

Robert M. Danin

Robert M. Danin is a principal at Georgetown Global Strategies, a geopolitical risk assessment and advisory firm established in 2015. He is also a senior advisor at the London-based international mediation group Inter-Mediate and Middle East counselor to the Australian-based Dragoman Pty Ltd.

Danin served over 20 years working on the Middle East at the State Department and White House, from the Reagan through the Obama administrations. He subsequently spent ten years as a senior fellow for the Middle East at the Council on Foreign Relations from 2010-2020, and as a non-resident senior fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School's Belfer Center from 2015-2020, where he taught graduate-level seminars on the Middle East. He also served as a thought leader for the World Economic Forum 2012-2014.

Dr. Danin headed the East Jerusalem mission of the Quartet Envoy, former Prime Minister Tony Blair, from 2008-2010, and continued to serve as a principal negotiator and advisor to PM Blair on Israeli-Palestinian and regional issues from 2012-2017. Dr. Danin previously served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs from 2005-2008, responsible for Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, and Israeli-Palestinian issues. Before that, he served for two years at the White House/National Security Council as Director for Israeli-Palestinian and Levant affairs and as acting Senior Director for Near East and North African affairs. He also was the Middle East and Gulf specialist on Secretary of State Powell's Policy Planning Staff and spent a decade as a Middle East political and military analyst in the Bureau of Intelligence and Research.

Danin has published widely, including in *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, the *Financial Times*, *Washington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, and *The Atlantic*, and he has been a frequent guest on a wide range of television and broadcast media, including the *PBS Newshour*, CNN, BBC, MSNBC, NPR, as well as international television and radio. He is a contributing author of *Pathways to Peace: America and the Arab-Israeli Conflict* (Palgrave Macmillan 2012) and *Iran: The Nuclear Challenge* (CFR, 2012).

Rob holds a doctorate in the international relations of the Middle East from St. Antony's College, Oxford University; an MSFS degree from Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service, and a BA in history from the University of California, Berkeley.
