SÜSS is expected to release more detailed preliminary results in mid-February after a miss of the Q4 revenue forecast had to be announced early in the year as a result of component shortages. Owing to the solid visibility thanks to the high order backlog, SÜSS might already provide a guidance for FY 2022 which is likely to be ahead of the consensus forecasts. While we are reducing the earnings projections, the estimates remain ahead of the consensus expectations. The strong earnings increase expected (EBIT / EPS to almost double in 2022) is not reflected in today's share price at all.


A positive 2022 guidance could serve as a positive trigger for the currently low share-price levels. SÜSS should have reached an order backlog of almost EUR 200m at the end of December, which is a ~60% yoy increase and reflects postponed deliveries and, in particular, the strong H2 order intake. This should lead to a significant yoy-rise in quarterly sales as soon as in Q1 and, coupled with the continuation of a positive environment, provides the basis for the expected top-line increase of almost 30% (assuming that the recent shortages ease over the course of the year). This compares with the consensus forecast for 20%, which should be beaten. The strong revenue increase should enable SÜSS to return to EBIT margins above the 12%-mark. While we adjusted our estimates somewhat (for instance, higher R&D investments to support continued growth), SÜSS is nevertheless expected to almost double the EBIT / EPS figures in comparison to last year. This does not change the expectation for the achievement of a 15% EBIT margin. This sustainable profitability improvement is not even remotely reflected in the current valuation considering EV/EBIT multiples of 7x for 2022 and <6x for 2023, less than half of peers' multiples of 16x (2022). A guidance (now or later in March) for strong top-line growth (probably ahead of consensus estimates) and a clear profitability improvement is hence expected to be a positive share-price driver. On Friday, SÜSS announced that supervisory board member Dietmar Meister is stepping down with effect as of March 1, which is considered to be a neutral event. The Buy rating is reiterated.

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


Company Background

- Globally leading manufacturer of systems for the MEMS, advanced packaging, 3D IC and LED niche markets with the product segments lithography (mask aligner,coater), bonder and equipment to clean photomasks.
- MEMS integrate electronic and mechanical components. Fields of application are e.g. pressure sensors (e.g. in tyre pressure control systems) or position and acceleration sensors (e.g. smartphones, tablet PCs).
- Advanced packaging is a special packaging process used as an alternative to the classic wire bonding ("flip chip") for semiconductors
 where these are directly bonded to the substrate without wire connections.
- 3D packaging is a solution to the increasingly difficult ongoing structural downsizing of semiconductors. CMOS image sensors are an early field of application. This market offers enormous growth potential for SÜSS.
- The majority of production is located at two sites in Germany (Garching, Sternenfels) which offer ample capacity for anticipated growth. SÜSS has ca. 900 employees.

Competitive Quality

- SÜSS consistently focuses on the core topics (precision, reliability and low total cost of ownership) in all segments and gears the products to the customers' needs.
- The 60-year company history and the consistently high product quality have firmly established SÜSS as a brand-name in the addressed markets.
- This and the global service network make the company a preferred supplier for production equipment in particular.
- As the respective markets have a niche character, SÜSS usually only has to face moderate competition and rarely has to compete with the major suppliers of the sector.
- This combined with the high product complexity poses a major barrier to market entry and secures the company a leading position in the respective markets.

Free Cash Flow Value Potential

Warburg Research's valuation tool "FCF Value Potential" reflects the ability of the company to generate sustainable free cash flows. It is based on the "FCF potential" - a FCF "ex growth" figure - which assumes unchanged working capital and pure maintenance capex. A value indication is derived via the perpetuity of a given year's "FCF potential" with consideration of the weighted costs of capital. The fluctuating value indications over time add a timing element to the DCF model (our preferred valuation tool).





CAPEX and Cash Flow in EUR m


