# Snowflakes

Do you want to build a snowman? How about some smiley snowmen faces? These symmetrical snowflake designs are snowgies—the tiny, mischievous snowmen that appear when an unwell Elsa sneezes.

## You will need:

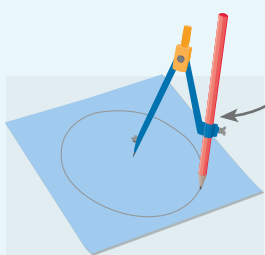
- Tracing paper
- White paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Thin white thread
- Clear tape
- Hole punch

## Fold and cut

Each snowflake is made from just one sheet of plain white paper and a templated segment of a Snowgie. No sneezing required!

**TOP TIP**  
Keep the layers of folded paper tightly together while you're cutting.

You could use a pair of compasses.

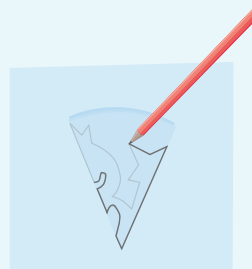


- 1** Draw a circle 4¼ in (12 cm) in diameter.

Make sure that your folds line up neatly.

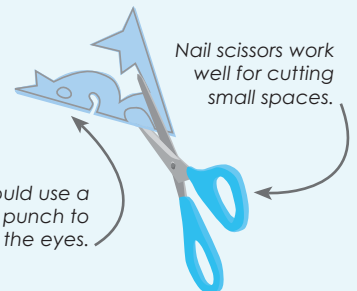


- 2** Fold the circle into quarters, and then half again, with firm, straight creases.



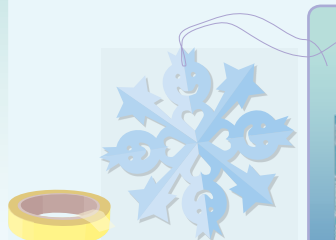
- 3** Trace the template on page 197 onto the top segment of your circle.

Nail scissors work well for cutting small spaces.



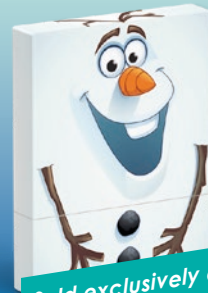
You could use a hole punch to cut out the eyes.

- 4** Carefully cut out the pattern. Because the paper is folded, you will cut through all parts at once.



- 5** Unfold your snowflake, being careful not to tear it. If you would like to hang it, tape some fine thread onto the back.
