## **COMMENDATIONS:**

The government of Zambia is commended for spending all allocated family planning funds, assuming over 14 percent of the total funding needed for contraceptives and having an adolescent health budget line.

### **FAMILY PLANNING BUDGET:**

#### **Observations**

- Family Planning Program costs are hugely donor dependent.
- Annual spending per WRA on family planning progams is ZMK 0.20 (USD 0.02) and ZMK 4.62 (USD 0.38) for contraceptives. It is impossible to know how these measure up to other countries' program and contraceptives spending since there are no established benchmarks.

### Recommendations

The government of Zambia should prioritize the following actions to strengthen government ownership of family planning:

- Increase government funding for Family Planning Commodities.
- Increase government funding for Family Planning Programs to meet the funding need.

#### **TRANSPARENCY:**

## **Observations**

- Since there are no publicly available data on disbursements, it is impossible to know whether disbursements are being made in a timely manner throughout the budget year.
- The lack of publicly available quarterly data on expenditures means that it is impossible to know how funds are being spent throughout the budget year.

## Recommendations

The government of Zambia should prioritize the following actions to improve the transparency of family planning budget information:

- Publish the total funding need for Family Planning Commodities in a publicly available document, preferably online. It is currently in a document that is not publicly available.
- Provide a separate budget line for Family Planning Commodities in the Yellow Book. It is currently combined with the Reproductive Health Commodities line.
- Make publicly available quarterly disbursement data on family planning programs and contraceptives, preferably online.
- Make Ministry of Health quarterly expenditure reports available to the public, preferably online.
- Publish the *Integrated Family Planning Scale-up Plan 2013-2020* on the Ministry of Health website. It is currently only available on a nongovernment website (Family Planning 2020).
- · Keep previous years' Yellow Books on the Ministry of Finance website.

#### Note on Methodology:

• The data collection methodology for this scorecard prioritized use of the most accurate data as opposed to publicly available data. In certain cases, there are more public sources of data—such as the Yellow Book for the Family Planning Commodities allocation—but that figure is slightly different than what we know to be the best data (because it is combined with the reproductive health commodities budget line).
