

REDUCE LIGHT POLLUTION

TURN OFF OUTDOOR LIGHTS

Lights at night can confuse and disturb fireflies. Turn off any unnecessary outdoor lights.

USE MOTION SENSORS

If you need outdoor lighting, consider using motion sensors so lights are on only when needed.

INSTALL SHIELDED FIXTURES

Use fixtures that direct light downward and prevent it from spreading into the night sky.

CONTAIN INDOOR LIGHTING

Close curtains and blinds to prevent indoor light from impacting the outside.

SMART GRASS CUTTING

CUT GRASS LESS FREQUENTLY

Allow some parts of your lawn to grow longer. Fireflies thrive in taller grass where they can find moisture and shelter.

LEAVE THE LEAVES

Fireflies lay eggs in moist soil and leaf litter. Let leaves accumulate in certain areas to provide breeding grounds.

CREATE A NATURAL AREA

Dedicate a portion of your yard to remain unmowed and natural. This creates a perfect habitat for fireflies.

AVOID PESTICIDES

USE NATURAL PEST CONTROL

Opt for natural pest control methods instead of chemical pesticides. Fireflies are very sensitive to chemicals.

CREATE A HEALTHY ECOSYSTEM

Encourage natural predators like birds and beneficial insects to control pests.

READ LABELS CAREFULLY

If you must use pesticides, choose those labeled as safe for beneficial insects and use sparingly.
