The internationally acclaimed Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the fourth-oldest symphony orchestra in the United States, is known for trailblazing performances, visionary maestros, and collaborations with the world's foremost musical artists. The DSO makes its home in historic Orchestra Hall (within The Max M. and Marjorie S. Fisher Music Center), one of America's most acoustically perfect concert halls, and actively pursues a mission to impact and serve the community through music. The Peter D. & Julie F. Cummings Cube – known more commonly as The Cube – is the DSO's black box performance space within The Max M. and Marjorie S. Fisher Music Center. The Cube is defined for the <u>c</u>urated, <u>u</u>rban, <u>b</u>oundless <u>e</u>xperiences it delivers to audiences. The venue is designed to not only be accessible but relevant to communities the DSO serves and wishes to attract with consciously curated arts programs.
