

Guide to applying

Keep your answers succinct and within the word limit

Your application should be straight to the point and succinct, so our panel do not miss vital information. To keep track of word limits, we recommend drafting your responses first before writing on the form, using a seperate platform that tracks word count.

Be specific

Detail how the grant will directly benefit our community. Use the form to discuss your projects while highlighting the long-term impact. Be as specific as you can when discussing what funding will be used towards, as we want to know it's going to be put to good use.

Remember to save a copy of your application

Applications cannot be saved in draft form and the application does not auto-save as you go. Make sure to save a copy of your submission elsewhere for future reference and in case of technical difficulties.

Write persuasively

We want to hear why you need a grant, so the application should be persuasive and give us a good understanding of your community group or organisation, We are keen to hear why the project or work is worthy of the funding.

Have someone else look over your application

Editing and reviewing are important to make sure your points are cohesive and succinct. It is also an effective way to check hyperlinks and remove duplicate information.
