A comma is a mark that is used to separate words. Commas separate words in lists. Look at the commas in the sentences below.

Prem, Ali, Lucy, Sam, Jack and Aron are in my class. (with commas)

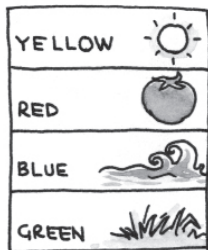
