



SILHOUETTE WINDOWS

Swooping bats and petrified pumpkins silhouetted in your windows will startle any passer-by.

You can choose different coloured tissue paper for different areas.



Cut out parts of your Halloween picture.

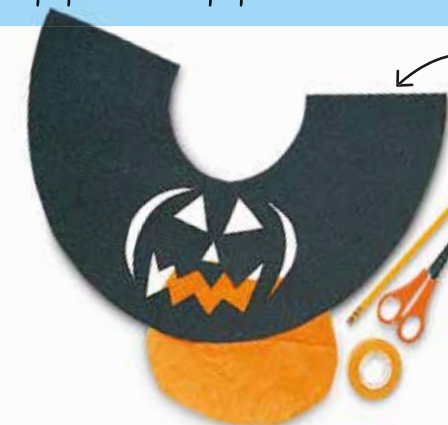


Draw your silhouette picture on paper. Black paper works well.

Ask an adult to help you cut out the picture with safety scissors.



Tape tissue paper to the back of the picture.



Overlap the two ends and tape them to make the lampshade shape.

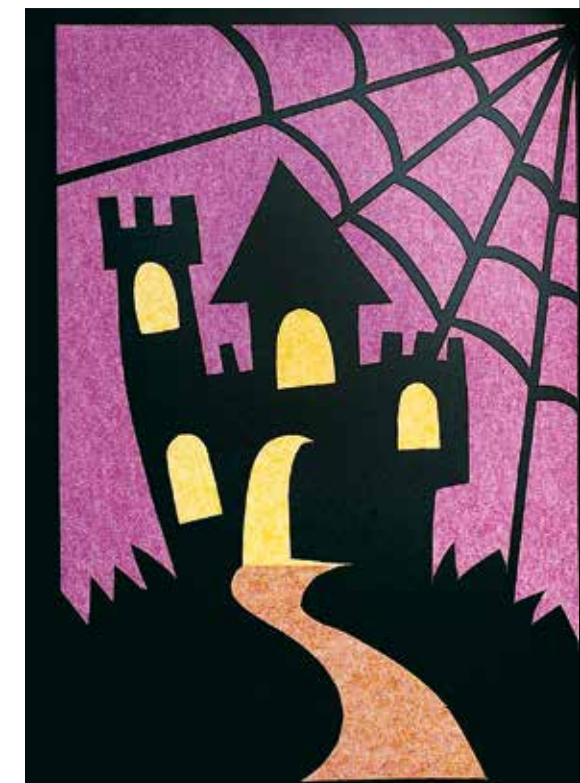
MAGIC LAMP

Why not spook up a lamp? Measure your lampshade, then use safety scissors to cut the lamp's shape out of black paper. Draw a Halloween picture on the paper and ask an adult to help you cut it out with safety scissors. Stick the paper onto your lamp, and turn the lamp on!



HAUNTED HOUSE

Use different tissue paper colours to create a colourful silhouette picture. A haunted house design is perfect for Halloween. You can make it look like the lights are on in the house. But is anyone at home?



PAPER PLATE FACES

Send chills down the spines of your neighbours when you go out trick-or-treating by wearing these masks made out of paper plates. Try a creepy cat, a petrified pumpkin, a wicked witch, or a sinister skull!



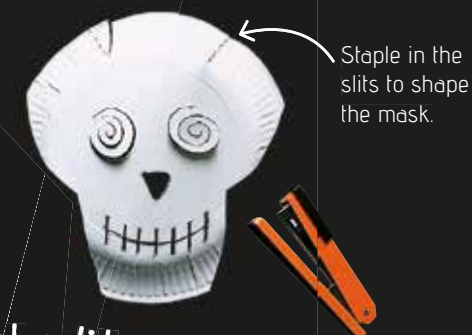
Ask an adult to help you cut through the plate, staple the slits, and attach the elastic.

Draw a face and cut it out with safety scissors.

Staple in the slits to shape the mask.

You can cut slits in the top, then staple, so the mask fits better.

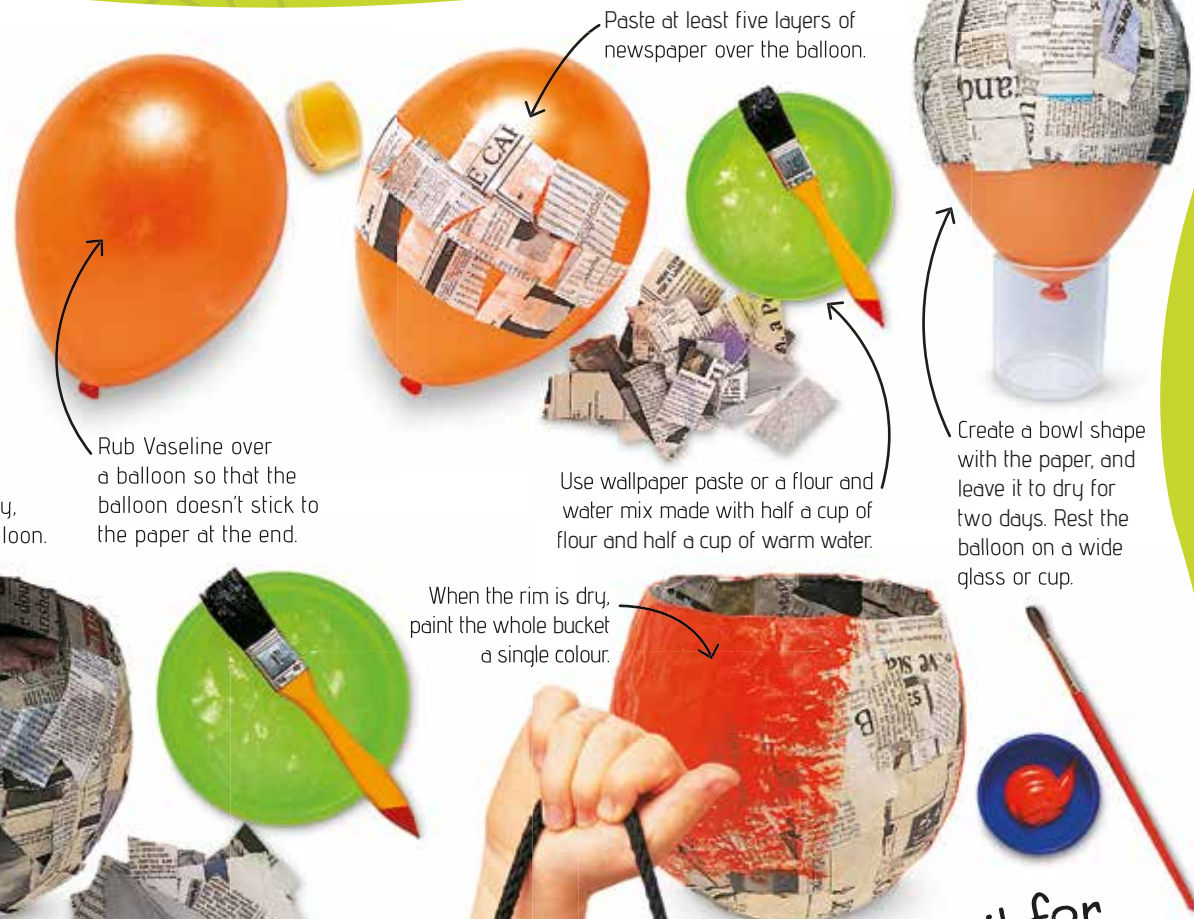
Attach some elastic.



HOW TO MAKE TREAT BUCKETS

PUMPKIN PAIL

Create this pumpkin treat bucket to take with you when you and your grown-up go out and about. Remember to start making it before Halloween to let it dry in time.



Paste at least five layers of newspaper over the balloon.

Rub Vaseline over a balloon so that the balloon doesn't stick to the paper at the end.

When the paper is dry, pop the balloon.

Use wallpaper paste or a flour and water mix made with half a cup of flour and half a cup of warm water.

Create a bowl shape with the paper, and leave it to dry for two days. Rest the balloon on a wide glass or cup.

When the rim is dry, paint the whole bucket a single colour.

Paste the rim of the bucket and stick on extra strips of newspaper folded over the rim.

When the base colour is dry, paint a face on the side of the bucket in a different colour.



Ask an adult to make a hole in each side of the bucket. Thread a length of rope through the holes to make a handle.

A perfect pail for your tasty treats!



LEAF OR STAR BUCKET

A quick way to make a Halloween treat bucket is to simply cover a plastic bucket with crepe paper. You could decorate the handle with pipe cleaner flowers, or use stickers for decoration.



Stand the bucket in the middle of the crepe paper. Fold the crepe paper over the rim of the bucket and secure it with tape.

Wrap a long strip of crepe paper round the handle, and secure each end with tape.

You'll need a good sized bucket with a handle, and a large sheet of crepe paper.

Use safety scissors to cut leaves or stars out of paper.

Tie the pipe cleaners to the bucket handle.

Tape the paper leaves or stars to pipe cleaners.

Wrap each pipe cleaner round a pencil to create a swirly stalk effect.

HALLOWEEN STICKERS

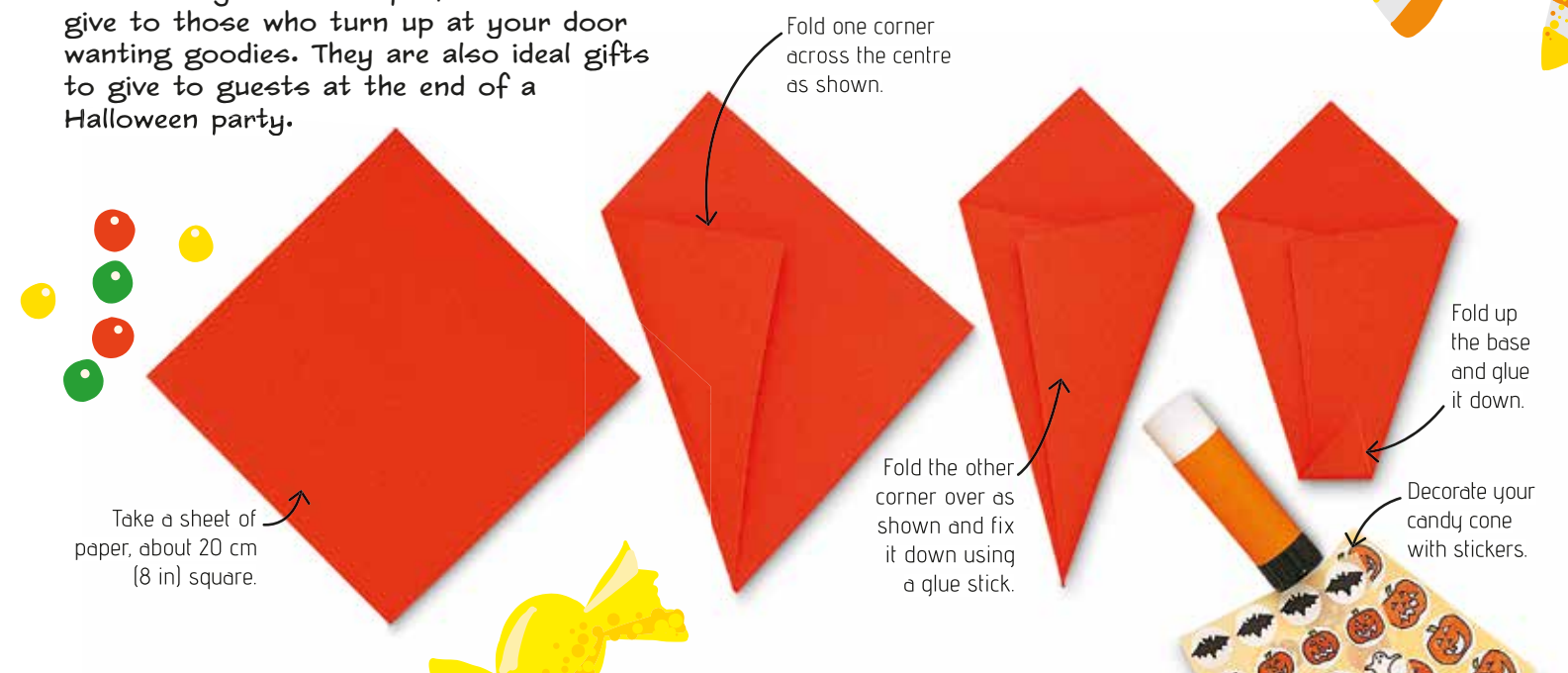


Draw Halloween pictures on blank sticky labels.

Colour the pictures and then stick the stickers to your treat bucket or candy cones.

CANDY CONES

These candy cones are perfect treats to give to those who turn up at your door wanting goodies. They are also ideal gifts to give to guests at the end of a Halloween party.



Fold one corner across the centre as shown.

Take a sheet of paper, about 20 cm (8 in) square.

Fold the other corner over as shown and fix it down using a glue stick.

Fold up the base and glue it down.

Decorate your candy cone with stickers.
