LOCAL FUNDRAISING TRAINING FOR NAF GRANTEES

Our Executive Director, **Nuhu Alimatu Sadia**, facilitated a Local Fundraising training session for grantee organizations under **The New Africa Fund (NAF)**.



Recognizing the participants' strong fundraising capacity, the session focused on advancing sustainable fundraising strategies, strengthening organizational systems, and establishing recurring donor mechanisms to enhance long-term financial sustainability.



During an interactive fundraising challenge, participating organizations collectively raised nearly **US\$2,000**, with one organization securing **US\$1,000**

within just **20 minutes**, demonstrating the practical impact of the training.

PARTICIPATION IN THE 2026 GHANA CIVIL SOCIETY FORUM

Hereafter Ghana participated in the 2026 Ghana Civil Society Forum (GCSF) held in Accra under the theme, "Reimagining Partnerships for Democratic Consolidation and Inclusive Development." The two-day forum brought together over 800 participants, including civil society organizations, government institutions, development partners, academia, the private sector, traditional and faith leaders, and youth groups to explore innovative approaches to partnerships, citizen engagement, and sustainable development.



The event also featured the participation of H.E. John Dramani Mahama, President of the Republic of Ghana, as Guest of Honour.



Our participation provided an opportunity to strengthen partnerships, exchange knowledge, and engage in strategic discussions on the future of civil society, local philanthropy, and inclusive national development.

CIVIC SPACE PROTECTION & REGULATORY COMPLIANCE TRAINING

Our Monitoring and Evaluation Officer, **Bashiru Aminu**, participated in the **Civic Space Resource Hub (CSR-HUB) Ghana Cohort IV** training organized by the **West Africa Civil Society Institute (WACSI)** in Tamale.



The three-day training strengthened participants' knowledge of **civic space protection, nonprofit governance, regulatory compliance, data protection, anti-money laundering requirements, and organizational accountability**

The knowledge gained will support Hereafter Ghana in strengthening governance systems, improving regulatory compliance, enhancing data protection and accountability practices, and integrating governance considerations into our monitoring, evaluation, accountability, and learning (MEAL) systems.

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT ON FREE PRIMARY HEALTHCARE

Representing Hereafter Ghana, our **One Child, One NHIS Card Project Officer**, Fadle Yussif Rahaman, and **Community Mobile Clinic Project Officer**,

Osman Saaratu Deishini, participated in a stakeholder engagement organized by the **NHIS Tamale Metro Office**.



The engagement focused on the Government of Ghana's **Free Primary Healthcare (FPHC)** initiative, which aims to improve access to essential primary healthcare services for all citizens, particularly vulnerable populations, without direct payment at the point of care.



The engagement brought together civil society organizations, NGOs, youth and women's groups, religious leaders, and local government representatives, providing a platform for collaboration in advancing equitable healthcare access.

PATIENT RESCUE FUND (PRF)

Improved Quality of Life for a Child with Cerebral Palsy

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we continued to support **Alhassan**, a two-year-old child diagnosed with cerebral palsy following recurrent seizures. To improve his mobility and support his rehabilitation, we donated a **wheelchair valued at GHS 2,000** and provided **GHS 1,500** to cover his physiotherapy, audiology consult, speech therapy, nutrition therapy, and ENT consult.



We are pleased to report that Alhassan's condition has improved significantly, reflecting the positive impact of timely medical care and sustained support.

Ongoing Treatment Support for Emelia Copson

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we provided treatment support to Emelia Copson, who was diagnosed with lymphangioma circumscriptum at the Cape Coast Hospital. Due to the severity of her condition, she required urgent medical intervention, including reconstructive plastic surgery. Through generous contributions from the general public, a total of GHS 10,000 was raised and disbursed to support her surgery, medications, and related treatment expenses.

Recovery Progress for Yussif Fuseini

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we provided urgent medical support to **Yussif Fuseini**, who was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at Tamale Teaching Hospital after being diagnosed with **Guillain-Barré Syndrome**. His condition required immediate intervention and specialized medications to manage severe complications. We disbursed **GHS 29,100** to support the procurement of essential medications and facilitate his treatment.



We are pleased to report that Yussif responded positively to treatment, showing significant clinical improvement that enabled his transfer from the ICU to the paediatric ward. He continues to receive follow-up care and monitoring as he progresses towards full recovery.

Successful Treatment for Baby Samira

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we supported the treatment of **Baby Samira**, a newborn diagnosed with an umbilical hernia with abdominal organ protrusion and a congenital heart defect. Due to the severity of the condition, urgent medical intervention, specialized wound care, and ongoing treatment were required. Through the generous support of donors, **GHS 40,000** was raised to facilitate the child's treatment.



We are delighted to report that Baby is being managed with regular wound dressing, and has been scheduled for a plastic surgery in December.

Restored Sight Through Cataract Surgery

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we supported **Zainab Gariba**, who was diagnosed with cataracts following a progressive loss of vision. To prevent further deterioration and restore her eyesight, urgent surgical intervention was required. With the support of generous donors, **GHS 3,800** was raised and disbursed to facilitate her cataract surgery and related medical care.



We are pleased to report that the surgery was successful, and Madam Zainab is recovering well with encouraging progress.

Life-Saving Surgical Support for Ayisha Mohammed

Through the Patient Rescue Fund (PRF), we provided critical medical support to **Ayisha Mohammed**, who was diagnosed with a life-threatening intestinal obstruction that required urgent surgical intervention. We donated a sum of **GHS 37,300** to support her immediate medical needs, facilitate her surgery.
