
## Budget Performance: allocation, release and execution

Performance on FP2020 Financial Commitments
In 2017, the government of Uganda committed to:
1. Allocate \$5 million annually to FP commodities.

• No FP commodities expenditure data in FY 2018/19 because there is no



Government budget documents must be comprehensive, published in a timely manner and made publicly available on government websites free of charge





## Recommendations

### **FP Budgets**

- Increase the FP programs allocation to 5% of the total Reproductive Health Division budget.
- Increase the FP commodities allocation to 50% of the total reproductive health commodities budget.

### **Budget Transparency**

- Create a FP programs budget line within the Reproductive Health Division budget.
- Create a FP commodities budget line within the Reproductive Health Division budget.
- Publish on the MoH website quarterly disbursement and expenditure data for both FP programs and commodities after the end of each quarter.
