
Let's Get Dressed!








Rainbow, Rainbow

We see lots of different objects when we are out and about on a busy day. Can you find and circle these objects in the scene below?



Who's Who?


Do you know these animals? Follow the dots to connect each word to the matching animal. Which one is your favorite?
















Can you name these objects? You use some of them every day. Cut out the flash cards for a fun game of what's what!
