


## **Methodological Note**

# **CONTEXT LAYER ON CHILD ATLAS**

A new function allows users on the Child Atlas to add a context layer to the global/regional map on the Atlas page. This adds some key contextual information to provide a quick overview of humanitarian, environmental, and/or economic challenges the country is facing.



This document lays out the contextual indicators currently included and how the affected countries were selected. However, such a contextual layer can only provide a shortcut and hides important differences and nuances between countries. Please choose any specific crisis or insecurity indicator as second layer to explore such relationships more in detail.

#### **△** Conflict-affected

These are countries affected by violent conflict, as identified by the <u>World Bank classification</u> for Fragile and Conflict-Affected Situations for the current financial year. Countries are <u>identified by the combination of multiple indicators</u> drawn from both the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (ACLED) and the Uppsala Conflict Data Project (UCDP).

### **Hunger-affected**

Countries are highlighted as hunger-affected if they experience very high levels of insufficient food consumption (>40% of population as reported in the <a href="HungerMap by the World Food">HungerMap by the World Food</a>
<a href="Programme">Programme</a>) or if more than 40% of population are living in phase 3 or higher of the <a href="Integrated">Integrated</a>
<a href="Food Security Phase Classification">Food Security Phase Classification</a>.

## Extremely high climate risk

Countries are categorised as experiencing extremely high climate risk based on their exposure to climate and environmental hazards, shocks and stresses as reported by <a href="UNICEF's Children's Climate Risk Index">UNICEF's Children's Climate Risk Index</a> (CCRI).

### Debt distress

The World Bank and IMF are regularly assessing <u>debt sustainability for low-income countries</u>. Countries highlighted in the context map are those considered to be in debt distress.
