Posted Workers Directive – What is it?

When posting European employees to EU and EFTA countries, it is likely that they must be registered with the host country's labor authorities before the start of the posting period. Therefore, an indepth check of every individual case has to take place. Noncompliance can lead to high fines and sanctions, e.g. blacklisting.

In an attempt to stop social security fraud, cross-border service activities within the European market have to be reported.

Rights of employees

The guidelines (EU Directive 96/ 71/EC on posting of workers and the enforcement directives of 2015 and 2018) define national law and agreements as basis for the protection of employees regarding:

- minimum wage,
- maximal working time,
- vacation,
- health, safety regulations,
- protective measures for pregnant women or women with young children,
- equal treatment for men and women,
- other local public policy provisions.
