

## **Amy A. McAuliffe**

Amy McAuliffe, a former senior CIA executive, is a recognized expert on adversary science, technology, and weapons issues, as well as the craft of strategic analysis and forecasting. For almost twenty years, she led Intelligence Community (IC) programs to analyze and combat adversary weapons of mass destruction and advanced conventional weapons, to track emerging technologies with weapons and national security implications, and to fight terrorism.

Recently retired from federal service, Amy is a Distinguished Professor of the Practice at the University of Notre Dame's Keough School of Global Affairs. She also is a principal at her own national security consulting firm and a public speaker.

In her government career, Amy served as Chair of the National Intelligence Council--the IC's strategic think tank--Director of the President's Daily Brief (PDB), and Director of CIA's Middle East analytic unit. Other senior assignments at CIA include serving as the Assistant Director of CIA for Weapons and Counterproliferation, Deputy Assistant Director for Counterterrorism, and Director of the Office of Middle East and North African Analysis.

Ms. McAuliffe graduated from the University of Notre Dame cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts in Government. She has a Master of Arts in International Affairs from American University and a Master of Arts in Military Studies from the Marine Corps Command and Staff College, where she was a distinguished graduate.
