Newsletter Editor Report

Generally there is not a report from the newsletter editor in this publication, but on this occasion there is room left over so I thought it appropriate to take advantage of the opportunity and not waste paper. My job is to facilitate communications with the membership and the public relative to activities of the club. In this case I am attempting to communicate with you as members relating to the upcoming elections.

There will be three director openings to be filled by the elections. Those positions are Target Coordinator, Range Master and Communication Coordinator. All of these positions are important to the proper function of this club. We need willing people to take on the responsibilities of each position. As stated in the President's Report it is important to have at least two candidates for each post. There will be a space for write-in candidates on the ballot but you might as well declare early. By submitting your name as a nominee your qualifications will be published in the October newsletter.

If you are concerned about your ability to take on one of these positions you should be aware that none of us are infallible and it takes the whole team to make the club work. That means that if one board member is having problems or needs help, the rest of the board is there to assist. The membership will also turn out if needed. Last year when one of the board members became ill and could not take part for a period of time other members took up the slack and kept his program running. You will not be alone in your position if you choose to run and are elected.

I have been a member since about 1977. During my membership I have tried to help when the job skills of my profession would be beneficial to the club but I never served on the board. Two years ago it became apparent that we needed a newsletter editor and no one-else seemed interested in the position. Part of the job description was to manage the website and publish the newsletter. I had absolutely no experience at either task and consider myself to be IT illiterate. I decided it was time to help out and have not regretted my decision. While I am still learning, if you are reading this or have checked out the web page recently it would appear that I have had at least some success. My position has forced me to become educated in the very basics of media and I look forward to learning and doing more. If someone else wishes to serve in this position that would be great.

If you want to look into running for a board position you can go to the website and click on membership. Then go to the bottom of the pop-up and click on General Rules & Bylaws. There you will find a detailed description of the responsibilities of each position. While the language set out there may seem quite formal the bottom line is that we need to get the overall job of running the club accomplished. The job is a joint effort by all board members and the general membership so don't be intimidated.

Nominations for an office can be made by a nominating committee of the board or from the floor at the September board meeting. If you are interested in an office you should contact a board member so your name can be placed in nomination or you can come to the September meeting and nominate yourself from the floor. A ballot which will include lines for write-in votes will be mailed out in the October newsletter. The ballots will be counted at the October club meeting. The winners will attend the November board meeting and take office after the December board meeting. There should be a smooth transition to the new board

This club is made up of members from all walks of life and all ages. Some of our members have been here for over forty years while others are relatively new. At some point all of those members need to step up and help out. This is the time for at least three people to do just that and run for office. We have been in existence for over 60 years.
