Sarah Bauerle Danzman, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor of International Studies at Indiana University Bloomington and faculty director of the Tobias Center for Innovation in International Development. She is a senior fellow at the Atlantic Council and a Council on Foreign Relations life member. In 2019-2020, she held a CFR International Affairs Fellowship, working in the State Department as a CFIUS Policy Advisor. She continues to advise U.S. ally and partner governments on investment screening design and implementation.

Dr. Bauerle Danzman's scholarship explores how domestic and multinational firms influence and adapt to investment regulation, the nexus of national security and investment, and how rules governing capital shape global networks of ownership, production, and economic growth. She is the author of [*Merging Interests: When Domestic Firms Shape FDI Policy*](#) and many articles published in scholarly and policy outlets including *Foreign Affairs*, *International Studies Quarterly*, *European Journal of International Relations*, *Journal of Common Market Studies*, *Review of International Political Economy*, and *Business and Politics*. She is also Editor-in-Chief of *Law & Geoeconomics*.
