Why Fundraise?



- Chapter fundraising...
 - Helps pay for conference fees.
 - Raises money for competition materials.
- Fundraising for the American Cancer Society...
 - Strengthens the fight against cancer.
 - Greatly helps your community!
- Other Benefits:

#1 - Time Get started ASAP!

A good fundraiser takes time to plan!

- Brainstorming, logistics, materials preparation, and communication all require time to complete.
- It's best to get started as soon as possible so there's time to solve any issues that arise. Try not to procrastinate!



#2 - Collaboration Teamwork makes the dream work!



Planning a large fundraiser by yourself can be overwhelming!

- Try to get a few friends together to help you work through the fundraising process.
 - Discuss past fundraisers: What worked?
 What didn't?
 - Divide tasks based on strengths and weaknesses.
 - Set a goal for this fundraiser.
- Be sure to also talk with advisors, other clubs, school staff, and administration to see how they can help with your fundraising efforts!

#3 - Communication Keep everyone on track!




Communication is the key to success!

- Make sure everyone involved knows what's going on.
 - Other members, advisors, volunteers, etc.
- Hold regular group meetings leading up to fundraisers ensure everything is going smoothly.
 - ABC (Always Be Checking)! Check in on team members to make sure that they're doing their part.
 - If someone's not doing their part, replace before it's too late!

#3 - Communication (cont.) Here's some ways to do it:

Create a **dedicated communication channel** that can get information out **quickly** and **efficiently**.

Messages, WhatsApp, Discord, and Slack are all great options!



#4 - Know Your Audience Target a demographic!

Know your audience well!

- Make sure that you understand your audience's interests to ensure you can get the most out of each fundraiser.
 - Take into consideration their age, their hobbies, etc.
- Additionally, try to incorporate elements from outside your target demographic to broaden your effective audience and thus spread interest.




#5 - Outreach Spread the word!

A well-planned fundraiser is meaningless if no one knows about it!

- Utilize multiple social media platforms such as Instagram, TikTok, and Facebook to promote your fundraiser event.

- If possible, spread the word on school networks and with posters around the school. Getting help from teachers is a great way to advertise too!

 - Speak with local businesses and see how you can work together to achieve a common goal.

Corporate Sponsorships!

- Look for...

 - Companies that are involved in your school district.

- Relay for Life is a nonprofit charity walk/run that brings together communities in the fight against cancer.
 - Prior to the event: Teams compete to raise the most money through fundraising and virtual campaigns.
 - Event day: Teams compete to run the most laps while participating in various onsite fundraisers.

- Bolster ongoing Relays
 - Volunteering to help with existing Relays helps make everything go smoothly and ensures the success of the fundraiser.
- Community Involvement
 - Volunteering for Relays helps change TSA's perception in the community. It's not just a STEM organization, but a place where future leaders are born.

How to Proceed

American Cancer Society®

Option A: Volunteer to Help

- As a Region or as a Chapter, **find and contact** the Relay event you wish to attend.
 - Discuss volunteer opportunities and how you can represent TSA while there.
 - Arrive early, help set up, clean up, and fulfill all obligations you've agreed to.
 Remember, you are representing all of TSA!

- <u>Note</u>: Make sure to coordinate this with all your chapter members! It reflects poorly on us if promises are made and broken.
- Extend an invitation to to members of your school as well.
 - Ex. Key Club, Student Council, other CTSOs, etc.

Option B: Create a Team to Compete!

- Visit the American Cancer Society Relay for Life website and register a team for your selected event.
 - The more people on your team the better! Encourage all your chapter members to attend.
- Host regular fundraising events to raise money for your team.

- Show up on the event day and have fun!
