Suitable for 5+ neighbours

How it works

- 1. Get your neighbours together and agree a date to start growing sunflowers, planting them at the same time
- 2. Agree a final date and a prize for the tallest sunflower (it could even just be a certificate)
- 3. Use this free website to monitor your community progress: sunflowercompetition.co.uk

→ How to grow sunflowers

It's easy to do: plant a sunflower seed between May and June

- Sow the seeds individually in 10cm pots of compost and cover them with a clear plastic bag, putting them in a sunny warm spot inside.
- Once seedlings appear, take the cover off and put them outside for two or three weeks. Once they grow, plant them in your garden/in bigger pots.
- Water them regularly and keep slugs and snails away.

- What to do with old sunflowers

- Once they've flowered, sunflower heads have lots of seeds
- Remove these seeds and leave them to dry
- You can then share these seeds with your neighbours to plant more sunflowers the next year.

Don't forget to scatter some seeds on the ground for the birds to eat too!
