I hope you can follow our Face Book correspondent at prairiebowmanboard as he sees things of great interest and lets us know who is doing what. A great example was a picture last week when the indoor target league grew from 5 to 10 participates, which reminded me that you don't need to be regular at the leagues. Just showing up and testing your skills can simply be fun even if you don't consider yourself "competitive". There isn't anything better that seeing your score total be larger than your score was last month. And besides that the 10 ring on the blue target is just about the lethal kill area of a big gobbler that will be strutting around you on March 25th.

If you are a hunter you may wish to know that several of us have spent some time in the capital during the last few weeks testifying on matters that impact the sport of hunting here in Nebraska. I missed Wayne's testimony on the ivory ban but then yesterday the natural Resources committee took testimony on legislation that would increase penalties for game law violations that give our sport a black eye. As an example, if enacted the penalty for shooting at game from a road would increase from \$100 to \$500 and poaching an elk becomes a class I misdemeanor with \$1k fine plus the liquidated damage assessment. Involvement in these hunting issues is a part of our club mission as defined by our founding members.

Be thinking spring as a time to work up a sweat. I am hearing big plans to resurrect our lower range that would return it to its 1990's glory. It can be the superior roving field course of Eastern Nebraska. So get out and fling an arrow or two as the next season comes upon us. Cheers---Wes



Secretary's Report:

1/2/2017 Board meeting was called to order at 7:00. Board members in attendance were: Wes Sheets, Lonnie Mostek, Wayne Janssen, John Filsinger, Joel Burham, and Chris Benson. Members present were: Clint Burge, Steve Woitaszewski, Charles Hall, Adam Jirovsky, Brian Krogman, Roy Sheldon, Gary Irvin and Joe Sloup.

Old Business:

The new target backers are in progress. Some (4) are due in about a week, balance in progress. Discussion was held regarding selling the existing target backers. Final decision was tabled until next meeting.

New Business:

Motion was made and seconded to spend up to \$100 to purchase accounting software. Motion carried.

Voted to accept 7 new member applications. Motion made and seconded to streamline the new membership process. Upon receipt of the application and payment of dues, applicants will be given the range combination. These memberships will be considered "temporary" until board approval. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding this year's Bowhunter and Target leagues.

Discussion was held about Scheel's donation for our new target backers. Scheels is anxious to work with the Prairie Bowmen to help us promote the sport of archery in Lincoln.

Discussion was held regarding the \$30 maintenance fee sent to members in November. Motion and seconded (motion carried) to offer three options:

The fee will be applied to next year's membership renewal following a written request and return of the two entry fee coupons.

Members wishing to consider the fee a donation to the club need not respond.

Old Business:

Continued discussion regarding Life Memberships. Approximately 25% of our total membership consists of Life members. Many haven't been heard from for several years. Discussion was held regarding some type of minimal "maintenance fee" to help defray the cost of several mailings throughout the year. This would only apply to those who wish to stay on the mailing list. Otherwise the newsletters and all other club correspondence would be sent through electronic messaging.

Discussion was held regarding the upcoming 300 round and 3-D indoor round.

Plans were made for the annual banquet, setting up tables, kid's shooting, etc.

Discussion was held regarding the need for a Level 2 instructor for the JOAD program. John Filsinger volunteered to seek the designation.

Discussion was held regarding a possible questionnaire for club members. It would request ideas to improve participation, etc. Any ideas to improve the club going forward.

New Business:

Appointed Brian Krogman as the acting Target Representative for the Board.

Motion was made and seconded to award an honorary membership for 2017 to Chad Scott. Chad has been fighting some health issues and needs to step away from archery for a while. Motion carried.

Nine new memberships were approved.

Discussion was held regarding our old target backers. A couple of inquiries and offers have been made. Decision was made to proceed with trying to get them sold.

Discussion was held about the recent passing of Randy Latimer of Norfolk. Randy was heavily involved with archery (instruction, 4-H, NASP, etc.) and was known by many archers across the state. It was moved and seconded to send the Norfolk club \$100 and to donate a portion of upcoming 3-D shoots as a memorial. Motion carried.

Members from the UNL archery club were in attendance to discuss the past year's agreement with the Prairie Bowmen. UNL students can join Prairie Bowmen for \$50/yr. and have full access to the range. Students may also pay \$15/semester to use the range once a week. Motion and seconded to continue the arrangement. Motion carried.

The next board meeting is scheduled for March 10th.
