

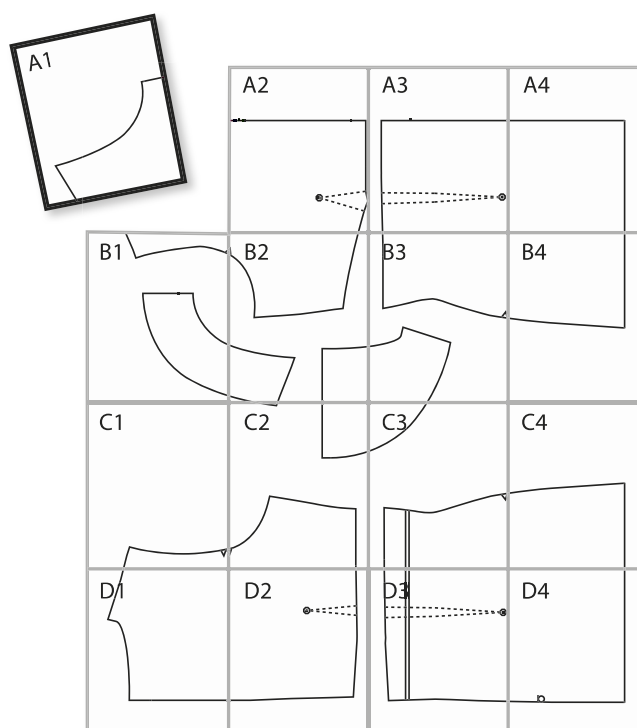
CRAFTER'S WRAP PATTERN

How to piece together and use your pattern

1 Download this PDF pattern to your computer, and print it out.
The pages will be labelled in the order that they fit together.

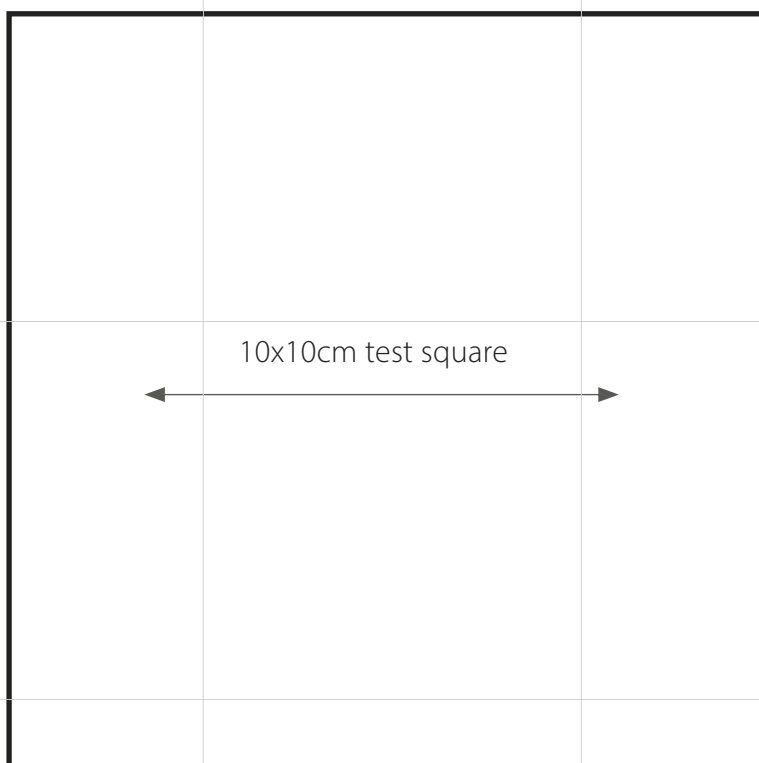
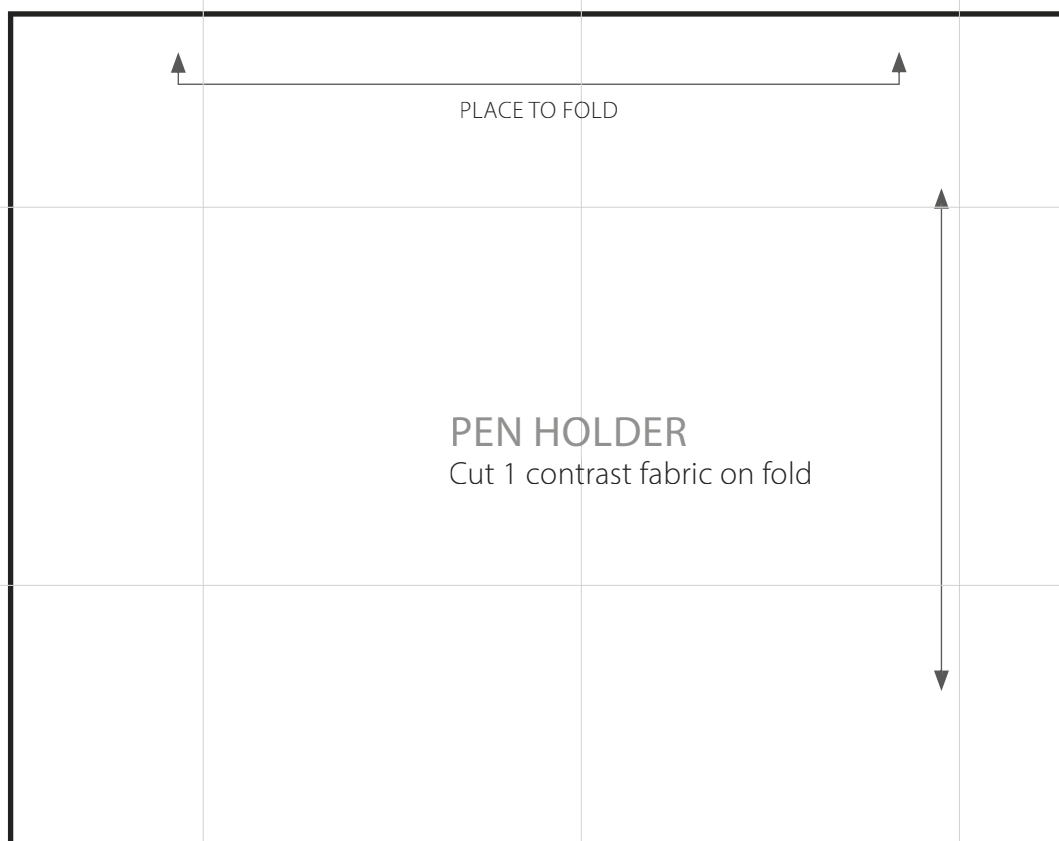
2 Trim the white margins from the printed pages, and tape the pages together, using the letters and gridlines as a guide (see example in the diagram below). Cut around the pattern.

3 The seam allowance is included in the pattern. One square in the grid equals 5cm²; you will also find a 10cm² test square on the pattern to make sure that the pattern has printed at the correct size.



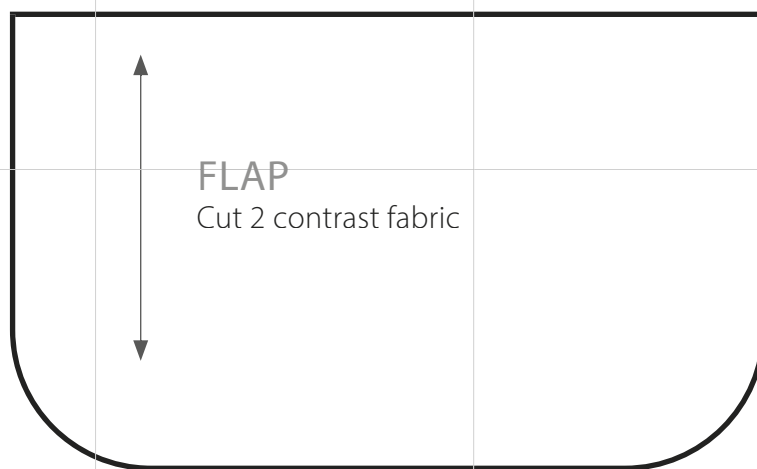
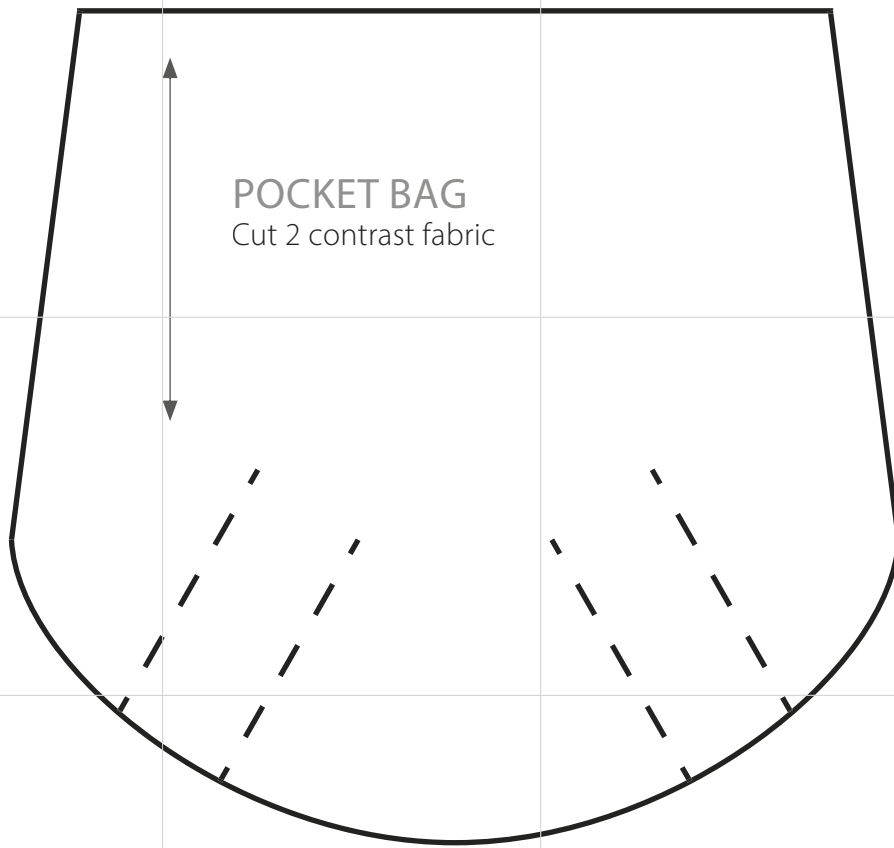

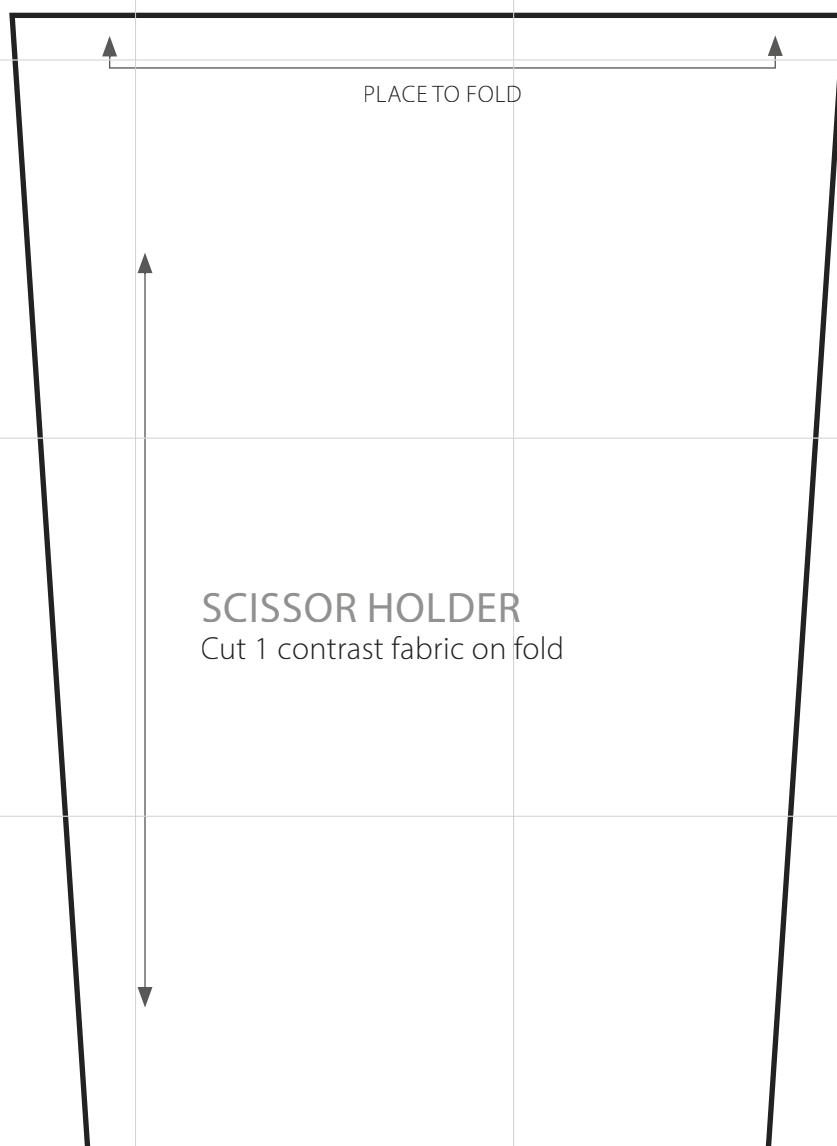

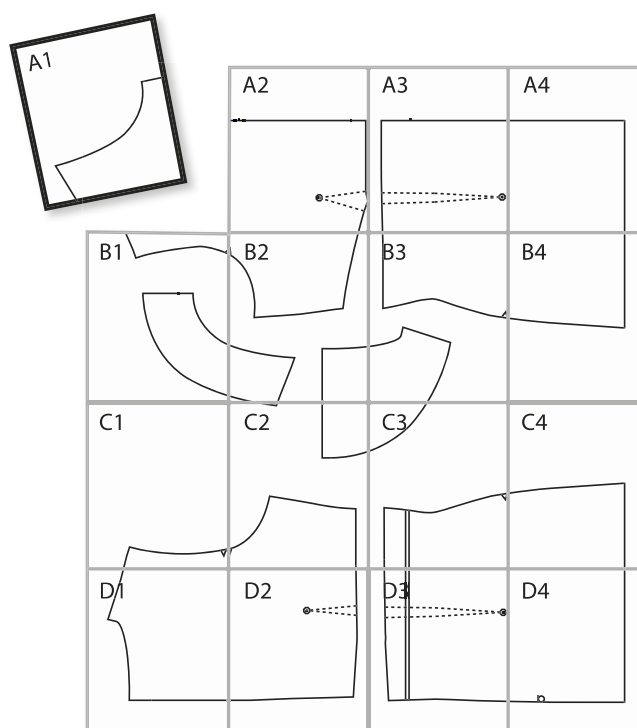
INNER AND OUTER SECTIONS
Cut 2 main fabric



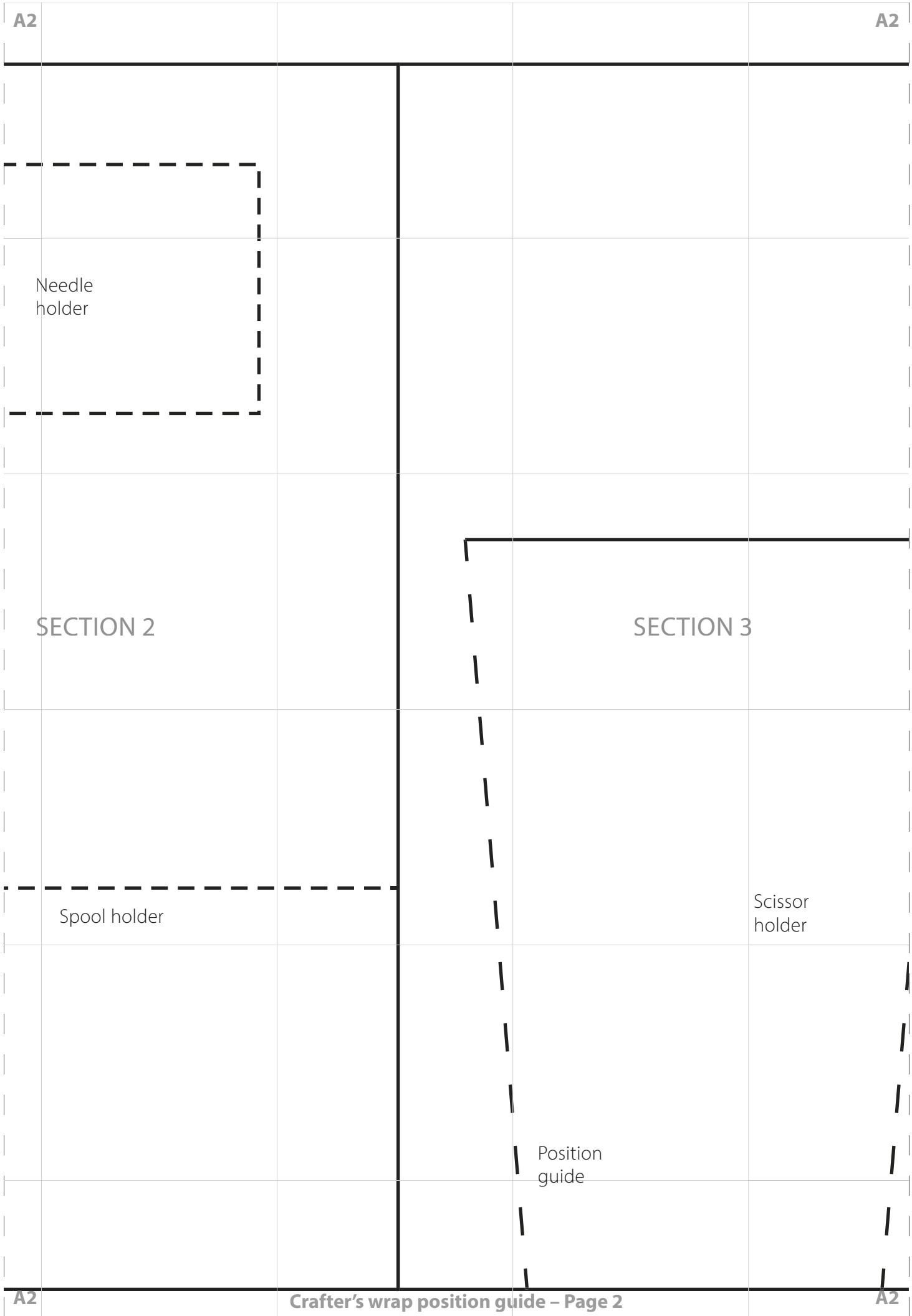
CRAFTER'S WRAP POSITION GUIDE

How to piece together and use your position guide

- 1 Download this PDF position guide to your computer, and print it out. The pages will be labelled in the order that they fit together.
- 2 Trim the white margins from the printed pages, and tape the pages together, using the letters and gridlines as a guide (see example in the diagram below).
- 3 Use the guide to help you position the pattern pieces on the inner and outer sections of the wrap.

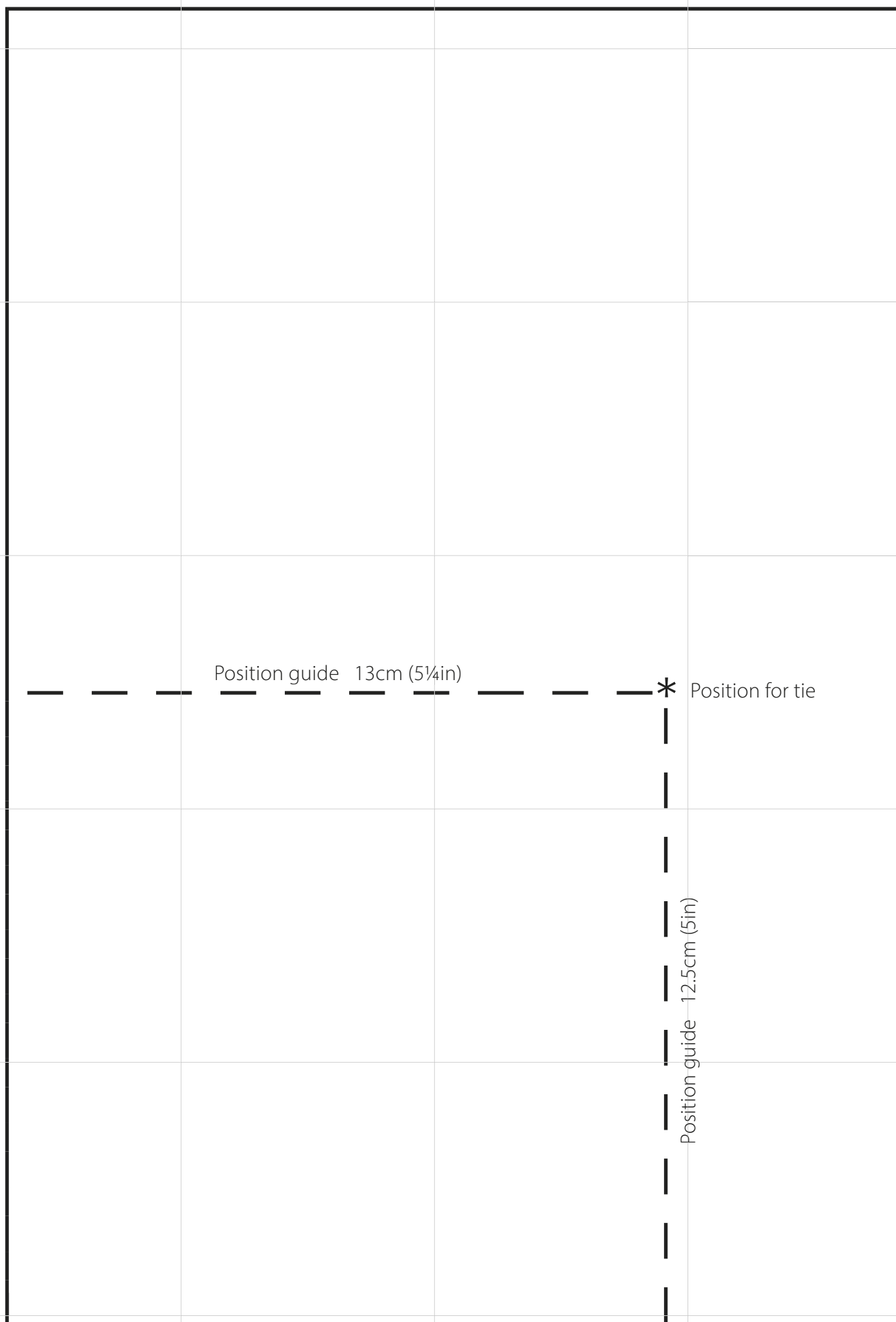
