

KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF 2024: TRANSFORMING HEALTHCARE IN UKRAINE THROUGH KNOWLEDGE, INNOVATION, AND GLOBAL COLLABORATION

1. National Recognition and Strategic Alliances



Partnership with the Ministry of Health of Ukraine

In 2024, GMKA signed a landmark memorandum of cooperation with the Ministry of Health of Ukraine. This partnership paves the way for collaborative educational initiatives with global experts, the expansion of leadership programs for women in medicine, and the widespread promotion of evidence-based medical practices. Together, we aim to strengthen the stability and effectiveness of Ukraine's healthcare system—one project, physician, and patient at a time.

Platinum Transparency 2024

GMKA was honored with the Platinum Seal from Candid, the

highest recognition for nonprofit transparency. This distinction reflects our commitment to accountability, responsible stewardship, and measurable impact as we work to improve patient outcomes and support the healthcare community in Ukraine.

2. Advancing Clinical Practice and Access to Global Standards



Deployed Medicine Guidelines Approved for National Use

To meet the urgent needs of physicians on the frontlines, GMKA translated key clinical trauma guidelines from the U.S. Department of Defense's Deployed Medicine platform into Ukrainian. On April 25, 2024, the Ministry of Health of Ukraine officially approved and endorsed these materials, making them accessible to both military and civilian medical professionals. The approved topics include essential protocols such as anesthesia in trauma patients, combat thoracic injuries, and management of highcomplexity amputations.



Ukrainian Edition of ATLS Published

In partnership with the American College of Surgeons, GMKA translated and published the 10th edition of the Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) manual. This vital resource, now freely accessible in Ukrainian, equips frontline providers with life-saving trauma care protocols and strengthens emergency care across the country.

3. Empowering Women Leaders in Medicine



Ukraine's First National Forum for Women in Medicine

In April 2024, GMKA hosted "Women in Medicine: Professional Development and Leadership," the first event of its kind in Ukraine. The forum gathered over 280 in-person participants, featured 40+ speakers, and engaged more than 1,300 attendees online. It created a platform for female physicians to connect, grow, and lead transformative change in healthcare. Discussions centered around leadership development, gender equity, healthcare reform, and strategies for balancing personal and professional growth in medicine.

4. Global Recognition for Innovation and Social Impact



HealUA Honored at Web Summit 2024

Our mobile application *HealUA*— which enables peer-to-peer clinical consultations between Ukrainian and international physicians—was recognized as one of the top global healthcare innovations. Out of 2,500 startups, HealUA was selected as part of the exclusive **Startup Alpha** and awarded the **Impact Startup** title for its role in strengthening medical decision-making and saving lives in war-affected areas.



World Cancer Congress Presentation

GMKA presented its findings on cancer care continuity during wartime at the 2024 World Cancer Congress in Geneva. The presentation spotlighted medical evacuation pathways, access barriers for cancer patients, and the urgent need for international collaboration in maintaining oncology care during conflict.



European Cancer Summit Recognition

Our project "Supporting Women in Oncology in Ukraine" received a grant from the European Cancer Community Foundation and was featured at the European Cancer Summit. This initiative addresses burnout and mental health challenges among female oncologists and focuses on creating supportive, sustainable career environments for women working on the frontlines of oncology in Ukraine.

5. Representing Ukraine in Global Scientific Forums




American College of Surgeons Clinical Congress

At one of the world's largest surgical conferences, the GMKA team presented six original research projects focused on cancer care, wartime medical delivery, and healthcare system adaptation in Ukraine.



ASCRS Annual Scientific Meeting

Dr. Nelya Melnitchouk delivered a powerful presentation on the realities of cancer care in wartime Ukraine. GMKA team member Marta Antoniv presented a research poster based on a national survey of family physicians, exploring barriers to colorectal cancer screening.



21st SBMT World Congress on Brain Mapping and Therapeutics

GMKA played a prominent role at the 2024 SBMT Congress. Ali Dzhemiliev presented how the HealUA app supports remote neurosurgical consultations in conflict zones. Kateryna Potapova co-organized the SBMT Humanitarian Aid Project, chaired the Military Medicine section, and participated in a panel with Deputy Minister of Defense Natalia Kalmykova on wartime healthcare delivery and education in Ukraine.

6. Building a New Era of Medical Education in Ukraine



Fall School of Medical Education

GMKA leaders—Inesa Huivaniuk, Ivan Hornik, and Taras Ivanykovych participated in the Fall School of Medical Education 2024, a national platform for policy makers and academic leaders. They shared the success of GMKA's online course "Physician-Patient Communication" and our ongoing webinar series "MedOsvita: Path to Change", which support clinical and interpersonal skill development across Ukraine.



OncoHUB UpToDate 5.0 Congress

GMKA helped organize the fifth annual UpToDate oncology congress, bringing together top experts to discuss advancements in cancer diagnostics and treatment. Our team—Inesa Huivaniuk, Kateryna Potapova, and Viacheslav Kopetskyi—moderated sessions and led discussions on oncology care transformation and education.

The GMKA Educational Platform is a comprehensive, open-access initiative created to advance the professional development of Ukrainian physicians. By offering high-quality, evidence-based medical resources in Ukrainian, the platform empowers healthcare providers to stay up to date with the latest clinical standards and apply them directly to daily practice.



KEY COMPONENTS OF THE PLATFORM



EDUCATIONAL ARTICLES

We publish articles from leading clinical experts, featuring practical materials, summaries of scientific publications, and updates on clinical practice—all translated into Ukrainian. By the end of 2024, the platform hosted over 500 educational articles, including key resources such as the Ukrainian translation of the ATLS textbook, Deployed Medicine guidelines, and Quality Improvement (QI) algorithms, all available for download and use in clinical settings.



VIDEO TRAININGS

Our platform offers professionally produced video lectures and demonstrations of medical techniques by global experts. These materials are free and easily accessible, allowing physicians to learn at their own pace. One of our flagship video courses, "Principles of Surgery"—featuring instructors from world-renowned institutions—has been viewed more than 8,000 times.



COURSES AND EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

We provide specialty-specific courses in oncology, trauma, surgery, neurology, and more, with certification upon completion. GMKA is an official provider of Ukrainian equivalents of Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits, ensuring that our offerings meet international standards for professional development.



PODCASTS

Our podcast series features interviews with medical experts, physicians, patients, and community leaders. These engaging discussions cover practical advice and explore pressing healthcare issues. Podcasts are designed to be accessible to both physicians and patients, helping bridge the gap between clinical expertise and public understanding.



WEBINARS

GMKA webinars offer interactive learning experiences where participants can engage directly with speakers, ask questions, and join live discussions. This format encourages dialogue and peer learning while addressing relevant and timely topics in healthcare.

HEALUA: ACCELERATING CLINICAL COLLABORATION IN TIMES OF CRISIS



HealUA is an innovative mobile application developed by GMKA to support rapid, secure, and expert collaboration between Ukrainian and international physicians. Born out of urgent need during the full-scale invasion of Ukraine, the platform addresses the new realities of wartime medicine—where evolving patterns of injury and disease, combined with limited access to information, create immense pressure on healthcare providers.

HealUA allows physicians to quickly and effortlessly seek second opinions, consult colleagues across specialties, and receive real-time recommendations on complex cases. This tool directly enhances the quality of care provided to both military and civilian patients, even in the most resource-constrained and high-stress environments.

Today, HealUA connects a global network of over **4,500 physicians** across **39 specialties** from Ukraine, the U.S., Poland, Germany, and 27 other countries. More than 5,000 comments have been exchanged within the app, fostering collaboration and peer-to-peer learning across borders. Communication is available in both Ukrainian and English via secure **text messages and video calls**, ensuring accessibility for all users.

In 2024, **HealUA was internationally** recognized at Web Summit, one of the world's premier technology conferences. Selected from over 70,000 applicants to join the prestigious **Startup Alpha** program, HealUA was awarded the **Impact Startup Award**—a testament to its global significance and transformative role in wartime healthcare delivery.

INTERNATIONAL CLINICAL OBSERVERSHIPS

GMKA supports Ukrainian physicians and medical students in gaining international clinical experience through fully sponsored observerships at some of the world's most prestigious medical institutions. These observerships, lasting from 1 to 3 months, provide participants with immersive exposure to evidence-based diagnostic and treatment practices, the opportunity to acquire valuable clinical insights, and access to advanced research projects.

Participants engage directly with global leaders in medicine, learning firsthand about cutting-edge approaches to care while building lasting professional connections. This initiative is designed to foster knowledge exchange, enhance clinical competencies, and strengthen Ukraine's medical workforce in the long term.

In 2024, 55 Ukrainian physicians representing 15 medical specialties completed observerships abroad. The program brought together more than 80 mentors from internationally renowned institutions, who generously shared their expertise to support the next generation of Ukrainian healthcare leaders.

This initiative continues to open doors for Ukrainian physicians, equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and networks to improve patient care and contribute to the future of medicine in Ukraine.

WOMEN IN MEDICINE: EMPOWERING LEADERSHIP, ADVANCING EQUITY

Women in Medicine is a flagship initiative by GMKA, created by and for women physicians to promote professional growth, mentorship, leadership, and solidarity across specialties. Launched in response to persistent gender disparities in healthcare, the program provides a supportive space for women to connect, learn, lead, and advocate for systemic change in medicine and medical education.

In 2024, the Women in Medicine community grew to nearly **2,000 participants** across platforms including Instagram, Facebook, and Telegram. The initiative delivered a robust calendar of activities, including:

- 1 national research study on gender equity in Ukrainian medicine
- 9 educational webinars with expert speakers
- 12 Medical English Speaking Club sessions, supporting language and leadership skills
- Regular publications of evidencebased articles for physicians on the GMKA platform

A National Milestone: Forum for Women in Medicine

On **November 15–16, 2024**, GMKA hosted Ukraine's first national forum on women's leadership in healthcare:

"Women in Medicine: Professional Development and Leadership."

The event, co-organized with the American-Ukrainian charity foundation *Razom for Ukraine*, brought together over **280 in-person attendees**, **50 virtual participants**, and **40+ expert** speakers. The forum focused on empowering women leaders, building managerial competencies, supporting personal and professional development, and tackling gender inequality in healthcare and medical education.

- Ulana Suprun, physician, reformer, and former Acting Minister of Health of Ukraine
- Inna Sovsun, political leader and former Deputy Minister of Education and Science

- Vasyl Strilka, Director of High-Tech Medical Care and Innovation, Ministry of Health

This landmark event not only amplified the voices of women physicians but also launched a broader conversation on inclusion, reform, and leadership in Ukraine's healthcare system.

The Women in Medicine program continues to build momentum—strengthening the role of women in shaping the future of Ukrainian healthcare.

Recognition and Collaboration

In 2024, the Women in Medicine initiative received a grant from The Network of Hubs of Ukraine under the program "Grants for Inexperienced Civil Organizations and Initiative Groups." GMKA also began an important new partnership with UNFPA Ukraine, laying the groundwork for future collaborative projects focused on gender equity, health, and leadership.

RESEARCH AND ANALYTICS: DRIVING EVIDENCE-BASED CHANGE IN UKRAINIAN HEALTHCARE

At GMKA, research is not just a tool—it's a catalyst for systemic improvement. Our **Research** and **Analytics** initiative evaluates emerging needs in healthcare and develops data-driven recommendations to strengthen medical education, clinical practice, and policy in Ukraine. We are committed to building Ukraine's academic potential by actively engaging physicians, researchers, and medical students in impactful, real-world research.

Key Research Highlights from 2024

National Study on Gender Equity in Surgery

In 2024, GMKA conducted a groundbreaking nationwide study titled:

"Women in Surgery: The Problem Does (Not) Exist?"

Surveying **340 female surgeons** across specialties, the study exposed significant gender-based challenges faced by women at every stage of their careers—from education to employment and workplace dynamics. Alarmingly, **80% of respondents**

reported being told they "do not belong in surgery" solely due to their gender. These findings have sparked national dialogue and underscore the urgent need for gender equity in Ukrainian surgical training and leadership. The full study is available on the GMKA website.

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT OF MEDICAL CARE: RAISING THE STANDARD, ONE LIFE AT A TIME

The Quality Improvement (QI) of Medical Care project is designed for Ukrainian physicians who are committed to transforming healthcare from within. This initiative focuses on advancing clinical care through data-driven decision-making, the implementation of internationally recognized standards, and a structured, systematic approach to improving patient outcomes.

Our strategy includes:

- In-depth data collection and analysis
- Integration of international clinical care guidelines
- Development of process algorithms and standard surgical protocols
- Education and training for medical staff
- Implementation of evidencebased practices to enhance communication and care delivery
- Strategic approaches to reduce medical errors and optimize resource utilization

The goal is to ensure that Ukrainian healthcare is not only resilient under pressure, but continuously evolving toward safer, more effective, and more efficient care for all patients.

2024 Achievements and Partnerships

In 2024, three regional medical institutions joined the QI initiative:

- Kyiv Regional Oncology Center
- Mykolaiv Regional Oncology Center
- Rivne Regional Clinical Hospital

Together, we developed and launched a centralized database to monitor and analyze infectious complications among surgical patients, enabling data-informed planning and targeted development of educational materials for clinical teams.

Through these partnerships, Ukrainian physicians gain access to the world's best practices in quality improvement and patient safety, empowering them to lead meaningful, lasting change in their institutions and beyond.

WEBINAR SERIES: MEDOSVITA (MEDICAL SCHOOL EDUCATION) — PATH TO CHANGES

The MedOsvita: Path to Changes webinar series is a GMKA initiative designed to spark meaningful dialogue and drive reform in Ukraine's medical education system. Amid the ongoing war and significant challenges facing the healthcare sector, this project brings together physicians, educators, policymakers, students, and public leaders to explore bold ideas for transforming both undergraduate and continuing medical education.

The goal is clear: to build a modern, transparent, and effective system for training and supporting medical professionals in Ukraine. These webinars serve as a platform for honest conversation, expert insight, and collaborative solution-building—focusing on professional development, system reform, and lifelong learning.

In 2024, GMKA hosted **8 webinars** in the series, attracting over **3,000 registrations** and **4,500+ views** on YouTube. Each session featured prominent voices in medicine, education, and policy, offering diverse perspectives and actionable recommendations.

Through this initiative, we work to counter medical myths and promote a culture of informed health choices in Ukraine. We collaborate with physicians, scientists, and patient organizations to develop high-quality educational content that is grounded in global clinical standards and tailored to the realities of Ukrainian healthcare.

Our materials are created in multiple formats to ensure wide accessibility—articles, flyers, videos, podcasts, courses, and even scientific

research studies in collaboration with patient organizations. Each resource is designed to be practical, understandable, and impactful.

2024 Highlights:

MEDICAL ENGLISH: EXPANDING GLOBAL COMMUNICATION FOR UKRAINIAN PHYSICIANS AND NURSES

In today's global medical landscape, **English proficiency** is not just a skill—it's a gateway to opportunity. From attending and presenting at international conferences to participating in clinical exchanges and accessing cutting-edge research, fluency in Medical English is essential for professional growth.

The GMKA Medical English program offers Ukrainian physicians a welcoming, supportive space to develop their language skills and expand their medical vocabulary. Through biweekly virtual sessions led by experienced instructors, participants from across Ukraine engage in dynamic conversations, professional development activities, and collaborative learning.

In 2024, the program included:

- Two targeted groups:
 - A general Medical English group for physicians and nurses across all specialties

- A dedicated group for women physicians as part of the Women in Medicine initiative
- 60-minute sessions, held every two weeks over two-month cycles
- 148 physicians trained over an 8-month period, building confidence, fluency, and community

In addition to live classes, GMKA provides daily self-study materials across its digital platforms—supporting continuous learning for busy physicians. Our Telegram channel "Learn Medical English with GMKA" features engaging idioms, useful phrases, humorous videos, and practical vocabulary-building tips. In just 10 months, the channel attracted over 1,500 learners.

AID FOR UKRAINE: DELIVERING CRITICAL MEDICAL SUPPORT IN TIMES OF WAR

Ensuring the uninterrupted functioning of Ukraine's healthcare system during wartime remains a priority for GMKA. As medical professionals work under extreme conditions—often near the frontlines—our mission is to provide the tools, equipment, and support they need to continue saving lives.

Through the **Aid for Ukraine** initiative, GMKA delivers critical medical aid to healthcare facilities treating those injured by Russia's full-scale invasion. We work directly with hospitals and frontline responders to address urgent needs, offering life-saving resources and logistical coordination to ensure timely, secure delivery.

Thanks to the generosity of our international partners—including Heal Ukraine Group, Lake Country Medical Aid for Ukraine, and Aid Pioneers—we've been able to source and distribute essential medical resources to institutions across the country.



What We've Delivered in 2024:

- Over 25,000 items of humanitarian aid (non-financial support) from U.S. hospitals
- 3,000+ units of medical equipment and surgical supplies, including:
 - Portable ultrasound machines
 - Negative Pressure Wound Therapy (NPWT) devices
 - Evacuation squad equipment
 - Bleeding control kits
 - Essential medications and consumables
- Support coordinated with 10+ partner medical institutions across various regions

GMKA ensures all aid deliveries are managed through a **trusted logistics network**, and we maintain **transparent reporting** to our donors and partners.

This initiative reflects our unwavering commitment to stand with Ukraine's medical community—supporting those who risk their lives to care for others, and ensuring patients receive the care they deserve, even in the most difficult conditions.

GMKA PODCASTS: TRUSTED VOICES IN UKRAINIAN HEALTHCARE

In a time when misinformation spreads quickly and patients and physicians alike seek trustworthy information, **GMKA Podcasts** serve as a reliable, accessible, and engaging source of medical knowledge. This initiative bridges the gap between expert insight and everyday health concerns—presenting evidence-based content in a conversational, user-friendly format.

Each episode features thoughtful dialogue with physicians, researchers, and patient advocates, covering a wide range of relevant topics. The goal is to inform, inspire, and support both the medical

community and the public—by highlighting real experiences, expert recommendations, and emerging challenges in healthcare.

VIRTUAL TRAINING: PRINCIPLES OF SURGERY — ADVANCING SURGICAL EDUCATION IN UKRAINE

The "Principles of Surgery" online training was created by GMKA to support the professional development of Ukrainian surgeons and surgical residents amid wartime challenges. Developed in alignment with the USA surgical residency curriculum, the course provided a structured and high-quality educational experience tailored to Ukraine's evolving clinical landscape.

Running from **September 2023 to June 2024**, this one-year program focused on core surgical principles while fostering global peer-to-peer learning and expert engagement.

Course Highlights:

- Curriculum Structure:
 - 2 semesters: 15 lectures (Fall) +23 lectures (Spring)
 - ➤ 38 total online sessions, all available via open access on GMKA's YouTube channel

Core surgical topics, evidencebased practices, and interactive case discussions with renowned international experts

Lectures were delivered by leading surgeons from the USA, Italy, Poland, and Ukraine, including experts from Brigham and Women's Hospital and Massachusetts General Hospital

Participation & Recognition:

- 42 surgeons from 16 Ukrainian cities participated
- To receive certification, participants were required to maintain over 75% attendance and achieve 80% or higher on assessments
- Graduates received an Electronic Certificate of Completion and +40 Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits

Awards for Top Participants:

- 1st Place: Observership at a U.S. hospital
- 2nd & 3rd Place: Participation in an advanced three-day surgical course in Romania

This initiative not only delivered advanced knowledge but also connected Ukrainian surgeons with a global surgical community, fostering academic exchange and elevating standards of care in Ukraine. GMKA remains committed to developing and expanding high-impact educational opportunities for medical professionals on the frontlines of healthcare transformation.

ONCOLOGY THINK TANK: ADVANCING CANCER CARE IN UKRAINE

The Oncology Think Tank is a strategic initiative by GMKA that brings together a diverse coalition of leading oncologists, government officials, scientists, patient advocates, and cancer survivors to address Ukraine's most urgent oncological challenges. In a country deeply affected by war, where healthcare infrastructure is under constant strain, this initiative plays a critical role in shaping the future of cancer care.

The goal of the Oncology Think Tank is clear: to improve cancer prevention, early detection, treatment, and survivorship—while ensuring that patients across Ukraine, including those in frontline and de-occupied areas, have equitable access to high-quality care.

This expert-driven platform actively supports the integration of evidence-based clinical oncology practices into Ukraine's national healthcare strategy. By aligning with the Ministry of Health of Ukraine, the Oncology Think Tank helps to prioritize cancer care within national reform efforts.

Key Objectives:

- Develop data-informed strategies to improve cancer outcomes in Ukraine
- Facilitate access to worldclass diagnostic and treatment protocols
- Ensure equitable cancer care for vulnerable populations, including those affected by displacement and war
- Strengthen the role of oncology in healthcare policy and system-wide planning
- Support the adaptation and implementation of global standards in Ukrainian oncology practice

The Think Tank's analytical team meets regularly to identify gaps, propose reforms, and provide actionable recommendations—bridging local expertise with international best practices. Together, we are working to raise survival rates, enhance the quality of life for cancer patients, and build a resilient, patient-centered oncology system for the future of Ukraine.














































In 2025, Global Medical Knowledge Alliance (GMKA) will continue its mission to strengthen Ukraine's healthcare system by providing high-quality, accessible educational opportunities for physicians, nurses, and healthcare professionals across the country. Our focus will remain on empowering Ukraine's medical workforce, building professional communities, and popularizing evidence-based medicine—essential pillars for a resilient and modern healthcare system.
