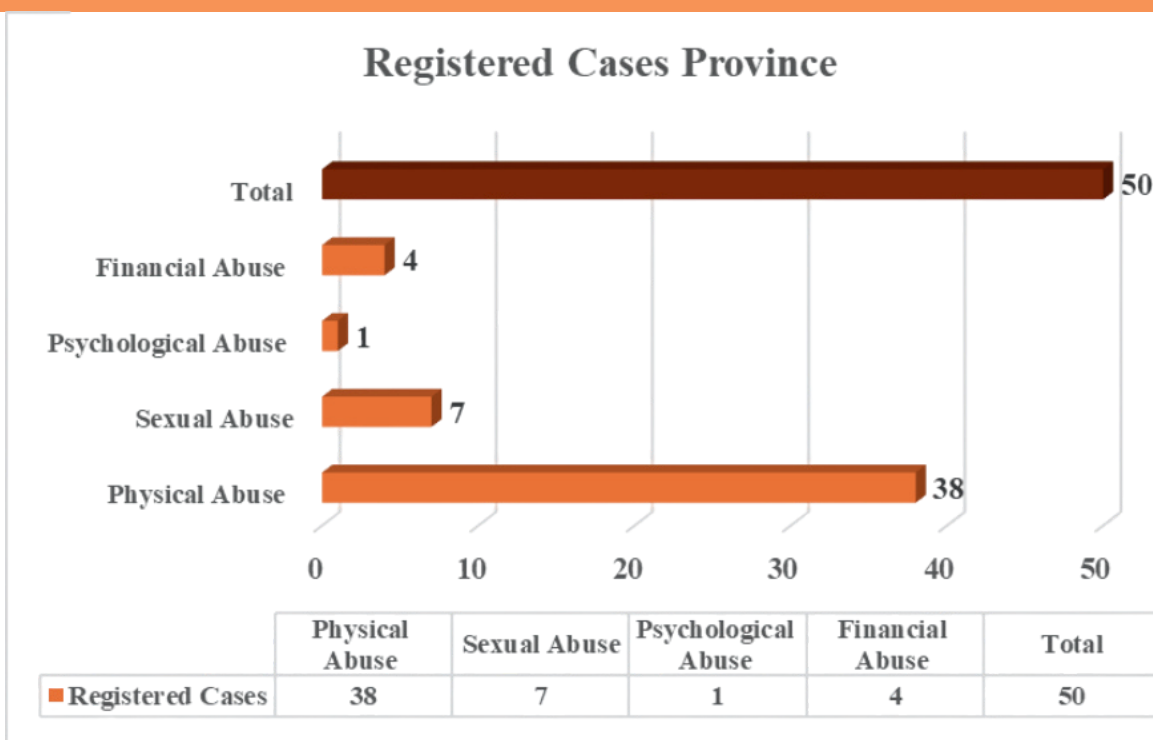
Introduction

This factsheet presents the number of domestic violence cases reported in Islamabad, categorized into physical abuse, sexual abuse, psychological abuse, and financial abuse. The data was obtained through the Right to Information (RTI) from the Police Department.

It highlights the progression of these cases through the legal process, including stages such as investigation, challan submission, trial, conviction, withdrawal, and acquittal.

Objective

The objective of this analysis is to identify and assess gaps in the reporting, investigation, and trial procedures of domestic violence cases in Islamabad.

A total of 50 cases were reported, with the majority still in process. Physical abuse represents the highest proportion, accounting for 38 out of 50 cases (76%), with 13 under investigation, 24 challans submitted, and 24 under trial, yet no convictions to date. Sexual abuse comprises 14% (7 cases), of which 2 are under investigation and 4 under trial, again with no convictions or withdrawals. Psychological abuse was the least reported category, making up only 2% (1 case), which has advanced to trial after challan submission but with no outcome yet. Financial abuse accounts for 8% (4 cases), all of which have progressed to trial, with no ongoing investigations, convictions, or withdrawals.
