Thank you to everyone who was involved in the two day inspection - children, staff, governors and parents. This team effort ensured that the inspector was able to see what makes Decoy Primary and First Steps Nursery such an incredible school community.

The inspection process always involves identifying areas for improvement and these are shown below: 1. Development of the wider curriculum (beyond the core areas of reading, writing and mathematics) building on prior learning, ensuring retention of learning over time, identifying gaps or misconceptions in learning and addressing these in a timely manner.

2. Development of subject leaders - particularly those who are new to the role

The two areas identified were already school improvement priorities and we are determined to continue to focus on these to further develop our curriculum.



Stopping Outside School to Drop Off Children

Please, please, please help us to avoid an accident at the front of school.

The zig-zags outside the school gates are there to keep everyone safe. No one should be parking on them, or stopping alongside them to drop off children.

At the beginning and end of the school day, we have hundreds of children, parents and carers arriving and leaving via the main gate. If you are dropping your child off without parking, please drive into the 'D' – this is a dropping-off zone and should not be used for parking. Small children may not be seen in mirrors, so no cars should be reversing out of this area.



Do not stop in the road outside the main gate – especially on the corner. There is a constant stream of children and parents trying to cross in this area. There have been several near misses – when pedestrians have stepped out at the same time as drivers have tried to move off.

Don't forget that we can issue you with a parking permit which enables you to park for free at Decoy park at drop off and pick up times. The safety of Decoy's children is worth the slight inconvenience of a short walk.
