Javier Vega is a national correspondent with Noticias Telemundo based in Washington DC, covering breaking news and reporting from the White House, the Supreme Court and Capitol Hill.

An Emmy-award winning journalist with 20 years of experience, Vega has covered a broad range of national news while reporting from Washington.

Throughout his career, Vega has also secured headline-making interviews with dozens of Latin American and U.S. officials including the former president of Mexico, Andrés Manuel López Obrador, and the president of Colombia, Gustavo Petro.

Vega began his career as a reporter at Televisa Puebla. Later, he became an investigative reporter at Televisa’s headquarters in Mexico City, where he produced stories about politics, crime and social issues. Previously he worked at Milenio Televisión, the leading news channel in Mexico, where he also anchored primetime newscasts.

In 2009, Vega won the National Journalism Prize awarded by the “Club de Periodistas de México A.C.” He was also part of the team awarded the National Communication Prize “José Pagés Llergo” for its coverage of the 2017 earthquake in Mexico City.
