Dr. Jocelyn Kelly is a global health expert who has led diverse, multi-national teams to address some of the world's most pressing problems, bringing evidence-based practice to promoting equity and inclusion in complex systems. She currently serves as a Consulting Senior Fellow (non-resident) with the United Nations University, where she is working on a project centered on self-care as a pathway to equitable health and development.

Dr. Kelly most recently served as an International Affairs Fellow with the Council on Foreign Relations, seconded to the U.S. Department of State and the United Nations Development Programme, where she worked to advance human rights and responsible-sourcing policy in global supply chains. Dr. Kelly has briefed the United Nations Security Council, the U.S. Department of State, and the World Bank on promoting equity in complex crises. She holds a PhD in Public Health from Johns Hopkins University and an MS in Population and International Health from Harvard.
