New business: The State archery meeting will be this Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup> in Grand Island. Jim Tubbs, Adam Jirovsky and Chris Benson plan to attend. The plan is to request the same shoots as last year. Requesting the State 900 the last weekend of June.

The club received a letter from Lincoln Parks \$ Rec regarding the bike trail along our property. Plans are underway to design and install a pedestrian bridge over the railroad tracks to connect the trail to Wilderness Park. The letter is being sent to all abutting owners giving us the month of November to respond regarding our concerns.

New member applications from Rose Acevedo, Dave Adelman and the Vi Luangaphay family were approved.

It was decided to acquire a US flag for the indoor range.

The December 7<sup>th</sup> meeting was called to order at 7:00. Board members present were: Wes Sheets, Adam Jirovsky, Joel Burhan, Brian Krogman, Wayne Janssen and Chris Benson. Members present were Steve Woitaszewski, Harry Windle, Clint Burge, Chase Powers and Jim Tubbs.

Minutes of last month's meeting were read and approved along with the treasurer's report.

Brian reported nothing new at this time regarding the ranges.

Adam reported the 450 invitational is coming next weekend. Saturday 7:00 line, Sunday 8:30 to 11:00.

He has been looking at solutions to repair the target backers at the indoor range. Pass throughs are a problem. The ones we have can be dismantled and the centers removed, replaced by material from one to repair the other three. He is also pricing more backers like the ones we have or possibly another manufacturer.

It was also decided to purchase some rubber horse mats to install behind the backers to help stop arrows.

Steve reported the classes are in session with 16 shooters, mostly kids. The progress of their shooting is good.

We are returning to Constant Contact, a marketing tool to help us improve communication with club members. Chase is going to try to run down the password for the club Facebook account.

### **New Business:**

The indoor 3-D league will start on January 10<sup>th</sup> and run for 11 weeks. Cost for members will be \$10 per night, non-members will be \$15. Price increases reflect the high cost of 3-D targets. Motion to increase was voted on and approved. The target league will start on January 14<sup>th</sup> and rates remain same as last year, \$5 for members and \$8 for non-members.

Motion was made to close the range to open shooting an hour before leagues was approved.

Our annual meeting will be held Saturday, March 9<sup>th</sup> at the Highlands Golf Course from 6 to 9 pm. Jim will reserve the room, deposit is \$150 and the rate is \$50/hr. They will allow us to have a pot luck, no outside alcohol is allowed as they sell it there.

It was moved and seconded to again donate a year's club membership at the Big Game Conservation Association banquet
