AWARDS AVAILABLE TO CLUB MEMBERS

We have several big awards for the biggest of harvested animals. The youth have two awards in the Jerry Siefken Youth Big Fish and the Benjamin W. Pleiss Youth Big Buck Award. Even though these maybe youth awards, they are still eligible for the adult awards if theirs is bigger. Next we have two adult turkey awards, the first is the Mike Swiggart Typical Big Tom Award and second we have the Bog Spicha Multi Bearded Turkey Award. The biggest antelope is represented by the John Bussen Big Antelope Award. We have an elk award in the honor of Bruce Batterman in the Bruce Batterman Big Elk Award. The biggest deer is the Dick Koch Memorial Big Buck Award. A Pope and Young scoring system for typical, non-typical and mule deer, and for elk and antelope determines who is given this award every year. A certified scale must be used for all weights as in the fish and turkey awards and a Pope and Young or Boone and Crocket official scorer must be used. 
