### You, Your Bow and Hot Weather

- 1. Wear loose fitting, light colored, clothing ( I once read mosquitos like the color blue so I avoid it), the light colored clothing helps you see those pesky ticks better as well.
- 2. Thermacell's work! So does bug spray but remember to wash your hands after application as it can wreak havoc on your camo paint job, or any plastic parts...especially lens. Permatone is good on your clothes (do not apply to your skin) to help keep ticks away.
- 3. Don't forget your sunscreen....sunburns lead to skin cancer...make sure you give your ears and nose extra protection. If you wear sandals, I have seen some pretty nasty burns on the feet so don't forget them.
- 4. A hat is important...especially for those of us who might be somewhat "folicly impaired"
- 5. Drink plenty of water or Gatorade.....pop is not the best thirst quencher no matter how good it tastes. Beer or alcohol should be avoided.
- 6. Heat stroke is a very serious issue, it can happen to anyone, but affects both the old and young most often. A wet cloth applied to the back of the neck has helped me many times. Rest, sit and stay in the shade when you can.
- 7. When transporting your bow in the vehicle, having the bow in a case will help keep it cool. I personally cover mine with a sleeping bag as I don't like to take off my stabilizer to make it fit in the case. Temps inside a vehicle can exceed 150 degrees, protecting your bow from that extreme heat will assure the heat doesn't damage it. I have even seen arrows lose their points and even fletchings if they get too hot.
- 8. Heat can cause even the best strings and cables to stretch, thus affecting your draw length and tune some.
- 9. I carry a towel to wipe off the sweat and a lens cloth to keep my glasses clean and dry.
- 10. Many more things could be mentioned but these are a few that I make sure I watch


Numbers were low (55 total shooters), but all who attended had lots of compliments for us and except for the wind enjoyed the challenging shots.
