

The 8/12/2020 Board meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm at the indoor range.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved followed by the Treasurer's report.

<u>Target:</u> The Monday target hunter league has wrapped up. September 14th there will be a 450 round at the range. Chad would like to have a two-day Prairie Bowmen "Pro-Am" shoot in December. November 21st & 22nd we will host the State Archery Association "President and Secretaries" shoot. This will be a 450 round.

Bowhunter: The bowhunter league continues, not a lot of shooters at this time. August 30th there will be a 3-D shoot at the range.

<u>Youth:</u> Classes are continuing, attendance is slowly increasing. So far, Southeast Community College hasn't cancelled the next session due to the pandemic. The next session starts October 27th.

Rangemaster: Brian brought up the subject of "hanging" bow racks to save some floor space. We may try a few of these to see how it works out. There was discussion regarding purchasing some closed-circuit monitors & cameras. The cameras would be near the targets with monitors behind the shooters so spectators would be able to see the targets without the shooters blocking the view. We will be checking into the cost.

Communication: Nothing new to report at this time.

<u>Old Business:</u> August 23rd is planned for a day to paint the exterior of our building. Steve Woitaszewski and Harry Windle plan to power wash prior to that day.

August 26th from 6:00 to 9:00 the range will be closed so we can inventory our 3-D targets.

Discussion was held regarding our out dated copy machine. Plans are to keep using it until it breaks down or runs out of toner. Patrick Sullivan will donate a copier to the club that should take care of our needs at this time.

Our August 30th 3-D is coming up soon. Registration opens at 11:00am. Any help prior to that to help set up would be appreciated.

<u>New Business:</u> Discussion was held regarding "assistants" for some of our Board positions. It was decided that there will be only one assistant for each of these positions, and these assistants will pay one half the normal dues.

Current Board Member bio's for the offices in this year's election need to be turned in to Bob Larsen within a week.

With the current pandemic a couple of NASP coaches have inquired about practicing at our range. The decision is to require the coach to join our club, and they will be responsible for collecting the fees from their students and remit to the club.

Jeff Rawlinson from the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission has requested to be added back to membership as an honorary member. A motion was made and seconded, carried.

We will be reviving the practice of sending "Welcome To The Club" letters to new members.

Ballots will be emailed to members by October 1st, and must be turned in by October 14th. These electronic ballots will be "blind" and secure so no one will know who turned in the vote, and no one can vote more than once. Family members still have two votes.

<u>New member applications</u> were presented and approved from the Todd Jedrzejczyk family, Chad Schneider, Kelsey Romshek, Justin Wilson and Jon Topp.

Bill Wessig

(1/16/1946 - 9/8/2006)

From shooting his bows and arrows as a child and continued his passion for the sport throughout his life. When he moved to Lincoln, he joined Prairie Bowmen and furthered his lie long passion by competing in many types of archery events.

Bill shot longbow, recurve, primitive and Olympic style bows in NFAA, FITA and IBO 3D's. He shot both indoors and outdoors plus the Senior Games and Cornhusker State Games. Yes, he even had a compound bow. He made his own bows and handcrafted and painted his own arrows with some given as awards.

Bill won many tournaments including winning State Overall Champion in Recurve/Longbow in 2001, 2002 and 2003. He was also Indoor and Outdoor Sectional Champion in 2002 and finished as high as 3rd at NFFA Indoor Nationals in 2004.

He loved to help with Kids Camp every year and many kids have quivers, arm guards, finger tabs or other items he made. Bill "The Caveman" was a warrior and never let Leukemia interfere with his love and teaching his "Archery Kids".

When Bill passed away in 2006, Prairie Bowmen proposed a special award called "Bill Wessig's Memorial Bow Award" in his memory. Proceeds from this award going to the "Youth Programs" or the "Kids Camp".

Hope you are all healthy and dealing with the current events in a positive manner. I am certain that many of your lives have been changed forever in many ways as we move forward.

Food for thought: Recently, I attended an outdoor 3-D. Since it had been some time since I had shot a bow I was shooting alone and taking my time. Since I was alone, and I shoot traditional, it wasn't long before I began catching up with those ahead of me. The first thing I noticed was that the person ahead of me was taking 2 shots at every target. I sort of chalked this up to the fact that there was a group of 4 ahead of him and he was just taking a second shot because of the waiting time. As I got closer to the second group, I noticed that they too were taking 2 shots each on every target.


As a board member at my club this kind of thing frustrates me. If you are not a person who is involved in the inner workings of a club there are some things that you may or may not be aware of. When you are following a group of 4 and each person takes 2 shots, you are now following a group of 8 so everyone behind that group has their waiting time doubled. This is much like playing golf. Imagine following a group of 4 on the golf course and all of them are hitting 2 balls. Not only would this be rude to the players behind them, but from the golf courses perspective, you didn't pay for 2 rounds so you shouldn't be playing 2 rounds. The difference between the golf course and the archery range is that on the golf course you aren't doing irreparable damage to the target with every shot.

Again, as a board member I am very aware of the high cost of quality 3-D targets and inserts. Archery clubs aren't in the business to get rich and all the workers are volunteers. Shoots provide the necessary revenue to keep the club afloat and to purchase the equipment needed to provide you with a quality experience while promoting the sport of archery. This becomes much more difficult when supplies have to be replaced sooner than expected. I believe that most people have good intentions in everything they do. I don't believe that anyone intentionally tries to upset other people or cause hardship for the clubs. I believe everyone is just out to have a good time. Let's do our best to make sure everyone does.
