SCHOOLS OUTREACH PROJECT HELD AT PRISONS' SCHOOL COMPLEX, TAMALE

On 7th July 2026, under our EDUCATION track, we hosted an outreach dubbed 'Schools Outreach Project (SOP)' at the Prisons' School Complex, Tamale. The outreach reached 182 students; 77 females and 105 males, with interactive sessions on Substance Abuse Awareness and Digital Literacy (Safe Internet Practices). Through engaging presentations and discussions, students gained practical knowledge on making responsible life choices, staying safe online, and developing skills for the future.



The Schools Outreach Project marks a significant milestone in our commitment to complementing formal education by equipping young people with essential life skills, promoting healthy behaviours, and preparing them to become responsible digital citizens. We are encouraged by the active participation of the students and the positive feedback shared during the sessions.

STRENGTHENING PARTNERSHIPS WITH THE NANTON DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

On 13th July 2026, our team paid a working visit to the Nanton District Assembly (NDA) to strengthen collaboration and enhance coordination for community development initiatives within the district. During the visit, we met with the District Chief Executive, Hon. Rosina Zenabu Abdul Rahaman, to provide updates on the impactful projects we have implemented in the district and discuss upcoming interventions while reaffirming our commitment to partnering with the Assembly to improve the wellbeing of vulnerable communities.



The team also engaged the Department of Social Welfare and Community Development, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and the District Health Directorate to familiarize ourselves with their operations, gain insights into institutional processes, and explore opportunities for strategic collaboration in addressing the district's development priorities.

We extend our sincere appreciation to our volunteers and everyone who continues to donate clothing and financial support to this initiative.

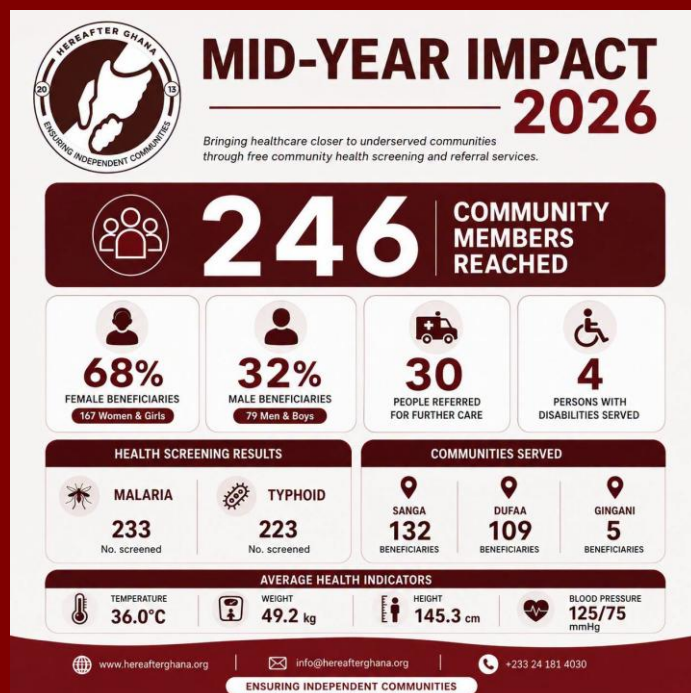

MID-YEAR IMPACT – COMMUNITY MOBILE CLINIC (CMC)

The Community Mobile Clinic (CMC) brings free basic healthcare services closer to underserved communities where access to health facilities remains limited. During the first half of **2026**, our **Community Mobile Clinic (CMC)** delivered free healthcare services to **246 beneficiaries** across **Sanga, Dufaa, and Gingani** in the Sagnarigu Municipal, Tamale Metropolis, and Kumbungu District. A total of **233 people** were screened for malaria, **223** for typhoid, **30 beneficiaries** were referred for further medical care, and **4 persons with disabilities** received healthcare services.



We are grateful to our volunteers, donors, partners, and supporters whose generosity continues to make these life-changing interventions possible.

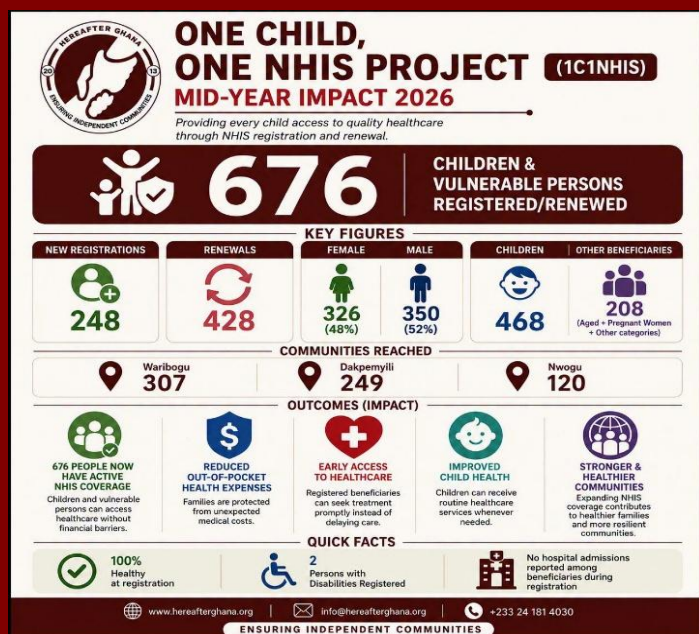

MID-YEAR IMPACT – ONE CHILD, ONE NHIS CARD PROJECT (1C1NHIS)

Our Free NHIS Programme supports children and vulnerable individuals with free National Health Insurance registration and renewal, helping remove financial barriers to essential healthcare and promoting equitable access for all. During the first half of 2026, our **One Child, One NHIS Card Project (1C1NHIS)** supported **676 children and vulnerable individuals** with free NHIS registration and renewal, improving their access to essential healthcare services.

By reducing out-of-pocket healthcare costs, the project has enabled children, older persons, pregnant women, and other vulnerable groups to access timely medical care when they need it most.

COMMUNITY MOBILE CLINIC OUTREACH – WOVOGUMA COMMUNITY

To kick-off the 2nd half of the year, we conducted a **Community Mobile Clinic (CMC)** on **25th July 2026**, outreach in **Wovoguma**, an underserved community in the Sagnerigu Municipality with neither a health centre nor a CHPS compound. The outreach brought free basic healthcare services closer to the community, benefiting **151 people; 109 females and 42 males**.



Beneficiaries received malaria screening, random blood sugar (RBS) testing for older adults, medical consultations by volunteer doctors, and essential medications at no cost. This intervention reflects our commitment to ensuring that vulnerable communities have equitable access to quality healthcare, regardless of their location.

PATIENT RESCUE FUND (PRF) – TREATMENT SUPPORT FOR SULEMANA IDDRISU

Through the **Patient Rescue Fund (PRF)**, we provided medical support to **Sulemana Iddrisu**, who was admitted to the **Tamale Teaching Hospital** after being diagnosed with severe internal infections and rickets.



To enable him to receive urgent treatment and prevent further complications, we donated **GHS 3,000** to support his medical care. The intervention allowed the medical team to commence the required treatment, giving Iddrisu a renewed opportunity for recovery.

PATIENT RESCUE FUND (PRF) – FUNDED SURGERY FOR ABDUL MUHAIMIN ABDULAI

Through the **Patient Rescue Fund (PRF)**, we began supporting **Abdul Muhaimin Abdulai**, a child diagnosed with **Stage IV Wilms Tumour**, an advanced form of kidney cancer. The condition has caused significant weight loss and abdominal swelling, requiring urgent medical intervention.



We have successfully coordinated the fundraising of **GHS 70,000** to fund his surgery and treatment. The surgery is successful at Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital and Muhaimin is currently under recovery and monitoring.
