Leading academics from Oxford travel to Chengdu to teach at the camp, engaging local Chinese students alongside international participants.


Subjects Included:

- Critical Thinking: Develop logic, reasoning, and analytical skills. Learn to assess sources, recognise biases, and apply probabilistic thinking.

Location

Chengdu, known as "Rong" for short, is the capital of Sichuan Province and a sub-provincial, national central city. It serves as a hub for science and technology, business, finance, transportation, and communication in southwest China. Located in the western Sichuan Basin and on the eastern edge of the Qinghai-Tibetan Plateau, Chengdu enjoys a subtropical monsoon climate with distinct vertical climatic zones, providing ideal conditions for agriculture and tourism

The Dujiangyan irrigation system transformed the Chengdu Plain into a fertile "Land of Abundance." The region is home to rare animals such as giant pandas, lesser pandas, and golden snub-nosed monkeys. Chengdu is also renowned for its cuisine, earning the city UNESCO's recognition as the first "Gourmet Capital of Asia."



Cultural Exploration and Sports

The programme combines Oxford's intellectual excellence with China's rich cultural heritage, offering immersive experiences both inside and outside the classroom. Students engage in curated cultural and physical activities designed to foster global awareness, collaboration, and personal development.

Activities Include

- Visits to Panda Valley and Qingcheng Mountain
- Hands-on workshops in Sichuan opera face-painting, traditional bamboo weaving, martial arts, and calligraphy
- Exploration of Chengdu's cuisine, art, and cultural heritage
- Daily physical activities such as flag football, frisbee, and teambuilding games
- Traditional games including board games, chess, Chinese chess (Xiangqi), and Mahjong
