PORSCHE CUP 2026

A competition for Porsche race drivers

Season 2026

REGULATIONS

The Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche Aktiengesellschaft (Porsche) hereby invites to the "Porsche Cup 2026" competition for Porsche drivers entering certain events, directly or indirectly sanctioned by the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) (refer to section 2.).

The following conditions apply.

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1. Entrants

- 1.1** Entry is open to all German or foreign competition drivers who achieved their results in a car manufactured or acknowledged by Porsche.
- 1.2** Porsche works drivers, participants of the Porsche Motorsport programme "Porsche Driver", participants of the programme "Porsche Motorsport Asia Pacific Selected Driver", participants of the programme "Porsche Motorsport North America Selected Driver" as well as participants of the "Porsche Motorsport Junior Programme" are not entitled to compete. **The foregoing exclusion of participation shall not apply where a driver's participation in any of the racing series set out in Section 2 is neither based on a contractual obligation towards Porsche nor linked to the driver's inclusion in an official Porsche Motorsport development programme.**

- 1.4** Results achieved with cars which are equipped with engines not manufactured by Porsche will not be scored.
- 1.5** Every driver has the right to object to take part in the competition. The objection has to be made in writing (contacts: see section 8.)
- 1.6** Due to the strong public impact of the racing series and racing events mentioned in section 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3 below and the corresponding exposed position of the participating drivers of the Porsche Cup in public, Porsche expects the participating drivers to adhere to basic ethical values, in particular diversity, tolerance and respect. The drivers are therefore obliged, not to take any actions, make any statements or disseminate any content that violate the law, may violate human dignity or are otherwise likely to impair the aforementioned basic ethical values and/or negatively affect the reputation and standing of Porsche. This includes in particular insulting, discriminatory, inhuman, sexist, pornographic, violence glorifying, xenophobic, anti-constitutional, racist, politically radical or other criminal or immoral actions, statements or dissemination of content.

2. Events

The Sporting Calendars of the individually responsible, official motorsport authority and its official supplements are sole authority for consideration of the competitions listed below. For a national championship the approval of a national automobile club (ASN) recognized by the FIA will be sufficient.

Only those events held between **November 10, 2025** and **November 08, 2026** (and for which a final list of results is available **by latest November 11, 2026**) will be considered. Points are awarded according to the established criteria, regardless of changes to the name of the series or the individual race.

The competition concerns the following races, weighted in their importance by coefficients and which are used for each event as:

2.4 Championship Bonus

To receive a championship bonus, it is a prerequisite that a division listed in section 2.1 has been won and that the relevant series promoter has issued a final and concluding scoring table of the entire season and that at least a minimum number of three races have taken place. Regardless of that, the Intercontinental GT Challenge is also eligible for bonuses. In this final scoring at least five competitors must have been scored. All races in the racing series must be contested in a vehicle manufactured by Porsche in order to receive the championship bonus.

Coefficient 20

The championship bonus is calculated by multiplying the coefficient (20) and the points for first place (20 points) according to section 3.3. The championship bonus can only be awarded once per participant within the evaluation period listed in chapter 2.1.

3. Scoring

3.1 Special entry forms are not required for the “Porsche Cup 2026” competition. The results of the individual events are proactively tracked by Porsche and incorporated into the scoring accordingly. Inconsistencies should be reported to Porsche in writing by the driver within 5 working days after publication of the scoring, but no later than **November 20, 2026 when the final scoring is determined** (see Chapter 8).

3.2 All results must be proved by an official list of results or confirmation of an ASN by the stated deadlines (refer to section 2. Events) at the latest. Otherwise, points will not be scored.

3.3 Scoring presumes that the minimum number of competitors fixed by the individually responsible, official motorsport authority start within the particular group. Scoring will be effected as follows:

1 st Place	20 Points	6 th Place	6 Points
2 nd Place	15 Points	7 th Place	4 Points
3 rd Place	12 Points	8 th Place	3 Points

5 th Place	8 Points	10 th Place	1 Point

All places refer to the relevant classifications (refer to section 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3). Points received will be multiplied with the respective coefficients. The current points standings of the Porsche Cup will be published on [Porsche Cup | Porsche Motorsport Hub](#) and will frequently be updated.

3.4 Only the cars and drivers listed in the official results list of the respective series organizer will be scored.

3.5 All results which come within the scope of this competition will be scored without the dropping of any points. In the event of an ex-aequo result in any single event, all drivers who thus tie will receive full points for the respective position. Points from various events within this scoring system cannot be added for one and the same event – the best final position will be scored.

4. Prize Funds

4.1 The "Porsche Cup 2026" is awarded as follows:

4.2 Winner of the "Porsche Cup 2026" is the driver with the highest point total; the further positions are determined by the respective points in descending order. The name of the winner of the Porsche Cup will be published on [Porsche Cup | Porsche Motorsport Hub](#).

4.3 In ex-aequo cases (ties) the drivers involved will be placed ex-aequo in the relevant placing. The one or more following places will be discarded. Prize funds from these places will be added and divided equally among the ex-aequo drivers. Only exception is the scoring for first place in the "Porsche Cup", for which in ex-aequo cases the higher number of victories in events with the highest coefficients, then the higher number of second places, third places and so forth will be taken into account. If a tie still exists, the higher number of fastest qualifying laps will be considered, then the higher number of fastest race laps and finally by drawing lots.

4.4 The trophy of the "Porsche Cup" is a perpetual trophy which will be displayed at Porsche after the award ceremony. The "Porsche Cup" winner will receive a reproduction of the trophy in reduced size.

4.5 The prizes are to be received by the drivers and will be awarded personally. Transfer to a third party is accepted only if Porsche Motorsport has been notified in written form of this intended transfer **by December 04, 2026** at the latest.

5. Exclusions

Porsche reserves the right to exclude drivers from "Porsche Cup 2026" who violate the obligations of section 1.5 above during the 2026 season.

Porsche further reserves the right to exclude from "Porsche Cup 2026" standings any driver who has his license withdrawn by the FIA or ASN for an offense against the sporting code during the 2026 season. Porsche also reserves the right to exclude any driver from the "Porsche Cup 2026" standings who have violated the provisions of the FIA Code of Ethics and Conduct or the DMSB Code of Ethics during the 2026 season.

6. Legal Provisions

The regulations of the competition "Porsche Cup 2026" as well as the participation to this competition are governed by German law. Porsche reserves the right to alter or recall these regulations at any time. No legal claims against any offered prizes will be entertained. All decisions of Porsche concerning the "Porsche Cup 2026" are final; appeals to the courts or sporting authorities are excluded. In case of doubt, the German text of these regulations will be considered binding.

7. Tax Information

7.1 Value Added Tax (VAT)

The placement-dependent prize money does not constitute an exchange of services from a German sales tax perspective. The prize money is therefore generally paid out net. The prize money winners are free to make a different VAT assessment. If the legal situation or facts change, the sales tax assessment may differ.

7.2 Withholding Tax

Since 1986, Porsche is obliged to retain and deliver to the Tax Office the German Income Tax of prize funds paid to foreign professional drivers according to the following graduation:

- a) up to € 250.- no tax deduction
- b) more than € 250.- 15.825 % tax deduction

Porsche is obliged to withheld taxes on the remuneration of paid price funds for assignment of rights (personal rights and other image rights) and for races in Germany. Therefore, the remuneration will be split as follows: 20% royalties, 80% activity through races.

If, in the case of a driver from Germany, it is not clear whether his primary residence is located in this country, Porsche can only renounce on taxation if a location certificate issued by his tax office has been presented.

If in further countries Porsche has also to withhold income taxes on payments of prize money scored in this country, Porsche shall be allowed to deduct the respective amounts from any payments to be made. Porsche will issue a certificate in respect of the tax paid.
