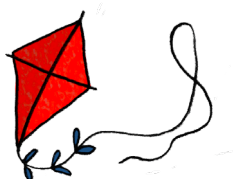


Explore the Outdoors

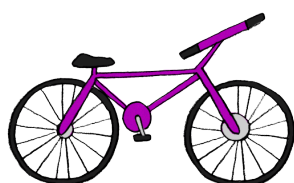
