The title of the manuscript must be clear, concise, and aligned with the overall conference theme. The official language of the conference and presentations is English. The manuscript should be between 3,500–5,000 words, excluding the abstract and footnotes.

The first page must clearly mention:

- Title of the Manuscript
- Name(s) of the Author(s)
- Designation(s)
- Name of the Institution/University/Organization
- Email Address(es) & Contact Number(s)

Additional Guidelines

- The paper must have the following heads:
- Background
- Objectives
- Methodology
- Results
- Conclusion

The submission must be the original work of the author(s). The paper must not have been published or submitted elsewhere. Plagiarism must be less than 10%. The use of AI-generated content is strictly prohibited.

References must follow APA Style (7th edition). Co-authorship is permitted for up to two co-authors in addition to the main author.

- Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt
- Headings: 14 pt
- Line spacing: 1.5
- Alignment: Justified
- Margins: 1 inch on all sides
