Short discussion was held about several names dropped from membership for failure to keep dues current.

Youth – John reported the youth beginning archery classes just ended. The next session is to start July 4. On June 23rd the Lincoln Children's Museum is hosting "Little Dudes" night for young boys and their Mothers and Grandmothers. Up to 200 boys are expected. The Club will be there for archery fun.

On July 17th the Cooper YMCA will be bringing some kids to the outdoor range for an introduction to archery.

Target – Brian reported the target league has been slow but he intends to keep trying. The heat and rain have also not helped.

Secretary/Treasurer Report

Range master Lonnie reported the 4/29 work day was good. The shooting line was installed and the Wood family tidied up the range and club house.

The next work day is scheduled for July 1 at 8:00 am. The club house needs to be prepped for paint. Diamond Vogel has donated 10 gal. of paint. We will also look at moving the bleachers behind the new shooting line.

Old business: The last of the target backers are finally in. Short discussion was held regarding possible ways to canvas the membership regarding the club logo.

New business: Motion and seconded to give a \$25 gift certificate to the owner of the compressor used to inflate all the balloons for the kid's events. Motion carried.

Discussion held regarding the insurance coverage of our hail damage to roofs. The club doesn't have replacement cost coverage so the old roofs had to be depreciated. The net result is the club is to receive a check for \$1,129.

Our new tax valuation is in showing basically no change from the last two years.

The well has been decommissioned and we are now waiting for the cost share from the NRD.

Discussion was held regarding the upcoming 3-D on the 17th and 18th. The range needs work prior to the shoot. Time was scheduled for Monday the 12th at 5:00. It was decided to offer free lunch on Sunday in observance of Father's Day.

A proposal from Scheels regarding the Jamboree (Aug. 19 & 20) was received. The board will be meeting with Scott when he's back in town.

Ten new member applications were received. Following short discussion with no objections all were accepted.

The fish fry has been scheduled for August 26th.

The next meeting is scheduled for June 30 at 7:00.
