COMMUNITY MOBILE CLINIC OUTREACH

Health Outreach – Dufaa Community, Tamale metropolis

On May 16, 2026, we conducted a Community Mobile Clinic outreach at Dufaa Community in the Tamale Metropolis in collaboration with our dedicated health volunteers.



The outreach provided free health screening, medical consultations, health education, and essential medications to 109 beneficiaries across different age groups.



Medical assessments identified some malaria cases and typhoid case, provided medications and referred some beneficiaries to health facilities for further care.



We also identified skin rashes, ring worms, cough and fevers, and offered advices and medications to the affected. This intervention reflects our continued commitment to improving access to quality healthcare, promoting preventive health practices, and supporting the wellbeing of underserved communities.

STUDENT INTERNSHIP: PARTNERSHIP WITH UDS SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

As part of our commitment to youth development and experiential learning, we welcomed two student interns from the UDS School of Business for their mandatory eight-week industrial attachment programme. The interns, Zeinab Abdul Karim (BSc Business Information Systems)



and Zeinab Abdul Mumin (BSc Human Resource Management),



joined our team to gain practical experience in the non-profit sector. During their onboarding, they were

introduced to our mission, programmes, operational processes, and community development approach. The interns will support educational outreach activities, administrative functions, and general organisational operations while acquiring valuable skills in project management, teamwork, and community service.

One Child, One NHIS Card Project – Nwogu & Jantong-Dakpiemyili Community Outreaches

In May 2026, we conducted One Child, One NHIS Card (1C1NHIS) outreach activities in Nwogu and Jantong-Dakpiemyili communities, providing NHIS registration and renewal services **to 120 and 251 beneficiaries respectively**, including children, adults, and the elderly.



These interventions increased the total number of beneficiaries reached under the project to **8,898 since inception**, reflecting our continued commitment to improving access to healthcare services for vulnerable populations through the National Health Insurance Scheme (NHIS).

We remain grateful to our supporters, partners, and stakeholders whose contributions continue to make this impactful initiative possible.

Patient Rescue Fund (PRF) – WheelChair Support for Aminu

Under the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we provided a wheelchair to support Aminu, a child living with seizures and cerebral palsy. His condition has significantly affected his mobility and daily functioning, leaving him unable to walk independently. The wheelchair was donated to enhance his mobility, improve his comfort, and support his family in providing the care he needs.



Through such interventions, we continue to restore hope and improve the quality of life of vulnerable individuals facing serious health challenges.

PATIENT RESCUE FUND (PRF) – ONGOING FUNDRAISER FOR TUMOUR TREATMENT

We continue to appeal for support for Mr. Mohammed, a patient diagnosed with a tumour growing between his eye and nose. The condition has

caused significant pain and has progressively affected the structure of his face. He has been scheduled for urgent radiotherapy treatment in Kumasi at a total cost of GHS 16,440. As of May 2026, a total of GHS 4,495 has been raised, leaving a balance of GHS 11,944 still required to facilitate his treatment.
