



# DISCOVER AND CELEBRATE THE 62 USA NATIONAL PARKS

## What parks have you visited?



### 1 Yellowstone

Cushing geysers, geothermal wonders, and stunning Rocky Mountain landscape.

### 2 Yosemite

Looming mountains, riotous meadows, pure lakes and rushing waterfalls, and, of course, giant sequoias.

### 3 Sequoia

A colossal adventure land, preserving the earth's largest living trees, towering granite peaks, and alluring lakes.

### 4 Mount Rainier

Breathtaking scenery, abundant wildlife, and historic inn, named for the area's active volcano.

### 5 Crater Lake

Oregon's only national park, famous for the startling color and clarity of its lake, surrounded by beautiful forestland.

### 6 Wind Cave

One of the world's longest cave systems deep inside the earth, with the grassy Black Hills aboveground.

### 7 Mesa Verde

A magnificent and mysterious archaeological wonder, with ancient Puebloan dwellings etched into the park's looming cliffsides.

### 8 Glacier

Montana's fearsomely beautiful park is home to grand glaciers, magnificent wildlife, and turquoise lakes.

### 9 Rocky Mountain

The best of the Rockies, with lakes and forests, glaciers and tundra, and a wealth of wildlife.

### 10 Lassen Volcanic

Belching steam vents, bubbling mudpots, and scalding hot springs erupt in a primeval roar.

### 11 Hawai'i Volcanoes

Active volcanoes give an edge to the thrill at this park's epic landscapes.

### 12 Denali

A land of tundra, cloud-piercing mountains, and wilderness like no other in Alaska.

### 13 Grand Canyon

Arizona's vast, river-carved landscape of battered buttes, rugged pinnacles, and incredible vistas.

### 14 Zion

A magical and majestic wonderland cut from sandstone and sky, with towering walls, impossibly tight canyons, and endless adventures.

### 15 Acadia

Coastal Maine's romantic and charming natural oasis, with serene lakes, granite mountains, hardwood forests, and dramatic beaches.

### 16 Hot Springs

Sophisticated spa city in a tiny pocket of Arkansas, entirely different from most parks with sprawling natural landscapes.

### 17 Bryce Canyon

Home to the deepest canyon in the U.S., color-splashed alpine meadows, fast-flowing rivers, and vast groves of giant sequoias.

### 18 Grand Teton

Jagged, unforgettable Rocky Mountain peaks rise regally above the Wyoming landscape.

### 19 Carlsbad

Awe-inspiring underground rock formations, created over hundreds of thousands of years, protect one of the largest cave systems in the world.

### 20 Great Smoky Mountains

Mysteriously misty mountains, verdant forests, and incomparable hiking, at the U.S.'s most visited national park.

### 21 Shenandoah

Simple but overwhelming Virginia beauty, with its dense woods, rolling valleys, and gentle mountains.

### 22 Olympic

Stunning scenery with impressive breadth: beaches, glaciated mountains, crystal lakes, and bucolic woodland trails.

### 23 Kings Canyon

An impressive collection of limestone spires, slot canyons, and geological oddities.

### 24 Isle Royale

Lake Superior's pristine island cradles untouched wilderness, where wolves and moose find refuge in boreal forests.

### 25 Mammoth Cave

A subterranean underworld thrives among delicate blossoms of alienlike formations that fill this massive underground cave system.

### 26 Big Bend

Bright desert day fades to an expansive starry night, and dusty roads lead to a wilderness bisected by the mighty Rio Grande.

### 27 Everglades

Expanse of wetland dotted with tree islands, showcasing a peculiar beauty and prolific wildlife.

### 28 Virgin Islands

Teal-blue waters dotted with vibrant coral reefs lap against powdery beaches, while farther inland, lush rain forests flourish under the tropical sun.

### 29 Haleakalā

Awe-inspiring volcanic craters on the Hawaiian island of Maui, a primitive, breathtaking landscape.

### 30 Petrified Forest

Badlands of the Painted Desert in the north, and gnarled trees-turned-stone lie amid gnawed hills and hoodoos in the south.

### 31 Canyonlands

Vast, rugged wilderness carved out by two mighty rivers, featuring dramatic desert landscapes and blissful solitude.

### 32 North Cascades

Untouched wilderness within Washington, home to the most glaciers and biodiversity in any park.

### 33 Redwood

Majestic giant redwood trees, some of the oldest and biggest trees on Earth, inspire respect and awe.

### 34 Capitol Reef

Giant domes, rainbow-colored cliffs and buttes, remarkable geologic features, and spectacular desert solitude in a remote Utah wonderland.

### 35 Arches

Otherworldly rock formations and brilliant hues of the landscape make this park a photographer's dream.

### 36 Guadalupe Mountains

A kaleidoscope of prehistoric relics provides insight into early human life.

### 37 Voyageurs

Hidden pockets of wilderness, calm, reflective waters, and statuesque outcrops of the oldest rock on Earth.

### 38 Theodore Roosevelt

Microclimates from dry slopes to wet woodlands house some of Earth's greatest natural treasures.

### 39 Badlands

Vast expanse of weathered rock canyons, striking sawtooth ridges, and surrounding prairie lands.

### 40 Channel Islands

California's answer to the Galápagos, inhabited by a staggering number of unique plants and animals living in a verdant playground.

### 41 Biscayne

Sublime waters of Biscayne Bay, a time capsule full of secrets of a rich, sometimes dark past.

### 42 Katmai

Remote park on the Alaskan Peninsula, where hulking brown bears converge annually to feast on the running salmon.

### 43 Glacier Bay

Cliff faces of sheer ice rise from a crystal-blue sea, set against an uninterrupted backdrop of wild and unspoiled nature.

### 44 Gates of the Arctic

For raw, remote wilderness, nothing beats this park—no roads, no trails, no permanent population.

### 45 Kenai Fjords

A Tolkien-like land of deep, narrow fjords, crashing glaciers, teeming wildlife, and adventures aplenty.

### 46 Kobuk Valley

Each spring and fall, thousands of caribou pass through the park in an epic land-mammal migration.

### 47 Lake Clark

Astounding grandeur and remoteness, showcasing Alaska's wildest, untamed, and uncharted territory.

### 48 Wrangell-St. Elias

Bigger than Yellowstone, Yosemite, and the state of Maryland combined, this is the nation's largest national park.

### 49 Great Basin

Nevada's wild jewel, with fantastic underground caves and savage wilderness aboveground.

### 50 National Park of American Samoa

Samoan culture and natural treasures converge in the heart of the Pacific Ocean.

### 51 Dry Tortugas

Seven small islands teeming with coral reefs, marine life, and the magnificent, historic Fort Jefferson.

### 52 Death Valley

Geologic drama, radiant textures, and soothing solitude amid a scenic swath of the untamed West.

### 53 Saguaro

Giant, multi-armed saguaro cactus—a symbol of the Old West—cover this sprawling park.

### 54 Joshua Tree

Botanical marvel featuring whimsical cactus gardens, boulder-strewn canyons, and starry night skies.

### 55 Black Canyon

A startlingly deep chasm cut with knifelike precision into the land, one of the sheerest, narrowest gorges on the continent.

### 56 Cuyahoga Valley

Rich in history and culture, this undeveloped landscape offers adventure and seasonal beauty any time of year.

### 57 Congaree

A sensory delight, filled with glorious trails through ancient floodplain and forest.

### 58 Great Sand Dunes

Giant sand dune with a steep mountain backdrop—equal parts baffling and beautiful.

### 59 Pinnacles

California condors soar around volcanic outcroppings, trademark cliffs and above hidden talus caves.

### 60 Gateway Arch

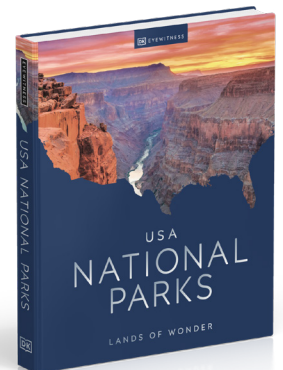
Elegant, silver-steel Gateway Arch is a gleaming memorial to the westward expansion of the United States.

### 61 Indiana Dunes

An amazingly rich natural world where grasses grow from ancient sand and into the sky in this biodiverse park.

America's youngest national park, a rolling sea of white spreads across the New Mexico desert.
