1835-95

1838 The original precursor of The Times of India (TOI) is launched as The Bombay Times and Journal of Commerce.



1861 The paper acquires The Telegraph and Courier to form Bombay Times & Standard & is then renamed as The Times of India. A truly national platform is born.

1892 TJ Bennett partners with FM Coleman to form Bennett, Coleman & Co Ltd (BCCL).

1940-86

1946 Ramkrishna Dalmia buys BCCL & the paper passes from British to Indian hands.



1947 Launch of Hindi newspaper Navbharat Times & the Delhi edition of The Times of India



1952 Movie industry magazine Filmfare is launched.



1954 First edition of the iconic Filmfare Awards, to honour artistic & technical excellence in the Hindi-language film industry. These became an institution with the upgradation and broadcast of not just the national Filmfare Awards, but also their regional variants.

1955 Sahu Shanti Prasad Jain buys BCCL from his father-in-law Ramkrishna Dalmia.



1959 Femina, magazine for women, is launched.



1961 The Economic Times, No. 1 business newspaper in India, is launched.

1962 Marathi newspaper Maharashtra Times is launched.



1964 The first Miss India pageant is held. This became a pathbreaking platform for women's empowerment, especially when it was telecast across the country in later years.



1987



In 1987, a brand new era began with **Vineet Jain** joining the BCCL Group, transforming it from a newspaper and magazine company into one of the largest media and education conglomerates, with leadership across **Print, Radio, Digital, TV, and Out of Home Media.**

1988-2004

1990 Times School of Marketing is launched. It, along with Times' Media School (which was set up earlier), emerges as a major source of talent for the media industry.

1991 BBC features The Times of India among the world's six great newspapers.
BCCL ventures into TV programme production for Doordarshan under the brand Times TV.



1993 Vineet Jain launches India's first private FM radio entity under the brand name Times FM for FM radio programming on a single channel shared by many media companies.

1994 Vineet Jain conceives of and launches TOI's trailblazing entertainment and lifestyle supplements namely Bombay Times, Delhi Times, etc. They were the first of their kind in the world and became a template for others.

1996 Launch of economicstimes.com - ET's news website and timesofindia.com - TOI's news website- the Group's first foray into the Internet, as conceived of by Vineet Jain, followed by Indiatimes.com a year later.

1998 In a major initiative for a media company, the group launched Times Music which currently owns ~45,000 musical tracks across genres.



1999 Vineet Jain incorporated Times Internet Limited - India's biggest digital media entity.

2001 Radio Mirchi - Nationwide private FM broadcasting company is launched by Vineet Jain.



2004 Group enters TV broadcasting with the launch of Zoom, a Bollywood & Lifestyle channel.



2004 JV with BBC to form magazine publishing company Worldwide Media. Subsequently, the Times Group bought BBC's share to make WWM a wholly-owned company.

2005 Times OOH, the No.1 Out of Home advertising company in India, is established by Vineet Jain. The Times of India is acclaimed as world's No. 1 selling English daily broadsheet newspaper.



2006 Vineet Jain conceives of and launches leading property services entity Magicbricks.com
Launch of leading TV news channel Times Now.



2007 Launch of Jungle Music, a brand of Times Music dedicated to film music, with acquisition of music rights of Akshay Kumar starrer 'Welcome'.



2009 Launch of ET Now business news channel.



2010 Launch of English movie channels Movies Now & Remedy Now 3 years later.



2013 Vineet Jain conceives of and launches Times Pro, an award-winning EdTech initiative, for Indians who want to advance their careers; tie-ups with IITs/IIMs for executive education courses.




2014 Vineet Jain expands Times Group into film production and distribution with the launch of Jungle Pictures, whose first movie (Dil Dhadakne Do) was released in 2015. It has released 10 award-winning movies till 2024 including Talvar, Bareilly ki Barfi, Raazi, Badhaai Ho, Badhaai Do, Doctor G, etc.

The Centre for Disability Rights (CDR) at the School of Law, Bennett University is an academic, research, and policy-oriented initiative dedicated to advancing the rights, dignity, inclusion, and empowerment of persons with disabilities. Established with a commitment to fostering an inclusive and equitable society, the Centre seeks to promote critical engagement with disability rights through legal scholarship, policy discourse, advocacy, capacity building, and institutional reform. Guided by the constitutional values of equality, dignity, liberty, non-discrimination, and substantive justice, the Centre aims to contribute meaningfully to the ongoing transformation of disability discourse in India from a welfare-based approach to a rights-based framework.

The Centre draws intellectual inspiration from the Constitution of India, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), 2006, and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. It also engages with the evolving jurisprudence of Indian courts that have increasingly recognised accessibility, reasonable accommodation, autonomy, and equal participation as integral components of constitutional citizenship. Landmark judicial pronouncements such as *Jeeja Ghosh v. Union of India* (2016), *Vikash Kumar v. ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The discourse on disability in India has witnessed a profound transformation over the past few decades. Historically, disability was largely approached through a welfare and charity-oriented framework that viewed persons with disabilities as passive recipients of assistance and social support. While such approaches sought to address immediate needs, they often failed to recognize persons with disabilities as equal rights-bearing citizens entitled to dignity, autonomy, participation, and substantive equality. Contemporary disability jurisprudence has increasingly challenged these assumptions and has shifted the focus towards a rights-based paradigm that emphasizes inclusion, accessibility, reasonable accommodation, and equal opportunity.

This transformation has been significantly influenced by international and domestic legal developments. The adoption of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), 2006 marked a watershed moment in the global recognition of disability as a human rights issue. In India, the enactment of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 represented a major legislative advancement by expanding the scope of recognised disabilities and strengthening the framework for equality, accessibility, education, employment, and social participation. Judicial interventions have further reinforced this transition by interpreting constitutional guarantees in a manner that affirms the dignity, autonomy, and equal citizenship of persons with disabilities. Decisions such as *Jeeja Ghosh v. Union of India* (2016) and *Vikash Kumar v. UPSC* (2021) have underscored the importance of accessibility and reasonable accommodation as indispensable components of substantive equality.

Despite these progressive developments, substantial challenges continue to impede the realization of disability rights in practice. Persons with disabilities frequently encounter barriers in accessing education, employment, healthcare, transportation, digital technologies, public infrastructure, political participation, and the justice delivery system. Persistent social stigma, attitudinal barriers, institutional shortcomings, and inadequate implementation of legal obligations often prevent the effective enjoyment of rights guaranteed under law. These challenges are particularly acute for individuals situated at the intersection of disability with gender, caste, class, age, sexuality, and other forms of marginalization.

Against this backdrop, the International Conference on “From Welfare to Rights: Reimagining Disability Justice in India” seeks to provide a vibrant interdisciplinary platform for meaningful engagement on contemporary issues relating to disability rights, law, policy, governance, and social justice. The conference aims to bring together academics, researchers, legal practitioners, judges, policymakers, government officials, civil society organisations, disability rights advocates, students, and industry stakeholders from India and abroad to critically examine the evolving landscape of disability justice.

The conference intends to facilitate rigorous discussions on a wide range of issues, including constitutional rights, accessibility, reasonable accommodation, education, employment, access to justice, mental health, legal capacity, criminal justice, institutional accountability, and international developments in disability law. By encouraging dialogue across disciplines and professional backgrounds, the conference seeks to generate innovative ideas and practical solutions that can contribute to more inclusive legal and policy frameworks.

- The mode of submission of full paper shall be communicated via our official email with the participants whose abstracts shall be accepted.
- Co-authorship is allowed. (Maximum two authors.)
- Full Paper must contain a cover page inclusive of the following details: -

 - Designation, - Institutional affiliation,
 - Email ID, - Contact number(s) of the author(s) Authors are requested to adhere strictly to the following abstract formatting guidelines:
