New Agricultural Time of Use Rates Available Now

Mandatory transition occurs March 2021



Why Time of Use rates & why are they changing?

Under Time of Use (TOU) rates, electricity prices vary between peak and off-peak times. These price changes correspond to available renewable energy, encouraging the use of electricity when it is cleanest and cheapest.

While most EBCE agricultural electrical customers are already on TOU rates, periods of peak pricing have evolved

in recent years. To achieve California's climate goals and manage procurement costs, EBCE and PG&E are coordinating to transition all agricultural accounts to new Time of Use rates so the off-peak pricing is aligned to periods of low demand and high availability of renewable energy.

How are the Time of Use rates changing?

For the new agriculture (Ag) rates, energy will be most expensive from 5-8 PM year-round, with seasonal price changes. Additionally, there is an optional Ag-F rate that will allow customers two days per week exempt from the peak time period.



NEW PLAN

For the new Ag rates there are two seasons, Winter (October 1 - May 31) and Summer (June 1 - September 30) with the same tiered structure that is applicable seven (7) days a week.




New Ag Rate Options

Customers will transition to their new Ag rates based on their maximum demand (kW) and usage (kWh). Additionally, customers will have the option to choose the AG-F (Flexible Off Peak) rate. An illustration of this is below:

The AG-F rate (similar to previous AG-R rate) allows a customer to designate two "off peak" days of pumping:



Saturday and Sunday (69 hours of continuous off-peak pricing)



Monday and Friday (45 hours of continuous off-peak pricing, 2 times a week, 90 hours total)



AG-F "on peak" prices are modestly higher than the "on peak" prices of the other new Ag base rates.
