FP Budget Recommendations

• Maintain the increase in the government allocation for the purchase of contraceptive products by 10% each year in line with the Ouagadougou Partnership commitment.

Trend Data

- The FP programs allocation as a share of the funding need more than doubled between FY 2017 (2.3%) and FY 2018 (5.3%), then decreased in the following two years from 3.9% in FY 2019 to 3.4% in FY 2020.
- There was no contraceptives allocation in FY 2017, then the allocation reached 19% of the funding need in FY 2018 and dropped to 15.3% in FY 2019, where it stayed in FY 2020.
- The expenditure rate of the FP programs allocation dropped from 100% in FY 2017 to 20% in FY 2018. (Data for FY 2019 and FY 2020 are not available.)
- There was no contraceptives expenditure between FY 2017 and FY 2019. In FY 2017, there was no allocation; however, in FY 2018 and FY 2019, allocations were made but nothing was spent. (Data for FY 2020 are not available.)
- The FP programs expenditure as a share of the funding need dropped from 2.3% to 1% between FY 2017 and FY 2018. (Data for FY 2019 and FY 2020 are not available.)

Budget Transparency

Government budget documents must be comprehensive, published in a timely manner and made publicly available on government websites free of charge





Budget Transparency Recommendations

- The National Maternal and Child Health Program to publish the budget allocated to FP and the purchase of FP commodities on its website.
- The MoHPH to publish its annual budget execution report with disaggregated FP expenditure data included.
- The Ministry of the Budget and State-Owned Enterprises to review the annual budget execution report template to integrate expenditure data disaggregated by program and, in particular, disaggregated FP expenditure data at the level of the MoHPH.
- The MoHPH to implement Commitment 9 of the National Action Plan 2020-2022 of the Open Government Partnership (OGP), which aims to publish budget information for FP in general and for the procurement of FP commodities in particular.
- The MoHPH to implement Commitment 8 of the OGP National Action Plan, which aims to create a specific budget line for FP commodities called "Contraceptive Commodities Procurement."
- The MoHPH to publish the information contained in the FP budget information repository on its website.
