Dr. Alexandra de Hoop Scheffer is the President and CEO of the German Marshall Fund of the United States (GMF) and a leading authority on geopolitics, transatlantic affairs, and corporate diplomacy. With over twenty years of cross-sector leadership in government, academia, and international organizations - including the French Foreign Ministry, Ministry of Defense, NATO, the United Nations and Sciences Po Paris - she advises governments, businesses, and international institutions on geopolitical risk and strategic decision-making.
