



SLEIGH DELIVERY SPRINT



It's better to give than to receive in this super speedy sleigh race! Be the first to stop at each house along the route and help Santa to make it home in time for hot cocoa and a festive sing-along.

How to play

1 Players take it in turns to spin and move forwards across the gameboard.

2 Spin the exact number of moves it takes to reach the 2x2 tile in front of the next house. It may take a few tries to get it right!

3 The first player to reach the last house first wins.

GO, GO, GO!



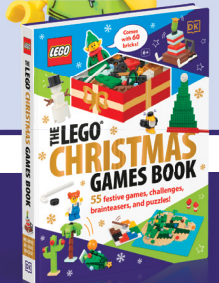
TRY THIS

Instead of Santa, build other microfigures to drive the miniature sleighs on your gameboard. Choose a snazzy snowperson, a regal royal, a fanciful fairy, or anything you like!

Plate connects sections of the board and looks like a snowbank

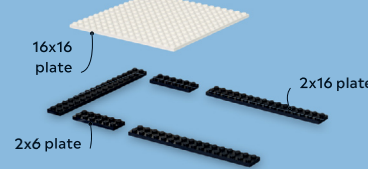
Base of the house is a 2x2 container box

ONLY TWO HOUSES LEFT!

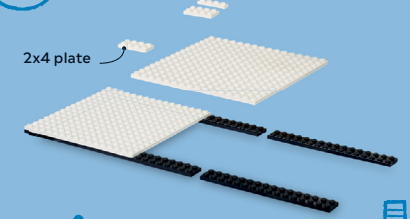


How to build

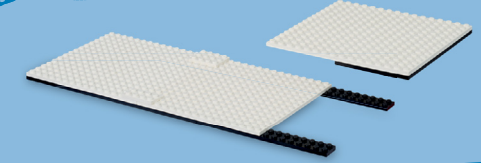
1 Attach plates that are two studs wide to the bottom of a 16x16 plate.



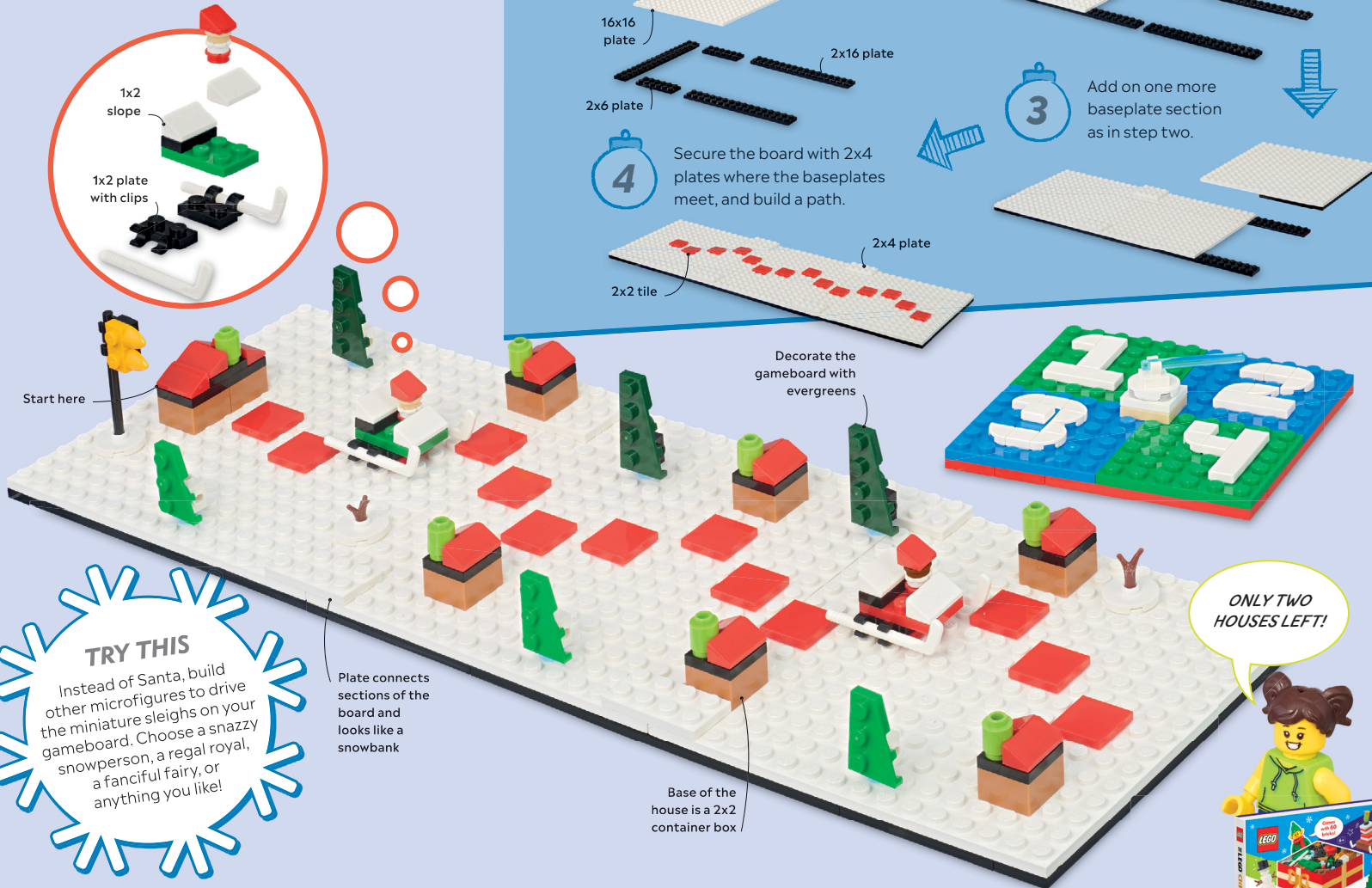
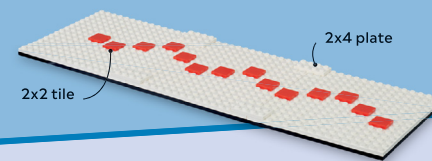
2 Extend the plates that are two studs wide and add another baseplate on top.



3 Add on one more baseplate section as in step two.



4 Secure the board with 2x4 plates where the baseplates meet, and build a path.

IT'S TOY BUILDING TIME!



1x1 double curved slope for teddy arms

2x2 round jumper plate wheels

1x1 tile with clip looks like bear ears

Slope looks like the side of a video game controller

TRY THIS
Make room for more players by writing lists of five items for each person to build. Compare your scores at the end of every round to declare the Expert Toy Builder!

How to play

1 Write a list of five mini toy models to build.

2 Put out a pile of LEGO bricks and set a timer for 10 minutes.

3 Try to build everything on the list before 10 minutes is up!

Keep score

- 1 model = Good effort
- 2 models = Nice work
- 3 models = Pat your "elf" on the back
- 4 models = So close!
- 5 models = Expert Toy Builder



HOLIDAY TREE HIDE-AND-SEEK



Relish the challenge in this tree-mendously fun scavenger hunt! Will you be the first to spot this silly brick-built ornament or will you find yourself in a pickle? Stay as cool as a cucumber and you're sure to win.

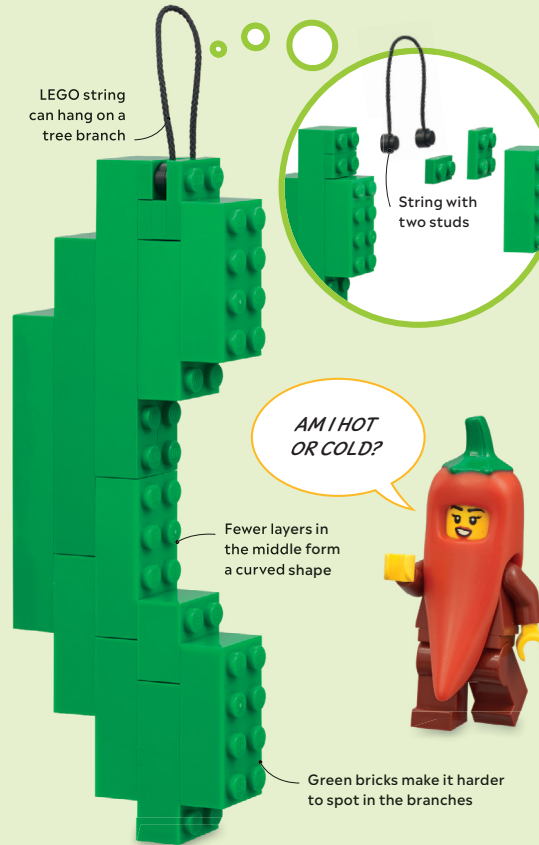
How to play

1 One player hides the brick-built pickle decoration on a plant or holiday tree.

2 Other players try to be the first to spot the ornament.

3 The hider can give "hot" and "cold" clues. (Hot for when searchers are near the model and cold when they are far.)

4 Whoever finds the pickle hides it next.



LEGO string can hang on a tree branch

String with two studs

AM I HOT OR COLD?

Fewer layers in the middle form a curved shape

Green bricks make it harder to spot in the branches

BUILD TIP

Keep your hanging loop secure by sandwiching the string with studs between layers of bricks or plates. This will stop the string from slipping off the model when you hang it.

THE GREAT STOCKING STUFF



Fill the room with laughter as you stuff a brick-built stocking with as many mini presents as you can. All you need is your LEGO collection and some friends to build and play with.

BUILD TIP

Make sure that each of your mini models can be placed inside the stocking. Building with 1x1 and 2x2 pieces will help to keep your mini present builds small enough to fit.

Choose a topper to set your builds apart



Dome looks like a jingly bell

Build the stocking with a partner

How to play

1 Take as long as you need to build a stocking that you can fill with mini presents.

2 Each player gets a pile of bricks and has to build as many mini gifts as possible.

3 Use all the bricks. The player who fills the stocking with the most gifts wins.

This simple gift is made up of just three pieces

WISH LIST QUEST

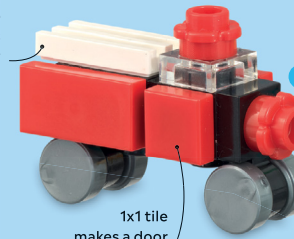


Can you figure out what's on another player's Christmas wish list? You have just 20 chances to find out whether you can guess correctly. Choose your questions carefully and get asking!

TRY THIS

Before you ask your questions, think about how well you know the person who has built the model. You might already have a good idea of what's on their wish list.

1x2 grille tile for the fire truck's ladder



1x1 tile makes a door

1x1 plate with ring



1x1 brick with side studs

1x2 inverted slope



WHAT COLOUR IS IT?



Upside-down 1x1 round plate with petals

How to play

1 One player builds a mini model of something on their Christmas list and hides it under a hat or tea towel.

2 The other players can ask 20 questions about the build to figure out what it is. (No one can ask "What is it?")

3 Players take it in turns to guess what the model is. The builder reveals the model if someone guesses correctly or when the players are out of chances.



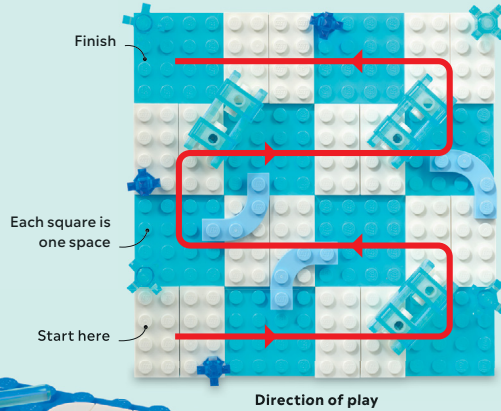

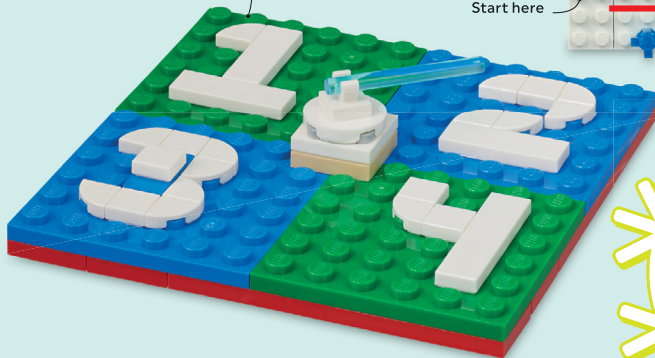
ICE SLIDES AND LADDERS



Depending on where you land in this best-loved game, which is based on snakes and ladders, you could be going up or down in a hurry. Who will reach the finish?



Build a spinner (see page 10) or use one from another game you have



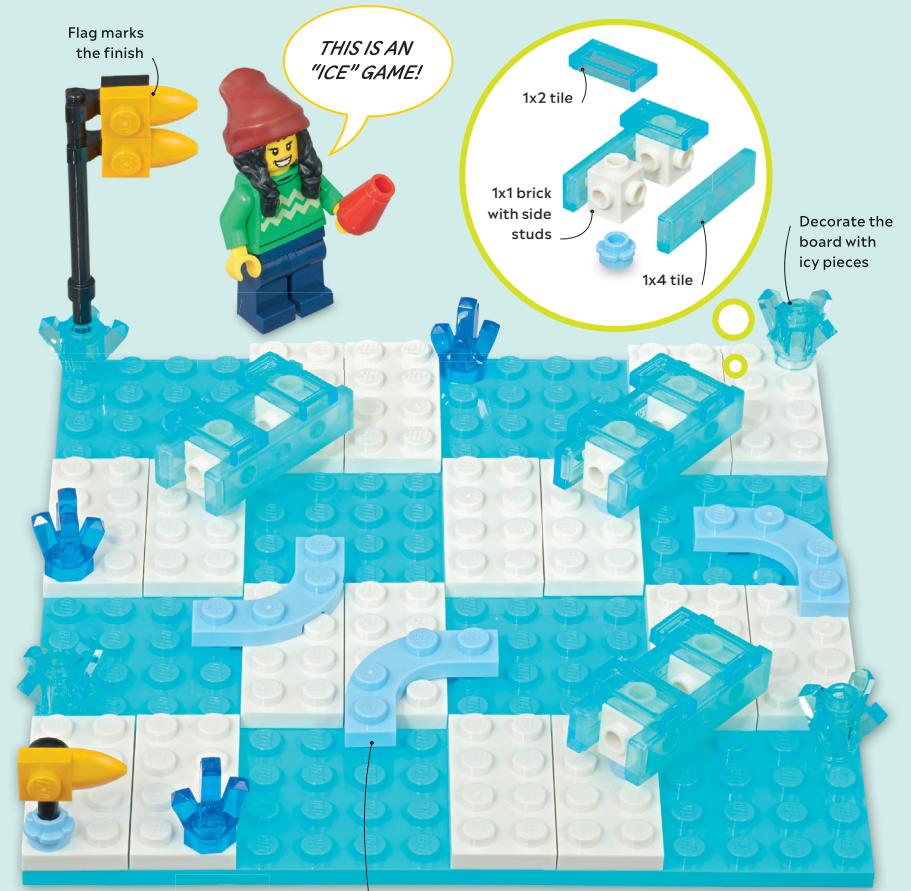
BUILD TIP
Use 2x4 plates to create squares on the board. Two 2x4 plates make one square. Leave a 4x4 space on the baseplate. Then add two more 2x4 plates to make another square.

How to play

- 1 Build a gameboard with 16 squares and as many ice slides and ladders as you like.
- 2 Players take it in turns to spin and move their counters around the board.
- 3 Players that land on a ladder can "climb up" to the space where it ends. Follow slides downwards.
- 4 The first player to make it to the finish wins the game!

HOLIDAY TRAIN RIDE



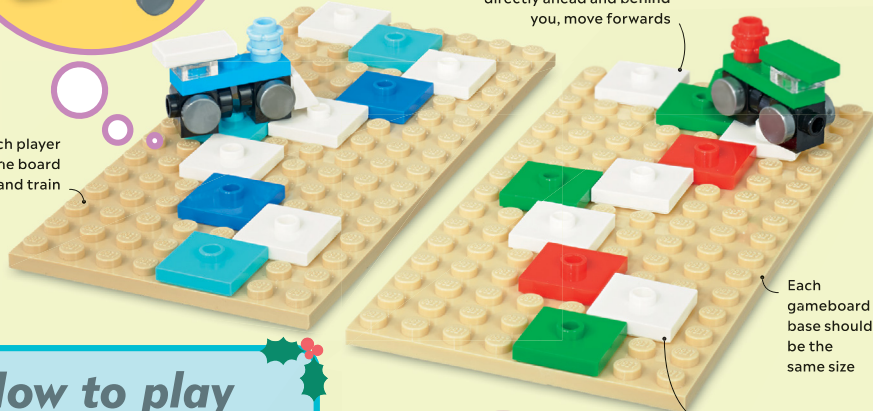
STOCKING DESIGN STUDIO



All aboard for festive fun! Who will be on track to make it home in time for the holidays? Build a train and a gameboard, and then challenge friends and family to race to the finish. Get rolling!

If the colour you choose is directly ahead and behind you, move forwards

Each player builds one board and train



Each gameboard base should be the same size

Make a path with 2x2 jumper plates or tiles

How to play

- 1 Fill a container with bricks in colours that match the jumper plates on the gameboards.
- 2 Players take it in turns to draw a brick and move to a space of the same colour. Trains must move to the nearest matching colour - even if it means moving backwards.
- 3 If a non-matching colour is drawn, lose a turn. The first to make it to the finish wins.

WHICH BRICK WILL I CHOOSE?



TRY THIS

If you don't have many large plates, players can share gameboards instead of having their own. Make sure each player builds their own mini train and then share the same route.

BUILD TIP

Add plates at the back of each stocking to connect the pieces. This will make your brick-built stockings more stable so that they don't fall apart when you decorate them.



Use plates to create a sturdy base

1x1 quarter circle tiles look like flower petals

Use 1x1 pieces to make pretty patterns

Gold pieces add a festive sheen

How to play

- 1 Use plates to build the bases of your stockings.
- 2 Decorate as many stockings as you can during the holidays. Ask friends and family to join in if you want.
- 3 Count up the number of stockings you made and try to beat your record next year.
